PRACTICING STEWARDSHIP

Because they can no longer see you, when you're playing peekaboo with a baby, they believe you no longer exist.

Their little brains are unable to understand that just because a thing cannot be seen, it is still there, still alive, still full of love and care and protection. They have not yet developed object permanence. On Easter morning, Mary Magdalene sees the burial cloth but no body. Her human mind makes sense of the situation by assuming the Lord has been taken. I'm sure I would have thought the same thing. It doesn't matter that Jesus had told his disciples again and again that he will be raised from the dead. They weren't ready to understand it. In many ways, Easter is when the human race really achieved object permanence. But we still struggle with it, don't we? I certainly do. So often I can be heard accusing God: "You weren't there. Where were you? I couldn't find you." But I looked for him in the flesh. I looked for him in the stale yeast of the world—in money or success or affirmation or (worst of all) convenience and pleasure. 


