

PRACTICING STEWARDSHIP

The character of Rose of Sharon in John Steinbeck's "Grapes of Wrath" is pregnant. As her impoverished family migrates to California, her all-consuming preoccupation is her unborn child. We are baptized, and so it is inside of us, this voice that cries out in the desert. When we hear it, we cannot help but listen. 


