

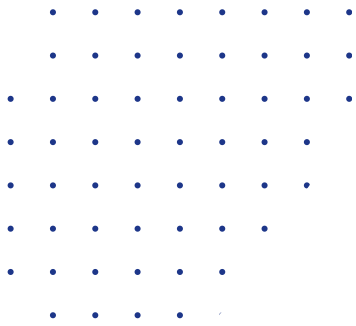

MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR



2022 was a very busy year for Lutheran Towers. We celebrated fifty years of providing quality housing for low-income seniors in Midtown Atlanta. But we are so much more than just a place to live. Our 203 apartments are an affordable, quality home with person-centered supportive services that empower residents to thrive. We fill a critical need in the community which brings hope to people who are at risk of homelessness.



Thank you for making our “Live Well · Be Well” campaign a success. The Board of Directors set an ambitious target of raising \$100,000 in fiscal 2022 and we are proud to announce that we exceeded our goal and raised a total of \$119,414.61 through the generosity of our donors.

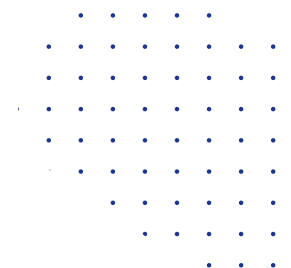
Food insecurity is one of the top issues facing seniors across Atlanta, Georgia, and our entire nation. Through these donations, Lutheran Towers was able to provide our 203 residents with 117,360 pounds of free food in 2022. Our continued goal is to ensure every resident is food secure. Donations are also used to provide programs and services that significantly enhance our residents’ quality of life, such as transportation, mental health services, home care, and enrichment programs.

A 2022 – 2025 Strategic Plan was completed along with key initiatives that enables Lutheran Towers leadership to understand and achieve measurable outcomes and objectives in four key areas: Resident Health and Wellbeing - Advocacy - Campus / Facilities - Funding

We had a leadership change in 2022 which led to an extensive executive search. Karon Winston stepped into the role of Executive Director in the fourth quarter. She has been with Lutheran Towers since 2016 and understands our mission and how to get it done efficiently, effectively, and profitably. Karon is also known throughout the Atlanta senior housing community through her service as a LeadingAge Georgia Board member and recently as Chair of the Georgia Institute on Aging.

Many thanks to all Lutheran Towers Board members for their time, talent, and contributions this year. The foundation is set for the next fifty years as we continue the vision of the Rev. Dr. Robert E Lee. Lutheran Towers is the only faith-based community of its kind in Midtown Atlanta, and we have a bright future ahead. Thanks be to God.

2022 was a huge year for Lutheran Towers – it was our 50th year anniversary! For 50 years, Lutheran Towers has strived to advocate and provide quality housing for seniors in a flourishing community that provides innovative focus on individual wellness. Lutheran Towers celebrated our 50th year anniversary in multiple ways, even during the COVID19 pandemic.

This past year, the pandemic continued to exacerbate persisting plagues of loneliness, helplessness, and boredom that account for the bulk of suffering among our Elders. The existing plaques, coupled with the many restrictions brought on by COVID19 pandemic. While issues of loneliness and social isolation can often be overlooked by health and social service professionals, the COVID-19 pandemic has focused increased attention on social isolation and loneliness for all ages, particularly older adults as the most vulnerable, at-risk segment of the population.

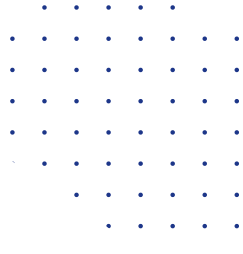
From our start in 1972, Lutheran Towers focus was on providing quality housing with supportive services for individual low-income elders who came through our doors. In the years since, we have added a Wellness Center, Free Grocery Store, multiple food programs, and endless social engagements and activities that are resident-led. Today, our community extends beyond providing housing and supportive services. We are a larger and more mature organization that has continued to evolve and progress in directions that result a sense of community, systemic advocacy, policy work, and extensive community outreach and engagement for our elders.

