Dear Sarah Owen MP,

Thank you for your email of 22 May to the Home Office on behalf of your constituent, Ms Tamara Wilding of , regarding the Supreme Court's ruling in the For Women Scotland case. Your email has been passed to the Direct Communications Unit and I have been asked to reply.

The UK has long championed the rights of LGBT+ people at home and abroad and the Government is committed to ensuring the UK is a welcoming place for all people, regardless of their background or identity, and one where they are able to pursue their goals and ambitions without fear of discrimination.

We recognise that the Supreme Court ruling in the For Women Scotland case has caused Ms Wilding concern and would like to reassure you that trans people will continue to be protected through laws in place to protect them from discrimination and harassment, and to have their acquired gender recognised. The Government is clear that trans people should be treated with the same dignity and respect as anyone else.

The Government is considering the implications of the Supreme Court's ruling and will provide further information in due course. The ruling has not invalidated Ms Wilding's passport or driving licence. She may wish to contact the DVLA directly for a response if she has any further questions regarding her driving licence.
