


Our Executive Director's Letter

Dear Friends,

It is with great pleasure that I share Lutheran Towers' recent successes. Due to external and internal occurrences, both 2019 and 2020 have been transformative years where our agency has experienced exponential growth.

In early 2020, Lutheran Towers was the home to two hundred and three (203) very low-income, food insecure, elderly persons struggling with physical health challenges such as heart disease, high blood pressure, diabetes, and cancer all of which served to cause our residents to be more susceptible to contracting and dying from the new coronavirus (COVID-19).

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), people over 65 years of age, like all Lutheran Towers' residents, are more susceptible to contracting COVID-19. Further, their COVID symptoms tend to be more severe than younger people. In fact, in 2020, 80% of the more than 500,000 COVID related deaths in the United States occurred in people 65 years and older.

In 2020, because of the support of our donors and community partners, for the first time in our history, we disseminated more than 70,000 pounds of free food to our residents. Our feeding programs are pictured in this 2020 Annual Report which illustrates Lutheran Towers' response to COVID-19.





In 2020, no aspect of our operations was left untouched. To ensure residents safety, engaged in we agency-wide capacity-building in the of disease prevention and areas intervention policies, procedures, and practices. When many organizations the world were curtailing across services. programs and Lutheran Towers was able to expand our supportive services, wellness programs, as well as recreational programs in 2020 via the use of technology. Additionally, we added Wi-Fi throughout the building and purchased iPads to offer our residents free access to the Internet and to increase their access to their family, friends, and recreation from the safety of their apartments. Additionally, we made notable capital improvements throughout residential portions of our building without event.



In 2020, like in 2019, we notably increased our earned income, obtained new program funding sources, grew, and strengthened our programs, increased our community partnerships, and launched the renovation of the hallways (i.e., new flooring, lights, paint, pictures, elevator lobby furniture, and window screens) in the residential section of the building from the basement to the fifteenth floor. The increased rent revenue generated by Lutheran Towers can only be utilized to maintain the building or make capital improvements on the building grounds---so, as previously stated, in 2020, in the residential portion of our building, we engaged in renovation on every floor of the building.

Today, Lutheran Towers is more committed than ever to not simply the provision of housing but also to providing holistic. person-centered supportive services. innovative recreational programs, and free feeding programs to its more than 200 residents.

With guidance from our strategic plan, the dedication of a caring board of directors, very dedicated and talented staff, our innovative as well as holistic programs, and the dedication of our individual donors, we are poised to move forward in becoming Atlanta's premier senior independent living community.

On behalf of Lutheran Towers' residents, staff, and the board of directors, I thank you deeply for your support it is greatly appreciated by all.

BEYOND HOUSING



In 2018, to address the recently discovered prevalence of residents hunger within our retirement community, we created our first on-site free feeding program and each year since then the type of hunger intervention programs operated here and pounds of food disseminated annually has grown each year to more than 70,000 pounds in 2020.





Our Response To COVID-19

OUR COVID-19 RELATED PROGRAM SERVICE DELIVERY MODEL SHIFT

A recent study published in The Journals of Gerontology (2021), found that older adults experienced disproportionately greater adverse effects from the pandemic including more severe complications, higher mortality, concerns about disruptions to their daily routines and access to care, difficulty in adapting to technologies like telemedicine, and concerns that isolation would exacerbate existing mental health conditions.

To address the afore-mentioned research-based concerns in the older adult population related to COVID-19, Lutheran Towers Supportive Services Department had to shift the service delivery model to support residents during this time. Towards that end, the service delivery model moved from the standard HUD mandated service delivery model which is an intervention model to a social science research-driven prevention focused service delivery model.



Towards that end, at the beginning of the pandemic through the present time. our Supportive Services Department has conducted weekly wellness calls to residents to inform them of the current food distribution programs, activities, and other services being offered to residents during this time. Our supportive services. recreational activities, wellness and free feeding programs were held while practicing the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines such as social distancing, wearing masks, and gloves.

Our Supportive Services Department also supported residents following COVID-19 with education & resources, resident outreach wellness checks, supportive individual counseling, protective equipment personal distribution and quarantine support.

EXPANSION OF OUR ON-SITE FREE FEEDING PROGRAMS:

2020, Lutheran Towers expanded the onsite feeding programs to ensure that all residents had easy and safe access to food in the pandemic. Towards that end, we with several have partnered organizations to include Lutheran Church of the Redeemer's Food Ministry*, Meals on Wheels of Atlanta (MOW), **Fulton** County Senior Services, Atlanta Community Bank (ACFB), Helpings Atlanta, and Gilliam's Farm.