By leveraging the talents and resources of all sectors—public, private, and philanthropic—we did what none of us could achieve on our own. 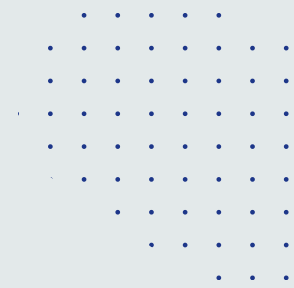
BEYOND HOUSING



Lutheran Towers expanded our onsite feeding programs to ensure that all residents had access to food. We have partnered with several organizations including Atlanta Community Food Bank (ACFB), Second Helpings Atlanta, Lutheran Church of the Redeemer Food Ministry, Meals on Wheels of Atlanta (MOW), Goodr, and Gilliam’s Farm. Through these partnerships, Lutheran Towers was able to distribute approximately 117,360 lbs. of food to our residents in 2022.

Lutheran Towers is dedicated to delivering outstanding services to the seniors residing within the community. Our commitment lies in upholding the mission and vision of Lutheran Towers through our daily efforts.

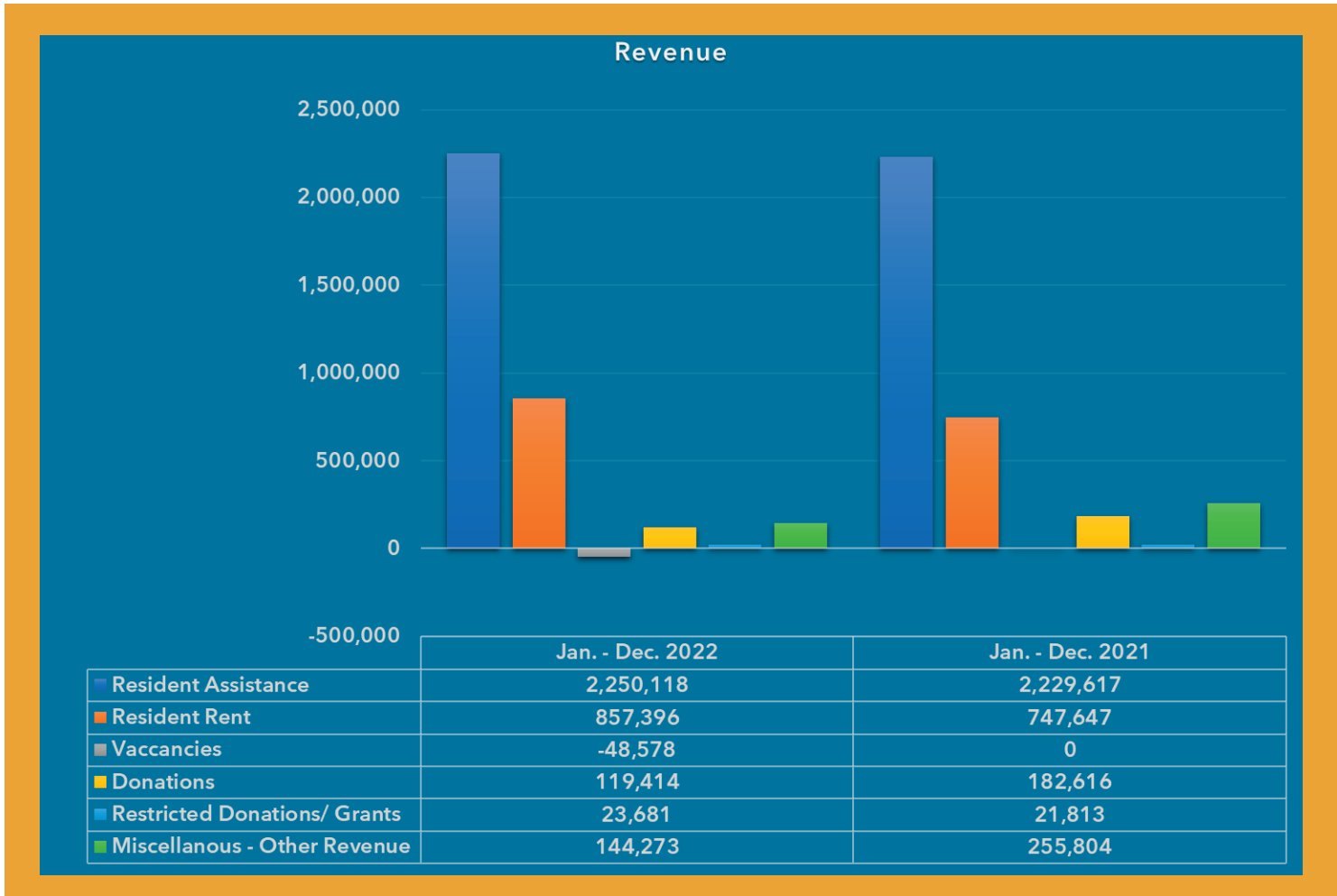
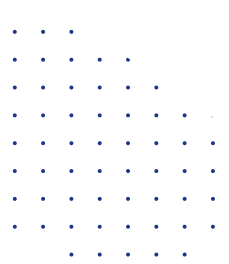

