# **Upon This Rock**

"Everyone who comes to me and hears my words and acts on them, I will show you what they are like: they are like a man building a house, who dug deeply and laid the foundation on rock; when a flood arose, the river burst against that house but could not shake it, because it had been well built."

- Luke 6:47-49

These words of Jesus ground the promise at the heart of this year's *Upon This Rock* annual giving campaign. In a world that often feels unsteady and uncertain, Jesus reminds us that when we build our lives on the foundation of his grace and guidance, we cannot be shaken.

# Fall Adult Formation Series: Practicing Spiritual Practices

This fall, our Adult Formation Series invites us to explore what it means to build our lives on Christ's sure foundation. From October 5 through November 2 (with a break for the Parish Picnic on October 26), we will gather Sundays at 9:30 a.m. in the Sunshine Room to engage in spiritual practices that root us in God's presence.

Each week offers a chance to explore, reflect on, and embody a practice that opens us to Christ—the Rock of our salvation.

#### **October 5: Creating Prayer Rocks**

We begin the series with a hands-on intergenerational gathering. After starting in classrooms, the whole parish will come together in Ware Hall to create prayer rocks—tangible reminders of Christ as our firm foundation.

Children and adults alike will:

- Hold and decorate rocks with prayerful intentions
- Reflect on Luke 6:47-49
- Place their rocks around the church as visible signs of God's presence

This creative act will invite us to reflect on what it truly means to build a life that can withstand the storms of life.

#### October 12: Exploring the Daily Office

Rooted in ancient monastic tradition, the Daily Office offers a rhythm of prayer throughout the day—Morning Prayer, Noonday Prayer, Evening Prayer, and Compline.

This session will explore:

- The structure and purpose of the Daily Office
- How it grounds us amid modern busyness
- Ways to integrate it into daily life using the Book of Common Prayer

Through these prayers, we remember that every hour belongs to God.



#### October 19: Practicing the Examen

This week, we'll engage in the Examen, a reflective practice developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola. The Examen helps us prayerfully review our day with spiritual attentiveness.

We will ask:

- Where did I sense God's presence today?
- Where did I feel gratitude?
- What moments felt heavy?

The Examen is not about judgment—it's about grace. It allows us to see ourselves and our days through God's loving gaze, and to become more open to the Spirit's movement.

#### November 2: Engaging Scripture with Lectio Divina

In our final session, we will explore Lectio Divina, a contemplative way of reading Scripture that invites not just understanding, but intimacy with God.

Through this practice, we will:

- Read Scripture slowly and prayerfully
- Listen for the word or phrase that the Spirit highlights
- Rest in the presence of God's living Word

Lectio Divina reminds us that the Bible is not just something we read—it's a way God speaks directly into our lives.

#### **Practices That Gound Us in Faith**

Taken together, these spiritual practices are not rules or checklists. They are holy habits—stepping stones that lead us deeper into Christ, our Rock and Redeemer.

Just as your pledges and gifts sustain the mission and ministry of Ascension, these practices sustain our lives as disciples. They help us remain steady, grounded, and secure—even when storms arise.

#### A Season of Giving and Growing

As we give, pray, and practice together this season, may we discover anew the joy of standing firm upon the Rock that will never fail us. Let this be a time of growing deeper—together—as a parish family rooted in the love and grace of Jesus Christ.

# **Upon This Rock- Annual Giving Campaign**



The theme of this year's giving campaign is called "Upon This Rock" The campaign name is inspired by Matthew 16:18 which says, "Upon this rock I will build my church. And the gates of Hades will not prevail against it."

The campaign will run from **Sunday, October 5th thru Sunday, November 2nd**. On October 5th, **campaign packets will be available** for pick up in the Terrill Foyer. If you do not pick up your packet by October 12th, we will mail one to your home. Included in the campaign packet is a **pledge card** which we hope you'll turn in by **Celebration Sunday, November 2nd**.

