



# History of the Holy Pogary

The practice of reciting 150 Hail Marys (which was later subdivided into 15 decades of 10) arose during the late Middle Ages. Devotion to the rosary ("garland of roses") began to flourish in the 19th century. Pope St. John Paul II added five new mysteries during his tenure. "The rosary, though clearly Marian, is at heart a Christocentric prayer. It has all the depth of the Gospel message. It is an echo of Mary's prayer, her perennial Magnificat. With the rosary, we sit at the school of Mary and are led to contemplate the beauty of the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love." ©LPi