HEALTH & WELLNESS



EMOTIONAL WELLNESS

Emotional wellness encompasses optimism, self-esteem, self-acceptance, and the ability to experience and cope with feelings independently and interpersonally.

Lutheran Towers understands the importance of emotional wellness and its impact on aging. We have partnered with licensed social workers to conduct both group and individual sessions that allow residents to address emotional wellness concerns and learn coping strategies.



SOCIAL WELLNESS

Social Wellness focuses on connecting with your community and the people around you

Lutheran Towers offers several opportunities for residents to engage with each other and the community by curating activities that allow them to connect and be social. Events include monthly birthday parties, bingo, movie nights, and field trips just to name a few.



INTELLECTUAL WELLNESS

Intellectual wellness encourages participating in mentally stimulating and creative activities

Lutheran Towers' Life Enrichment program focuses on providing residents with mentally stimulating activities, including painting classes, trivia hours, crafting, trips to museums, national parks, bingo, meditation, and so much more.



PHYSICAL WELLNESS

Physical wellness is not merely the absence of illness but about maintaining a thriving lifestyle. This area of wellness includes adopting healthy habits such as routine medical exams, immunizations, safety precautions, sexually transmitted infection screenings, adequate sleep, a balanced diet, regular exercise, and more.

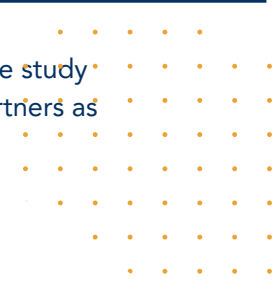
Lutheran Towers prioritizes physical wellness and has partnered with pharmacies to provide annual flu, pneumonia, shingles, and COVID-19 immunization clinics. In addition, Lutheran Towers has health clinics throughout the year that include services from a Podiatrist, Optometrist, and Chiropractor. Weekly fitness classes are offered such as chair yoga and line dance classes.



SPRITUAL WELLNESS

Spiritual wellness involves seeking and having a meaning and purpose in life, as well as participating in activities that are consistent with one's beliefs and values.

Lutheran Towers hosts multiple bible study sessions weekly with community partners as well as resident-run bible study.

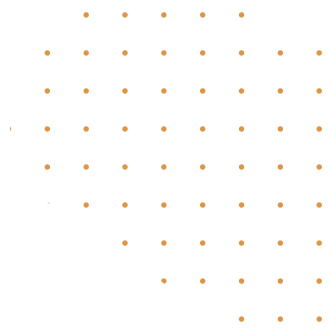

He recalls having nowhere to call home and then finding Lutheran Towers and realizing that life can be so much better. As he marvels that "no one is like Lutheran Towers" he smiles as he recalls fellow residents that has turned into family. "My wife and I found happiness here and we plan to be here as long as we can."



