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Tennessee Social Work Licensure Rules & Regulations

Ethics & Biennial Licensure Requirement for all Tennessee Social Workers

This **one-hour webinar** is designed to satisfy the Tennessee biennial one-hour licensure rules training requirement for all licensed social workers and also qualifies for ethics continuing education credit. Participants will receive a comprehensive review of the current Tennessee Board of Social Worker Licensure rules governing advanced licensure, including the requirements and pathways for obtaining Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) and Licensed Advanced Practice Social Worker (LAPSW) credentials.

The training will clarify eligibility requirements for advanced licensure, appropriate documentation of supervised social work experience, and the accumulation of required supervision and contact hours. Through practical case scenarios, participants will learn to accurately interpret and apply licensure rules, document qualifying experience, and distinguish the roles and responsibilities of supervisors and supervisees.

In addition, the webinar will examine the ethical and professional responsibilities associated with supervision, documentation, and licensure, emphasizing compliance with Tennessee Board rules and the NASW Code of Ethics. Participants will strengthen their ability to make informed, ethical decisions while navigating the licensure process and maintaining professional accountability.

- Identify the current Tennessee licensure rules governing advanced social work licensure, including eligibility requirements for Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) and Licensed Advanced Practice Social Worker (LAPSW) licensure.
- Explain the ethical and professional responsibilities of social workers, supervisors, and supervisees related to licensure, supervision, documentation, and compliance with Tennessee Board of Social Worker Licensure rules and the NASW Code of Ethics.

Social Work Supervision, Ethics, & Biennial Licensure Requirement for all Social Workers in Tennessee

This **three-hour webinar** is designed to satisfy Tennessee's biennial one-hour licensure rules training requirement for licensed social workers while also meeting ethics continuing education requirements and providing comprehensive instruction on social work supervision in Tennessee. Participants will receive an in-depth review of the current Tennessee Board of Social Worker Licensure rules governing advanced licensure and supervision, including the requirements and pathways for obtaining Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW) and Licensed Advanced Practice Social Worker (LAPSW) credentials.

The training provides detailed guidance on documenting supervised social work experience, accumulating required supervision and contact hours, and understanding the qualifications, responsibilities, and expectations of both supervisors and supervisees. Participants will gain practical knowledge of effective supervision practices, legal and regulatory requirements, and strategies for maintaining accurate documentation throughout the licensure process.

Through discussion and application of case scenarios, participants will interpret and apply Tennessee licensure rules to common supervision situations, evaluate documentation for compliance, and address ethical dilemmas that may arise in the supervisory relationship. Emphasis will be placed on professional accountability, risk management, ethical decision-making, and the supervisor's role in fostering competent, ethical social work practice. By the conclusion of the training, participants will have a comprehensive understanding of Tennessee's licensure and supervision requirements and will be equipped to navigate the supervision process in accordance with state regulations and the NASW Code of Ethics.