Instead of gathering on Wednesdays during the campaign to reflect on the theme, we are holding **Peer gatherings** throughout the month of October. And, as indicated in the feature article, we will **explore spiritual practices** that help ground us in the faith of Christ.

# **Financial Notes**

As of the end of August 2025, we are operating with a slight deficit. However, this is significantly smaller than the deficit we had budgeted for by this point in the year. We have stayed "ahead" of budget primarily because spending during the first eight months has been lower than anticipated. We do expect some expenses to increase in the coming months as we address deferred maintenance on our buildings and grounds. In addition, budgeted funds for our community outreach partners are not disbursed until December. Thank you, as always, for your continued financial support. Your generosity allows us to fund a budget that helps us live into our vision: to make Christ known by our love for all.

# Outreach Programs at Ascension

Fall programming at Ascension has fully returned, which means all our Outreach ministries are in full swing. If you are new to Ascension or if you are looking for new things get involved with, I encourage you to consider one (or more!) of our outreach initiatives. Weekly, our **Abbey ministry** passes out over 40 brown-bag lunches to people experiencing food insecurity in the Avondale area. We are looking for people who can pack lunches on Wednesday and for people who can deliver them on Thursday mornings in Avondale (you can even sign up for both!). Our **Backpack Program** packs and delivers meals for children in the Vestavia Hills school system who are on free or reduced-cost lunches. These items are packed during the week and delivered on Thursdays to Vestavia East, Cahaba Heights, and Dolly Ridge elementary schools. On a monthly basis, Ascension prepares and serves dinner to the residents of **First Light**, a shelter for women and children in downtown Birmingham. We need volunteers for both the cooking and serving teams. This is a great ministry for families to participate in together. You can also help residents in need by bringing supplies for our monthly **Giving Hope** drive. The items we collect change monthly and will be collected in the black bin in the foyer.

In addition to our ongoing initiatives, we also offer a range of projects to join throughout the year. This spring, we participated in a **Habitat for Humanity** build with other local Episcopal Churches. This fall, we will help deliver Thanksgiving meals to families in need in the Birmingham area through **Christian Service Mission**. And in January, we will participate in a **parish-wide outreach day** over MLK weekend. More information on both events will be coming soon. To get involved in any of these programs or if you would like help finding the right outreach opportunity for you and your family, please reach out to me. I would love to connect you with the ministries that could use your gifts and talents.

#### **Children and Youth Ministries**

October 26: Join us at Wald Park for our annual picnic—a wonderful time for fellowship and fun for all ages!

#### Signs of a Healthy Parish

All this activity points to one thing: Ascension is a healthy and growing parish. One way we measure this is through our Newcomer Coffees, which are typically held quarterly. At our most recent gathering, we welcomed thirteen new attendees — a remarkable sign of vitality and growth!

## Growth: A Gift and a Challenge

Parish growth is a tremendous blessing, but it also presents new challenges — especially when it comes to planning for space and resources. Our Vestry is actively reviewing our facility needs, both for the short term and the long haul. We want to ensure that we can comfortably and effectively host meetings, classes, and events. Currently, we're exploring ways to improve spaces like the Sunshine Room, which offers a cozy, intimate setting — but with limited capacity. For larger gatherings, Ware Hall is the next option. Though beautiful, its acoustics present challenges. The echoing in the room makes it difficult to hear, and traditional sound amplification doesn't help. In response, we'll soon begin installing acoustic panels to make Ware Hall more voice–friendly. This is very much a work in progress, and we appreciate your patience and feedback along the way.

#### **Looking Ahead: Long-Term Facility Planning**

Looking further into the future, we're beginning to envision how we can best use — and potentially expand — our facilities to meet the needs of a growing parish. This initiative is still in the early stages, and we're committed to a collaborative and inclusive process. Your input will be an essential part of this ongoing conversation, so please stay tuned for more updates.

#### In Closing

This is such an exciting time at Ascension. There is so much energy, growth, and potential in our midst. I look forward to continuing these conversations with you — and to discovering together all the ways God is calling us forward as a parish.
