I thought it would be good to share the messages and decided to start with following, which were sent during the week from Bernard, a former pupil, who came to see Fr John a couple of weeks before he died. They are from the Facebook page of former pupils of St Gregory's Grammar School in Huddersfield (all now approaching their 70's) where Fr John taught as a young priest: "I hope they give an insight into the wonderfully positive effect that Fr John had during his time at the school and how that has endured over the years." says Bernard.