Our Response To COVID-19

LUTHERAN TOWERS FREE FEEDING PROGRAMS

Lutheran Church of the Redeemer's Food Recovery and Reclamation Program-

We continue to offer residents a weekly food reclamation program in partnership with Redeemer Lutheran Church* and local grocery stores. This program is available every Tuesday for residents to add to their weekly household food supply. This program is executed practicing the CDC guidelines such as social distancing, limited number of residents in the area, wearing masks, and gloves as needed (average 70 participants weekly).

Lutheran Church of the Redeemer Weekday Free Lunch Program-

Throughout the pandemic, Redeemer* has provided the seniors of Lutheran Towers with 40 bagged lunches per day (Monday - Friday). This program started in March 2020 and continues to be an ongoing program. A total of 20,000 lbs. were distributed to our seniors in 2020.

Lutheran Towers Food Pantry-

Lutheran Towers partners with the Atlanta Community Food Bank to maintain our on-site food pantry. Since the establishment of our pantry in 2018, it has allowed and continues to allow our residents in need ready on-site access to nutritious food.

This partnership is the first of its kind among the Metro- Atlanta non-profit senior housing communities. In the wake of the COVID-19 virus, the pantry has also been continuously stocked with frozen meals to address the needs of all residents and their ability to prepare food.



Project HOPE (Helping Older People Eat Healthier)-

Project HOPE provides residents with fresh food vouchers in the amount of \$100 per resident. Issued in the form of a paper value voucher Lutheran Towers has partnered with a local farmer to offer monthly fresh produce market days. Vouchers are in increments of \$20.00 and distributed to residents that have signed up to participate in the Project HOPE program. Each Market day the residents receive FDA approved nutrition handouts to address healthy eating and proper nutrition. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, Lutheran Towers had to modify the distribution process for market day. Our community vendor Gilliam's Farm pre-bagged the produce and the Lutheran Towers staff distributed the bags as needed.

Our Response To COVID-19

Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)-

Residents receive monthly commodity food boxes (CSFP). The boxes are provided with federal funding and aimed at supplementing the monthly food supply for low-income seniors. Lutheran Towers current monthly allotment is 40 CSFP boxes. This program distribution is approximately 1,200 lbs. monthly.

Second Helpings Food Reclamation Program –

Lutheran Towers partnered with Second Helpings Atlanta to continue offering a diverse food program to the residents. In partnership with, this new strategic partner, food reclamation program, in 2020, we distributed approximately 1,000 lbs.

Resident Engagement

Monthly Newsletter & Weekly Activity Books-

Lutheran Towers continues to distribute the Tower Talk newsletter to residents to communicate to them the activities and programs for the month. Due to the need to engage in social distancing, our Life Enrichment Coordinator created a weekly activity book in addition to the monthly newsletter a to reduce the isolation and boredom associated with COVID-19 social distancing and self-quarantine. These weekly activity books promoted brain health through cross word puzzles, trivia questions, adult coloring pages, and so much more.

Virtual Programming -

Lutheran Towers was able to get creative and offer Virtual Bingo, Virtual Zumba, Virtual Art Class, Weekly Virtual Fitness classes and weekly virtual tea and conversations (24 average participants).

Technology Outreach-

We utilized technology to engage residents and keep them informed during the pandemic. Vital information was shared on our in-house digital signage boards on each floor as well as calls and text messages sent out via our Voice Friend communication program. Lutheran Towers is now working to enhance the use of technology with distribution of 30 iPads and an in-house cable TV channel.

Weekly Essential Grocery Trips -


Essential grocery trips took place two days per week to Kroger and Publix. These trips were conducted during the senior/vulnerable population hours designated by each store. The Lutheran Towers van was cleaned and sanitized before and after all trips. While on trips residents wore masks and practiced social distancing while on the van. In addition, the van was cleaned and sanitized by staff while residents shopped.



OUR HISTORY



1960'S A DREAM COME TRUE

Senior Pastor of Lutheran Church of the Redeemer, the late Reverend Dr. Robert E. Lee's dream to provide safe, decent, and affordable housing for low- and moderateincome seniors in the Midtown Atlanta, Georgia became a reality.

1969

In June, The R.L.C Corporation (doing business as Lutheran Towers) was established and designated the first members of its, governing body, board of directors.

