


Tlaquepaque, which means the "best of everything" in ancient Aztec, will make you feel transported to another time and place.

The Abe Miller Story

VISIONARY, DEVELOPER, LOVER OF THE ARTS



n the 1970s Sedona had only one stoplight and the area was mostly an open range, but visionary businessman Abe Miller saw the potential for more. A traveler, Abe had spent time in Mexico where he became enthralled with its vibrant arts scene—in particular, that of a small arts and crafts village outside of Guadalajara that would become our village's namesake, Tlaquepaque (Ta-la-ka-pa-kee). It was Abe's dream to establish a place for artists where they could collectively create and sell their work.

At that time, Abe also fell in love with Sedona. In particular a unique piece of property on Oak Creek with a distinctive 100-year-old sycamore grove. He knew he had found the place to bring his arts and crafts village to life. It took two years of being persistent, but Abe finally acquired this piece of land from its owners Harry and Ruby Girard, assuring them that their beloved sycamores would remain untouched (a promise he kept and that we continue to honor today).

To express his vision, Abe collaborated with a gifted and unconventional local architect, Bob McIntyre. As the story goes, Bob, Abe, and Bill Herrick, the contractor, flew Abe's plane all over Mexico and ventured into small villages to photograph, sketch, and document their look and feel. They studied how they were constructed—the materials, their structural components, detailing and flow—with a goal to build Tlaquepaque as authentically as possible. They photographed thousands of scenes from rural villages and sketched dozens of vignettes of Spanish Colonial architecture.

When Bob and Abe came upon a small village, they would sit and watch for hours, coming to know the importance of how people, gardens, fountains, and trees shaped social interaction in a public space. They carefully studied the architecture. They were soul searching, discovering what life really looked like in rural Mexico and what architectural elements they should embrace, taking particular note of how the patios, courtyards, tiled walls, and plazas created natural gathering places for the villagers to sell their crafts and

mingle together. They began to bring artifacts reflecting Mexican culture back to Sedona—iron grillwork, huge carved doors, handmade lanterns, clay pots, and benches were incorporated into the architecture to create the genuine feel and spirit of Tlaquepaque.

In keeping with his unconventional ways, Bob McIntyre purposely hired only amateur artisans and self-trained plasterers, chosen for their heart and enthusiasm for the project. No professional stonemasons were on the crew. He gave tremendous artistic freedom to the workers who "loved to be turned loose on a wall and watch it grow under their hands." If they weren't happy with their day's work, Abe allowed them to tear it down and start over. "Forget the plumb, use the thumb," was a favorite saying on the construction site. Very little of Tlaquepaque was sketched out on paper. Everything was eyeballed, keeping the basic orders of columns and capitals, but allowing for variables. It was all part of what gave Tlaquepaque its authenticity and unique charm.

In 2017 Tlaquepaque North opened its doors. The addition, located on the north side of Sedona's highway 179, was artfully developed to maintain Abe and Bob's original spirit and authentic design.

Here too, no detail was overlooked. Visitors enter the space through large elegant archways where niches are filled with Tlaquepaque's signature blue ceramic tile work and hand-painted murals. The roofs are covered with terracotta tiles. Walkways are created with stone pavers that lead you from shop to shop and meet at the center, where you find a graceful stone fountain with its cooling waters and bubbling sounds. Tlaquepaque's giant Sycamore trees and colorful flower beds are interwoven into the space, adding to its inimitable style.

The architect and builders took pains to ensure that Tlaquepaque North gives the impression that it too has elegantly stood here for decades. The result is that visiting is a complete sensory experience while also offering a chance to explore and discover unique artwork, handcrafted and well-curated products, jewelry, and tasty foods and treats. A beautifully renovated former cobblestone home is now the Pump House Station Urban Eatery, one of Sedona's most beloved restaurants. Around the plaza, you will also find the Artists Kitchen, filled with treasures for the kitchen and home, Renee Taylor Jewelry, with more of its exquisite jewelry and art, and Bow Wow Sedona, the finest in fashion, accessories, health, and nutrition for the quad pet set. Look for Cream & Cake Couture too. Located down the steps

by the parking area, here you can enjoy homemade ice cream, shakes, sweets, and cake by the slice.

Chef de Cuisine Orlando took little convincing to move to Sedona, where he and his wife were eager to raise their daughter. And although Chef Mercer will be leading the team for the opening menus, Orlando and his team will be the people you will see there every night, bringing you distinguished food and service. So come by to meet him and the team. The menu will be changing seasonally as Chef Mercer, Orlando, and the team eagerly await your feedback as they continue René Restaurant's tradition of excellence in fine dining and culinary experiences.


This is the rare opportunity to see Tlaquepaque Arts & Shopping Village bathed in candlelight.









