Dear People,

Guidelines for churches suddenly changed during the week. They have not been included in government conditions because it was deemed wiser to let the churches set their own. We followed the Church. Suddenly the Church is following the government which means that the precautions we had been taking are now considered to be too strict. I don't agree – for you all to be welcome and safe were the guidelines I chose for us but we now must be ready for people to refuse. I hope they don't but there is no official backing for what we had established.

The number of families in our parish affected by Covid-19 is increasing. There were another three families this week though there is no sign that coming to church was part of the problem. Please be thoughtful for everyone. Sanitisers must still be available, masks are optional but I hope everyone will continue to wear them, the necessity for social distancing is removed, but at St Joseph's we shall have social distancing on the right hand side of the church (near Our Lady's altar) and the left (near St Joseph's) for those who don't mind. The stewards will continue their work of welcoming and guiding.

I was advised to be very careful about funerals, following hospital and funeral directors' advice of an expected increase in deaths, the need to be ready to take two or even three funerals in a day and a backlog building up. The best I could do was to celebrate mass for the departed at the Sunday mass (before and/or after the funeral day) and have the simple but beautiful funeral service on the actual day. The church needed to be thoroughly cleaned between each service and the toilets after each use. So you can see the need to be fair to everyone. Those conditions are now changed and the Requiem mass may be celebrated.

Local social media is discussing the sale of the Rosary Church. I am grateful to people of the parish who have been explaining to local residents the process which was carefully followed – of people of the parish being consulted, their opinions being made known to the bishop, and then for the property to be put on the open market, as required by Charity law, so that all could be seen to be open and honest.

Bishop Patrick has made clear his plans for the diocese and for Leicester and it was decided that the Rosary Church would be best sold. Of course we are sad to lose it because it has been part of parish life for so many years, but we trust the people of St Joseph's understand, and have been able to explain to those asking questions as wisely and sensitively as our people have on social media.

Leicester City Council originally sold the land to us under covenant as a place for education and spiritual formation. The Muslim community will continue this ideal and I am pleased it will remain a place of prayer and education. I am very friendly with a number of that fine community and consider them my friends, and thus am happy that on the open market their offer was the one accepted. Please join me in making them feel welcome.

Ukraine is now an essential part of our parish life. The Blessed Sacrament Chapel is open every day from late morning until dusk and is decorated in the blue and yellow of Ukraine and its brave suffering people. 
DONATION ENVELOPES There will be envelopes for the new financial year at the beginning of April.

Dear People.

In last week's newsletter I made reference to the support given by the patriarch of Moscow and the Russian Orthodox Church to President Putin in his invasion of Ukraine - and made comparison with prayers offered for Hitler in Nazi Germany but not for the millions of Jews who suffered because of him, nor for the thousands of Catholic priests in Dachau concentration camp because they would not accept the brutality of Hitler's regime. I wondered how far Church leaders were supporters of national governments rather than of God's laws about conquest and killing.

A good friend asked me to check the details. I'm glad he wrote. Please look up Konrad von Preysing for details of an inspiring and courageous bishop of Berlin. The cardinal I was referring to was Adolf Bertram - but I cannot now find the book from which I quoted. Apologies. You will see why my friend wrote - and I'm grateful. Fr John
