



PRACTICING STEWARDSHIP

Over the years, I've encountered my fair share of bosses who don't like being fair. There was the retail gig that paid me less than minimum wage because I was a minor and scheduled me for long shifts because it meant cheaper labor. There was the restaurant manager who tried to convince me to leave school early so I could waitress on a busy shift (totally illegal). There was the internship with the editor with no sense of work/life balance. Our resumes are full of these experiences—it's capitalism, after all. It conditions us to look out for ourselves, because no one else will. And it breeds an attitude of suspicion that often blooms into jealousy when we encounter God's mercy. Most of us work hard for what we have and so we make the mistake of thinking we deserve the good things that come our way. That's good when we're talking about a just wage. 


