

PARENT-CHILD DISCUSSION

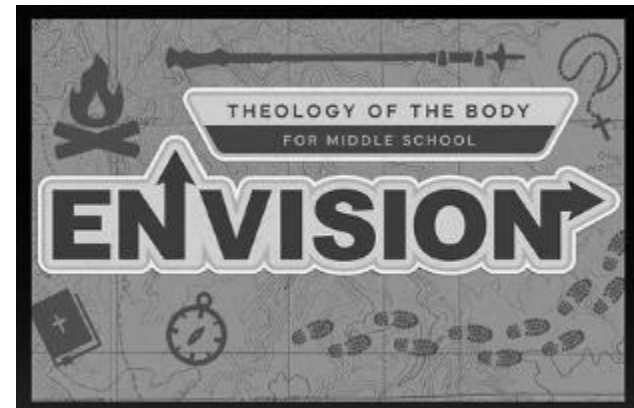
Parent/Guardian:
