


The Feast of The Holy Family

We will once again offer Home Blessing Kits on the feast of the Epiphany for parishioners to bless their homes, remembering the hospitality that the Holy Family showed the Magi and asking for protection and blessing on their home and upon all who enter it. The kits will contain chalk, tiny container of Holy Water, and small amounts of incense from church. The home blessing is done by writing on your door frame: 20+C+M+B+24. The 20 & 24 represent the year. The + signifies the cross and the C, M, B stand for the traditional names of the

Wise Men: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar. (The letters also denote the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat," meaning Christ bless this house). A prayer and directions with be included as well. Look for these kits next weekend.

PRACTICING STEWARDSHIP

In the first weeks of parenthood, the tears flowed fast and freely. Sometimes I wept because the days were so long. Sometimes because they were so short, taking away inaugural moments of my daughter's life-moments I knew I would long for someday. So, the inclusion of the Presentation of Jesus in the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary has always struck me. Mary, just weeks after giving birth, standing at the temple: Is she tired? Is she emotional? She just stands there, offering her baby to the Lord, and is told, "A sword shall pierce your heart." Joyful? I don't think so! But Mary knows that Simeon speaks truth, and she cannot receive God's will with anything less than joy, even if it means sadness one day. Family means love, but love means—what, exactly? Pleasure, fulfillment, contentment? Yes, but more, too. It means you have much to lose. How full is family life with these beautiful moments which, on the surface, look and feel painful—but hold within them the opportunity to be like Mary, to bow our heads and once again say "Yes, Lord."-Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman
