

Explanation of the Worship Service as Examination of the Officers

This morning's worship service prepares our Deacons and Ruling Elders to be ordained and installed. Ordained means that they are called to serve Christ on behalf of the larger congregation. Installed means that they are going to serve a particular three year term. Once you are ordained an Elder or Deacon, you are one for life though terms begin and end. Deacons lead us in Christian care and nurture. Elders, serving on Session, lead us in the tasks of program, administration, building, and finances. These officers traditionally respond to a series of eight questions that are found in our Book of Order. This Book of Order organizes and orders the shared life of the Presbyterian Church USA. Below you will find the list of ordination and installation questions. They have been built into the liturgy of the church worship service. The question to the congregation will be asked during the Offering portion of our worship service.

- a. Do you trust in Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? (Call to Worship)
- b. Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal, and God's Word to you? (Call to Worship)
- c. Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God? (Prayer of Confession)
- d. Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions? (Prayer of Confession)
- e. Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit? (Call to Worship)
- f. Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world? (Prayers of the People)
- g. Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church? (Prayers of the People)
- h. Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love? (The Charge)
- i.1 (For Ruling Elder) Will you be a faithful ruling elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture, and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in councils of the church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?
- i.2 (For Deacon) Will you be a faithful deacon, teaching charity, urging concern, and directing the people's help to the friendless and those in need, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

Guidance for Laying on of Hands – All those who are gathered are invited to create a circle around the perimeter of the sanctuary. We will use our Bibles we brought from home or the Bibles in the pew. Placing them in our right hands, we will extend the bible to rest on the shoulder of our neighbor. If possible, our other hand will rest on another neighbor's shoulder and we'll be connected in a circle of fellowship. Once settled, we'll offer a prayer.

JANUARY READING CHALLENGE