1970'S



On July 27th Redeemer congregation transferred ownership of its property located at 727 Juniper Street to the R.L.C Corporation, which led to the partnership with U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development under Section 2020/236, The property that became 727 Juniper Street (also known as Lutheran Towers) was assembled from the following pieces of Property: A Redeemer-owned day school/nursery: an old Tudor home of a local physician; and an old wooden "termite-infested" former church.sing for low- and moderate-income seniors in the Midtown Atlanta, Georgia became a reality.

1971

On April 25th, Lutheran Towers' groundbreaking took place.



1972

For the first 32 years, the following individuals served as Lutheran Towers' Executive Director: Charles Rizzo, Tom Leppenan, and Mark Lee (son of the founder, Dr. Robert E. Lee).



In April, Lutheran Towers' first residents moved into our building. The dedication of our apartment building took place on October 8, 1972.

2000'S



The 2000's marked the era of transformation for Lutheran Towers, as building renovation occurred routinely, new collaborations were established, and the service offerings to residents expanded.ran Towers) was assembled from the following pieces of Property: A Redeemer-owned day school/nursery: an old Tudor home of a local physician; and an old wooden "termite-infested" former church.sing for low- and moderate-income seniors in the Midtown Atlanta, Georgia became a reality.



In May, as a continued effort to focus on the quality of life for our residents, we held our first Health Fair. The forty (40) health related vendors included medical supply companies, home health care, and associations such as the American Cancer Society. In addition, the Atlanta Medical Center and Grady Hospital screened our residents for high blood pressure, cholesterol, and sugar. This event was our entry into the area hosting activities to enhance our residents' health and wellbeing.

2004

G. David Sprowl, MPA became Lutheran Towers fourth Executive Director.

Lutheran Towers completed the first phase of the hallway renovations which included replacing the wallpaper, carpet and adding fresh paint to five floors.

Thanks to the generous donations from Redeemer Lutheran Church members and others in the community, Lutheran Towers was able to furnish the elevator lobbies on all fourteen residential floors. The furnishings include two chairs, a console, a mirror, and a floral arrangement. The results were well-received and appreciated by the residents.



Lifeline to a Church That Cares

2005

A Development Committee was created to oversee and direct all fundraising activities. Phase I of the hallway renovations was completed. Lutheran Towers began the renovation of Lee Hall and the adjacent garden. The central feature of the new garden was the installation of a beautiful fountain in memory of Pastor Robert E. Lee, the founder of Lutheran Towers.

OUR HISTORY

2006

Lutheran Towers completed the renovation of Lee Hall, the garden, the kitchen, and adjacent storage room. Both phase II and phase III of the hallway renovations were completed.



The 35th Anniversary of the groundbreaking of Lutheran Towers was celebrated with a luncheon hosted by the Board of Directors in honor of the founding board members.

The Board of Directors in conjunction with the Development Committee launched an Annual Fund.



2011

To continue meeting our mission and preparing for the future, Lutheran Towers successfully refinanced its mortgage. The proceeds were used to begin the renovation of the bathrooms and kitchens in each of the resident apartments.



Lutheran Towers conducted a resident needs assessment which highlighted that due to their extremely low retirement incomes that over 90% of Lutheran Towers' residents are food insecure which means that they exhaust their food and funds to purchase food before the month's end.

Established a Food Reclamation Program in partnership with Redeemer Lutheran Church which affords Lutheran Towers an opportunity to conduct a free weekly food market for our residents.

2019

We look to our future by appreciating and building upon our past. These actions allow the building to remain a desirable housing option for lower-income seniors in the Midtown area.

In response to the findings of the 2018 Residents' Needs Assessment, Lutheran Towers launched several free feeding programs for our residents.

Established Project Hope Older People Eat Healthier (HOPE) which is a monthly free fruit and vegetable program.

Established Free Thanksgiving and Christmas Grocery-Giveaway for Residents.

1st Floor Renovation Completed: Fellowship Hall/Lee Hall, Bistro, Commercial Kitchen, and garden.

Established partnership with Atlanta Community Food Bank to create a free food pantry on-site for our residents.

Established Lutheran Towers' Food Pantry.

Established Free Thanksgiving Day Brunch for Residents.







2020

At the outset of the COVID-19 pandemic, established partnerships with Fulton Community Senior Services and Redeemer Lutheran Church to launch an on-site free Monday through Friday lunch program for 65 of our most vulnerable residents.

Launched virtual programs

Installed WI-FI throughout the building to give residents free Internet access.

Began renovating the residential hallways on all 15 floors of the building for the first time in 40 years.

Renovated the entire basement