2022 marked a year for Mr. William Hackney that he will never forget. Health issues burdened him as he found himself in and out of the hospital and physical therapy facilities for nearly 5 months. When most would feel the weight of the world on their backs, Mr. Hackney found strength. "I worked hard to come back to Lutheran Towers. Really hard. I was harder than I thought it would be, but I wanted to be independent." He persevered and when he walked into Lutheran Towers again, he said "I did it! I am home." Being positive and seeing "the glass half full instead of half empty" is something he takes pride in. "Lutheran Towers made me a better person," he says smiling "Lutheran Towers was a part of the plan God had for me."



More than 61 years ago Mr. and Mrs. Dela Cruz said "I do" to one another, and decided to go through life together. Nothing changed when they stumbled across Lutheran Towers. For 10 and a half years they have remained residents of Lutheran Towers and discovered happiness here together. With a warm grin and gentle eyes, they both declare "The residents is our new family, the towers are our new home, and the community is our new neighborhood."



"I have been here for almost 12 years". Ms. Papaik says as she recalls moving into Lutheran Towers. OUR HISTORY



- June 1969, The RLC Cooperation was established and designated the first members of it's governing body, the board of directors .
- Senior Pastor of Lutheran Church of the Redeemer, the late Reverend Dr. Robert E. Lee's dream to provide safe, decent, and affordable housing for low- and moderate-income seniors in the Midtown Atlanta, Georgia became a reality.

- July 27, 1970 Redeemer congregation transferred ownership of the property to R.L.C Corporation, which led to the partnership with U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development under Section 2020/236.
- April 25, 1971 Lutheran Towers Groundbreaking
- April 1972 first residents moved into the building.
- October 8, 1972 Lutheran Towers Dedication Ceremony

- Charles Rizzo, Tom Leppenan, and Mark Lee all served as Lutheran Towers Executive Directors during the first 32 years of operation.
- In 2004, G. David Sprowl, MPA became Lutheran Towers' 4th Executive Director.
- The 2000s marked the era of transformation for Lutheran Towers, as building renovation occurred routinely, new collaborations were established, and the service offerings to residents expanded.

- Thanks to the generous donations from Redeemer Lutheran Church members and others in the community, Lutheran Towers completed the first phase of renovations to include furnishing the elevator lobbies on all floors.
- In pursuit of residents' well-being, we hosted our inaugural Health Fair featuring 40 health related partners such as the American Cancer Society, Atlanta Medical Center, and Grady Hospital.
- In 2005, As part of ongoing renovations, we installed a beautiful garden fountain in memory of Pastor Robert E. Lee, Lutheran Towers' founder.

- In 2006, Lutheran Towers completed the renovation of Lee Hall, the garden, the kitchen, and the adjacent storage room. Both phase II and phase III of the hallway renovations were completed.
- The 35th Anniversary ground-breaking of Lutheran Towers was celebrated in honor of the founding board members.
- The Board of Directors and Development Committee launched an Annual Fund.
- In 2011, in continuation to meet our mission , Lutheran Towers successfully refinanced its mortgage. The proceeds were used to renovate the bathrooms and kitchens in each of the resident apartments.

OUR HISTORY



- In 2012 Lutheran Towers held its 40th Anniversary celebration on April 20th.
- In 2017 Nichelle Mitchem, Esq. became Lutheran Towers' 5th Executive Director.
- In 2017, the Lifelong Learning Center and Game Room were established.
- In 2018, Lutheran Towers established partnerships such as Resurgja and USDA to increase our residents' access to comprehensive healthcare and free food.

- 2018 Lutheran Towers flourishes through expanded community partnerships, extended service hours, increased offerings, and free resident food programs. A resident needs assessment revealed that over 90% of residents face food insecurity due to low retirement incomes.
- Lutheran Towers partners with Redeemer Lutheran Church for a weekly food market.
- Residents free Thanksgiving Day Luncheon established.

- In response to the 2018 Residents' Needs Assessment, Lutheran Towers initiated multiple free feeding programs, including an on-site food pantry in partnership with Atlanta Community Food Bank, monthly Project Hope Older People Eat Healthier (HOPE) for free fruits and vegetables, and the establishment of Lutheran Towers' own food pantry.