FOUR DECADES OF SAVING AND MAKING HISTORY



The Sedona Historical Society has spent the last 40 years both saving history and making history. The non-profit group has evolved from hosting an annual Pioneer Picnic to almost 70 events per year, most held at their Sedona Heritage Museum.

It all started over 50 years ago when a group of Oak Creek Canyon pioneers and Sedona residents came together to organize a historical society. There were some false starts, but finally, a group was organized in January 1982.

The most "audacious" goal of the Society's founders was to open a local museum telling the stories of the area's rich and unique history. That goal was checked off the list in 1998 when the Sedona Heritage Museum opened its doors. In less than a year the Museum had enticed enough volunteers to be open daily and began building a year-round calendar of events. The Society and Museum now routinely host 60-70 events and programs annually.

Today the organization can look back on decades of achievements that most small volunteer museums only dream of. The Museum has expanded its exhibits to cover Sedona's winemaking history since the 1880s, the importance of Oak Creek, and the story of the community's development into an arts destination. Early permanent displays have been replaced by professionally curated and designed exhibits, with more upgrades in process.

Jordan Historical Park, a city park that hosts the Museum, has become a mecca for public art, including four life-size bronzes and several other pieces, including the novel park sign and entry gate.

In 2014, the Society literally stumbled on the last remaining building from the 1940-50s era western movie set, a contributing element to Sedona being known as "Arizona's Little Hollywood" for a time. The Telegraph Office from John Wayne's film "Angel and the Badman" was found abandoned on a property just out of town, donated to the Society, and relocated to the Museum where it now holds exhibits and movie clips about the golden era of western film making in Sedona.

Along the way, the Society has accepted gifts of the area's two oldest cemeteries (1893 and 1918) from pioneer families, both of which continue to accept pioneer descendant burials. The Cook Cedar Glade Cemetery is the final resting place of Sedona Schnebly, the town's namesake. Volunteers maintain these sacred places and host annual fund-raising cemetery walks to raise money for their care.

In 2018, the gift of the Schuerman family's 1908 homestead house, the area's oldest and last remaining home used specifically to meet homestead requirements, set the Society on a course of restoration and eventual opening. The building is currently being nominated to the National Register of Historic Places.

Meanwhile, Society volunteers have made plans to observe their 40th year of "researching, preserving and teaching the history of the Greater Sedona area." Yet to come this Fall are several special events, along with a Time Capsule planned for burial in November.

The Society encourages everyone who visits, lives in, or just plain loves Sedona, to visit the Museum to learn about the past and to see what's new. Also, visit SedonaMuseum.org to check out the Calendar of Events. The Fall is a busy time in Sedona and the Museum is no exception, hosting the popular "Voices from the Grave" cemetery walk on October 28-29; or the sell-out Red Rock Roundup History Tours on September 28, 29, 30, and October 1; or some early holiday shopping at the Fall Arts & Crafts Fair; or free old-time family fun, hot cider, and cookies at "Christmas in the Park" on December 10.

Every month there are choices, from cowboy poetry and story-tellin' at a performance of "Fool Me Twice", to pioneer reenactments at "Throwback Thursday", or the "Living History" speaker series and "Monday at the Museum" old-time demonstrations. There's always something going on.

MASTER CREATOR OF HIGH-FIRE PORCELAIN ART



The unique beauty and other worldly qualities of artist Duly Mitchell's high-fire porcelain pieces are mesmerizing. Animate yet seemingly alive, their crystalline glaze develops randomly-perfect patterns that shimmer and shine on his elegant forms.

Mitchell began his journey with pottery in 1969 after returning from Vietnam. For over 30-plus years, he has been running his own ceramic studio in Tuscon, AZ, experimenting with high-fire porcelain and willemite crystalline glazing. A mix of science and art, this process requires firing each piece for twenty hours in a kiln with heat upwards of 2,400 degrees. His carefully created glazes form crystals and develop their elegant patterns as the kiln slowly cools and stops the crystal growth.





