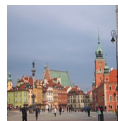

St. Michael the Archangel Prayer

Saint Michael the Archangel,
defend us in battle. Be our protection
against the wickedness and snares
of the devil.

May God rebuke him we humbly pray;
and do Thou, O Prince of the
Heavenly Host,
by the Power of God, cast into hell
Satan and all the evil spirits,
who prowl through the world seeking
the ruin of souls. Amen.



HISTORY

St. Michael the Archangel has a special heavenly role in doing battle against the devil, protecting the church, protecting Christians against assault from the devil. The prayer to St. Michael originated with Pope Leo XII in 1886. Legend has it that the Pope, following Holy Mass, received a vision in which he saw the great damage Satan would do to the Church and the world in the 20th century. Pope Leo XII composed this prayer in response and added it to the Leonnine prayers to be recited after Low Mass, which were originally intended for the intentions of the defense of the temporal sovereignty of the Holy See. Although no longer required to be said after Low Mass, the prayer is still encouraged:

"May prayer strengthen us for the spiritual battle that the Letter to the Ephesians speaks of: 'Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might' (Ephesians 6:10). The Book of Revelation refers to this same battle, recalling before our eyes the image of St. Michael the Archangel (Revelation 12:7). Pope Leo XII certainly had this picture in mind when, at the end of the last century, he brought in, throughout the Church, a special prayer to St. Michael: 'Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil...' Although this prayer is no longer recited at the end of Mass, I ask everyone not to forget it and to recite it to obtain help in the battle against the forces of darkness and against the spirit of this world.

Are you interested in inquiring more about or joining us in the Catholic Church? “Come and See!”

“The next day John was there again with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, “Behold, the Lamb of God.” <http://www.usccb.org/bible/john/1> The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, “What are you looking for?” They said to him, “Rabbi” (which translated means Teacher), “where are you staying?” He said to them, “Come, and you will see.” So, they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, “We have found the Messiah” (which is translated Anointed). Then he brought him to Jesus.” John 1:35-42

In John’s Gospel above, the first disciples ask him, ‘where do you stay?’ Jesus invites them to “come and see.” After meeting Jesus, Andrew goes home and tells his brother Simon about Jesus and brought him to Jesus. Like Simon, we are more likely to respond to someone in our life asking us or inviting us to become involved or join them in an activity or group or at times we may ask “how we could be a part of this. Our Happiness and commitment to our faith life, is the strongest witness and example to those outside of the faith, or friends and family who have chosen to step away from the faith.

Whether through marriage, or by the example of people they know, perhaps after attending a wedding, baptism or funeral of a friend, or just by driving by a full parking lot on a weekend, men and women come to express interest about the Roman Catholic faith. Nurturing that initial curiosity, has led many to pursue instruction and ultimately answer God’s call to holiness and initiation into the Roman Catholic faith.

The program of instruction for adults interested to learn more and ultimately join us in the Catholic Church is called **The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)**. Our program will begin Early November to prepare for the Sacraments of Initiation to be celebrated at the Easter Vigil on April 5, 2026.

Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael, Archangels

FEAST DAY: SEPTEMBER 29

These archangels, messengers sent by God, are the only ones named in the Bible. In the Book of Daniel, Michael is called “the great prince”; in the Letter of Jude, he argues with the devil over Moses’ body; and in the Book of Revelation, he leads the battle against Satan. He is patron of the sick, radiologists and mariners. Gabriel explains Daniel’s visions to him in the Book of Daniel, and in the Gospel of Luke announces to Zechariah and Mary the births of their respective sons. He is the patron of messengers and telecommunications and postal workers. Raphael guides Tobiah in the Book of Tobit; he is patron of the blind, physicians and travelers. The church created their joint feast after the Second Vatican Council.
