PRACTICING STEWARDSHIP

"Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance," writes the prophet (Isaiah 60:3). A king may keep to the shadows, suspicious of the light—he may foolishly imagine he can snatch it, and, upon finding the light cannot be governed, grow to loathe it, and even seek to extinguish it. But all his grand designs will come to nothing because there is no king so powerful that he can see in the dark. And even a man like Herod—a man so jealous that he sought to kill God-cannot prevent the breaking of day. The Epiphany marks the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. It is a celebration of truth reaching places it was not expected to reach, of brightness illuminating corners of the world long ago consigned to shadow. It is a reminder that the battle has already been won, the night is over. All that remains is for us to decide: will we step into the light?-Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman




In addition to the Sunday collection, we have some special envelopes for January 2024





