

Through our words and deeds, we can lead the way in mending our country, demonstrating character, compassion and a devotion to unselfishly making the world a better place for all.

Tommy Rousseau Shriner extraordinaire, El Katif Photographer, Imperial Photographer... The Man, The Myth, The Legend. **Tommy** became a Shriner in the 60's and was a model Shriner by every sense of the word.

He was known by all, was at every event, took everyone's picture, and always had a smile on his face. He was also a veteran, coached American League baseball, a founder of Edgecliff Park, worked with Cub Scouts, and within the Shrine, one of the founders of the 10-gallon club (El Katif Shrine blood donors), a member of the Clowns known as "Flash the Clown", made the 100 Million Dollar Club in 1975, was Shriner of the Year, was appointed International Imperial Photographer in 1983, a member of Muhtaz and was involved in many other clubs and units. He even had his own "Shrine" pin. Check out the display in the museum.