Yield: 2 servings

INGREDIENTS:

4-5 oz. blanched broccoli rabe spears

16 ripe tear drop tomatoes, cut in half

1 oz. quality olive oil

4 oz. italian sausage, hot or mild your choice

2 tablespoons minced shallot

4-5 garlic cloves, shaved thin like in goodfellow's

2 oz. white wine (something you enjoy drinking)

10 oz. pasta rea cavatelli

1.5 oz. whole butter

3 tablespoon chopped fresh parsley

Sea salt, to taste

Freshly ground black pepper, to taste

3-4 oz. grated fresh grated romano cheese

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Clean broccoli rabe of any excess leaves and cut in spears about 3" long. Be sure to use tender stems as well as the florets.
- 2. Bring 2 guarts of salted water to a rolling boil-blanch broccoli rabe in boiling water until al dente. Drain well and immediately submerge in an ice bath. When chilled throughout, remove from the ice bath and drain well.
- Rinse out the pot and bring 3 quarts of salted water to a boil
- 4. Remove sausage from casing. Heat oil in a nonstick skillet, lightly brown sausage, and crumble with a fork as it browns.
- Add garlic and shallots to the sausage and sauté until translucent. Add tomatoes and sauté to blister. Add rapini

- 7. Drop pasta in water and cook to desired doneness. Cook on a high boil for 3 minutes after they float to the top.
- Drain pasta well, reserving some pasta water.
- Add pasta to the pan and toss.
- 10. Add whole butter and toss again until butter is melted. You can add small amounts of pasta water if needed.
- 11. Add parsley and season to taste with salt, pepper, and $\frac{1}{2}$ the Romano cheese.
- 12. Toss on medium heat to make sure all is hot.
- 13. Plate and garnish with remaining cheese.





FALL IN SEDONA

A HUNT FOR AUTUMN'S MOST VIBRANT COLORS

Fall in Sedona is spectacular. The weather is perfect and the colors are world-class. What's more, our amazing autumn spans more than three months. The secret is the wide variety of elevations, bio-zones, and deciduous trees that keep leaf peepers and photographers smiling from late September to early December.

It starts in the brilliant yellow and gold aspen stands of Flagstaff's high elevation San Francisco Peaks during the last week of September.

By mid-October, maples, gambel oaks, sycamores, and cottonwoods produce an amazing array of colors in Oak Creek Canyon.

This lasts into mid-November when the lower reaches of Oak Creek and the Verde River explode with the gold, orange, and yellow of sycamores and massive cottonwoods.

Note the dates and happy hunting.



FLAGSTAFF SAN FRANCISCO PEAKS

Just a short 45-minute drive north of Sedona, aspens surround Flagstaff's San Francisco Peaks. By late September they turn brilliant yellow and gold and can be accessed via a network of decent forest roads. Hart Prairie Road (FR 151, off Hwy. 180), with its meanders thru forests and meadows, is always a highlight.



TLAQUEPAQUE ARTS & SHOPPING VILLAGE

Late November into the first half of December, there's no finer place to stroll amongst the colors than our very own **Tlaquepaque**. Nestled in a forever-preserved stand of old-growth sycamores, it makes for a shopping experience like no other.

Our Festival of Lights, held this year on December 10, 3:00 - 8:00 PM, with over 6,000 luminarias, is often right at the peak of fall color. Come by and experience the beauty yourself.

OCTOBER - NOVEMBER OAK CREEK CANYON

The second half of October into November is when Arizona bigtooth maples begin to turn in Oak Creek Canyon. These maples produce a wide variety of colors, sometimes blood-red, brilliantly pink, or subtly salmon. Interspersed with old-growth ponderosa pines, gambel oaks, and sycamores, the color display is awe-inspiring.

The two best locations are the West Fork Trail and the area around Cave Springs Campground. Both are easily accessed along Hwy. 89A.




Following the elevation down, by November a stop anywhere along Hwy. 89A in Oak Creek Canyon will find sycamores and cottonwoods in full fall color. Banjo Bill Picnic Site, Bootlegger Picnic Area & Grasshopper Point Picnic Area are great stops with easy access to the colors.

By early November, an absolute must-see are the yellow and gold cottonwoods, sycamores, and alders that line the banks of Oak Creek and frame Sedona's signature rock formation, Cathedral Rock, as viewed from Crescent Moon Recreation Area. The sunsets there are world-famous.

HOW TO GET TO TLAQUEPAQUE ART & SHOPPING VILLAGE



From Phoenix/Scottsdale Area

Take I-17 North toward Flagstaff, Leave I-17 at exit 298 (State Route 179). Drive 15 miles and pass through 10 roundabouts into Sedona and crossover the Oak Creek Bridge. Tlaquepaque is on the immediate left handside of the road.

From Flagstaff Area

From I-17, take the AZ-89A S exit, EXIT 337, toward Sedona/Oak Creek Canyon. Pass through 4 roundabouts. At roundabout one, take the 1st exit onto W Shamrell Blvd/AZ-89A (24.39 mi). Roundabout two, take the 3rd exit onto S State Route 89A/AZ-89A (.31mi). At roundabout three, take the 2nd exit onto Dry Creek Scenic Road/N State Route 89A/ AZ-89A (.32 mi). At roundabout four, take the 3rd exit onto Red Rock Scenic Byway/State Route 179/AZ-179. Tlaquepaque is just past


