



PRACTICING STEWARDSHIP

When Peter advises our Lord to avoid danger, Jesus responds, "Get behind me, Satan!" In defense of Peter I'm sure I would have said the same thing to my dear friend when faced with a deadly situation. Peter is, in today's Gospel, unwilling to embrace the cross—he's afraid of it, even-but aren't we all, in the end, afraid of our cross? I admitted before, I am. It's no sin, it's only human. Fear is natural. Self-preservation is a reflex. Christ speaks of a choice, one we are all faced with, again and again, just as Peter is. We will not always respond perfectly; Peter does not respond well today. He does not respond well on Holy Thursday. But on his last day, on the day of the ultimate choice? On that day, he chooses the cross. We marvel at first responders who put themselves in harm's way for the sake of others, because to do so is not human, it is divine. A firefighter whose loved one throws themselves in his way would still charge toward the flames, crying out, "Get behind me." Christ runs into the burning building for us, shaking off not only his own fear (and he had it, after all he was human, too) but the fear of everyone who loved him.
