20th century reformed theologian, Karl Barth, once wrote, "No one can be a Christian. They can only become one again and again." # Formed In Wonder

### **Christian Education**

#### Children's Ministries

- **Children's Chapel** Children 3k to 3rd grade are invited to attend a special children's chapel program in the Godly Play room during the 10:30 service. Children return at the peace.
- Club 345 Club 345 is formation and fellowship for 3rd-5th graders. This class uses the Be Bold curriculum to help pre-teens explore their faith through thoughtful and supportive discussions.
- Godly Play Godly Play is for ages 4 years old through 3rd grade, utilizing Montessori principles to invite children into the language of their faith. Children hear lessons of sacred stories, parables, and liturgical action and will have an opportunity to respond to the lesson through play and crafts.

### Youth Ministries

- **Confirmation** Classes are held annually for youth who wish to be confirmed in the Episcopal Church. Mentors, already confirmed adults in the parish, help our youth explore their faith.
- EYC Fellowship and outreach opportunities are offered for our middle and high students.
- Youth Christian Education For youth in 6th-12th grades, this class meets from 9:30-10:15 on Sunday mornings.

### **Adult Formation Offerings**

- **Adult Formation** Classes for adults to deepen and explore their faith life meet Sunday mornings from 9:30-10:15. Topics change seasonally.
- Ascension Wellness Center The Ascension Wellness Center provides holistic programs that nourish the heart, soul, strength, and mind. We offer small group series, both in-person and virtual, and wellness content across a variety of topics.
- Cursillo Cursillo is a renewal movement that begins with a three—day weekend at Camp McDowell focused on the love of God and the Christian life. The Cursillo community at Ascension meets regularly for small group discussions and fellowship.
- Education for Ministry (EfM) EfM is a four-year course of study in theology and reflection. Topics include Church history, liturgy, and the Bible. EfM meets weekly.
- Episcopal 101 Once per year, in coordination with the bishop's visit, Ascension offers a class on the fundamentals of the Episcopal Church. Anyone is invited to join. Those seeking to be confirmed, reaffirmed, or received into the Episcopal Church are required to attend.

### **Backpack Ministry**

The goal of the Backpack Ministry is to help alleviate child hunger in Vestavia Hills by providing food for children on weekends when other resources are not available. Bags are packed at the church and distributed to schools.

### First Light Ministry

Ascension provides dinner for women and children living at First Light Shelter. Volunteers from Ascension prepare meals and serve them at First Light.

### **Giving Hope Ministry**

Each month, Ascension features a ministry supported by our parish and designates items to be donated to that ministry. Donations are collected at the church.

### The Abbey Ministry

The Abbey provides a sack lunch each week for those in need. Volunteers from Ascension prepare bagged lunches on Wednesdays and distribute them in Avondale on Thursdays each week.

### **Connections Ministries**

Ascension is a growing, thriving parish. There are several ways for you to meet and assist our newcomers:

- Greeters Greeters serve on Sunday mornings by identifying and welcoming visitors.
- Newcomer Coffees Ascension offers newcomer coffees throughout the year to welcome visitors and provide them with additional information about the parish.

### Worship Ministries

### **Acolytes**

Children and youth ages 3rd grade and older, as well as adults, are invited to serve as acolytes. Acolytes serve as worship leaders throughout the service by carrying the crosses and torches in procession, and by supporting other ministers in the service.

#### Altar Guild

Altar Guild members help prepare for services and maintain and care for the sacred vessels, altar linens, candles, and hangings.

#### AV Guild

AV Guild members help live-stream services and manage technology for worship.

#### Choir

Ascension's Choir provides musical leadership during services and special occasions. Our Sunday morning choir is open to all ages from middle school up.

### **Eucharist Ministers/Lectors**

EMs/Lectors assist in worship by reading lessons, psalms, and prayers, and by administering the chalice during communion.
