

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

Have you ever had a job for which you didn't feel qualified? Or maybe a task you were simply dreading because of its scope. Maybe it's at home with that necessary basement cleanout or the weekly organization of family schedules or at the church with ministering at Mass or teaching the children about the faith. When we don't feel qualified, we don't want to do the work. We get stuck in our own fear. That's the birthplace of procrastination, self-doubt and bitterness. When we look inward at our own abilities, we can only see all the traits that aren't there. The intelligence, the dexterity, the ambition whatever it is we lack, we get stuck on it. I've got good news and bad news. I'll start with the bad news: none of us are qualified for the call of discipleship. We simply aren't. Father's Day Collection for Infirm & Retired Priests

Many of you know that Father Jim Lennon was called home on May 8 after a long and fruitful life. Father Lennon was so beloved that Joliet city officials in 2006 named the portion of Willow Avenue next to St. Patrick's Church-his final assignment before retirement in 2006-"Father Jim Lennon Way." Father Lennon also happened to write a popular article in June 2019 (Christ is Our Hope) highlighting the annual Father's Day Collection for Infirm and Retired Priests. How Can We Thank You? By Father Jim Lennon



At the time of my ordination on June 7, 1958, little did I realize the on ministry assignments almost love, support, care and friendship of so many Catholic parishioners in the parishes I have served throughout the Diocese of Joliet.

Now after 61 years of priesthood, I still love my ministry, and I thank God that I am able to serve in the

Joliet area. When I visit our young priests, I tell them how blessed they should be to touch the hearts and souls of so many of God's people.


I continue to be convinced of the prayers of so many people for their priests, present and former parishioners, religious men and women, retired and infirm priests, parish shut-ins and (the list could go on), sustaining both active and those of us in the senior-priest category (far from retired).

Hopefully, all our priests remain committed to caring for the elderly and infirm, for one day we will likely be in the same position.

As a priest ages, like all of us, we too often need care and special attention. We have retired and senior priests living at St. John Vianney Villa in Naperville and Our Lady of Angels Retirement Home in Joliet. There are also senior priests living on their own. I might add that our St. John Vianney Villa is home to nine priests and is capably administered by the Oblates of the Sacred Heart. We are indeed blessed to have Sister Teresina and Sister Karen Marie making the villa a home for our retired priests.

A significant number of our senior priests assist on a regular basis in parishes celebrating Masses, hearing confessions and filling in on a temporary basis. The assistance also enables priests serving in our parishes to take their vacations and occasionally get away for a little rest and relaxation. Father Dan Stempora, Father Marty Gabel, and

Father Tony Taschetta are out daily, while others fill in as needed. Father Bill O'Shea lives in Chicago and assists at Old St. Patrick's Church and returns often to teach religion at All Saints Catholic Academy in Naperville. Father Charlie

As we have tried to be Good Shepherds to you over many years, we now appreciate your continued care and financial generosity as we draw closer to the promised reward for all those who have loved and served our God.

All of our senior priests express their deep appreciation and sincere gratitude for your love and tremendous generosity.
