The vestry is the legal representative of the parish with regard to all matters pertaining to its corporate property. At Ascension, the vestry is comprised of 12 parishioners who each serve a three-year term. Vestry members are elected at the annual parish meeting. The presiding officer of the vestry is the rector. There are usually two wardens. The senior warden leads the parish between rectors and is a support person for the rector. The junior warden often has responsibility for church property and buildings. A treasurer and a secretary or clerk may be chosen. These officers may or may not be vestry members. The basic responsibilities of the vestry are to help define and articulate the mission of the congregation; to support the church's mission by word and deed; to select the rector; to ensure effective organization and planning; and to manage resources and finances.

Rector's Report

Dear Friends.

On May 27th of next year, I will have completed 15 years of ordained ministry in the Episcopal Church. Six of those years will have been spent serving as your rector. During that time, I have grown in my commitment to following the way of Jesus, and I have seen you grow, as well. The fruit of this growth is a parish community that has increased its resolve to make Christ known by our love for all. Even in a part of the world that is saturated with churches, we



have been able to share the good news of Jesus and his kingdom with those who might not have otherwise heard this life changing message. I hope the pages that follow help highlight how God is using Ascension to proclaim the gospel in both word and deed.

Due to our numerical growth, Ascension is a church transitioning from one leadership model to another. In technical terms, we are transitioning from a pastoral sized congregation to a program sized congregation. In order to make this transition, we've had to adjust the leadership structure so that we don't remain stuck. The fundamental transition sees the work of the rector multiplied through additional clergy and staff. This growth, of course, comes with its fair share of growing pains. Thank you for being patient with us as we figure out how to live into this new system.

Given my ministry milestone and the current state of the parish, it seems natural that I take a sabbatical during the summer of 2024. Not only do I need time for rest and renewal, the parish needs time to realize that the rector does not need to be at the center of every decision in a program sized parish. In addition to our Associate Rector, God is raising up strong leaders at Ascension, and I believe my scheduled and planned absence will help these leaders and this parish grow in ways that aren't possible with me around.

In addition, my wife Jamie, as well as our two children, Mary Katherine and John, also need a sabbatical. They've given so much to make this life work. I couldn't do what I do without their love and support. So, I look forward to connecting with my family in new ways over the sabbatical, as well as creating positive family memories for my children to hold onto for the rest of their lives. I hope to connect to ancestral roots both in the United States and in the United Kingdom. I also hope to spend time re-discovering my first passion, which is the game of golf.





Annual Giving Report



As of December 2, we have received 13 new pledging cards, which account for \$55,510 in new pledged income. We also saw 38 households increase their pledge, which represent an increase of \$41,130. Accounting for those who moved, died, or reduced their pledge, we are forecasting a net increase of \$79,030 of available pledge dollars to budget for in 2024. This net increase assumes all available pledging units from last year will return a card again for 2024 with the same total pledge. 12 pledging units from last year remain outstanding. To date, we've received 102 pledge cards totaling nearly \$615,000. In order to fulfill our budget needs in 2024, the Vestry hopes to reach at least \$650,000 in pledged income. Every gift matters!

Since 2019, our **pledged income has increased by 72**% and the number of **pledge cards has increased by 63**%. During that same period, the Episcopal Church in Alabama, as a whole, saw a 5% increase in pledged income. The Episcopal Church worldwide saw an increase of less than 1% in pledged income during that same time period.













Report from the Senior Warden Anna Colvin

The Vestry is happy to report 2023 has been a year of growth for our parish in many ways. We have seen our staff grow, our church family grow, and our ministries grow. We were thrilled to have The Reverend Emily Collette join our parish as associate rector in May. We also welcomed Callahan Thompson, Director of Youth Ministries in August as well as our new Communications Director, Shannon George. The parish has seen new families join the church this year and we look forward to continuing to invite, welcome, and connect more in 2024.

As our ministries grow, so do our volunteer opportunities. The vestry worked alongside staff to create "Job Descriptions" for every volunteer opportunity to make it easy for anyone to step in and volunteer where they feel their gifts will be best utilized. Volunteers are a vital part of all of our ministries, and we want to continue to encourage all to take part. As a vestry, one of our goals is to always be looking through the lens of making Christ known by our love for all. We are grateful for this opportunity to serve and we look forward to all 2024 has to bring.

Report from the Junior Warden Susan Phillips

An aging campus, deferred maintenance, and new ministry needs have led to a busy year on our buildings and grounds.

- 1) Construction: completion of McDowell Suite and offices.
- 2) Roofing: ongoing leak repairs. Replacement inevitable. Diagram updated.
- 3) Security: nursery and school children moved behind locked doors during school hours.
- 4) HVAC: maintenance and replacement. Excellent updated diagram/photos of current units. Should be aware of inevitable replacement.
- 5) Elevator: updated the void maintenance certificate. Replaced lighting. Yearly update required.
- 6) Gutters: Replacement of front section done. Routine cleaning needed. Needs yearly inspection.
- 7) Fire Alarm: connected to the Fire Department. Knox box placed. Inspection yearly.
- 8) Kitchen: ice machine cleaned. Ice machine/frig/freezer coils need yearly cleaning.
- 9) Termites: minimal damage repaired. Check yearly.
- 10) Light bulbs: replaced as needed. Multiple ballasts replaced throughout the building.
- 11) Grounds: Parish workday twice a year. Routine Maintenance. Supervision of lawn company.
- 12) Memorial Committee: activated twice this year.
- 13) Water Heater: annual inspection.
- 14) AED Machine: annual maintenance.
- 15) Allen House: maintenance PRN.







Report from the Finance Chair Martin Hoerner

The finance committee was busy in 2023 with activities that can be summarized in three critical areas: annual audit, retirement of line of credit, and formation of investment committee.

The annual audit was conducted with Tom Damman of Koexco in August. Some of the highlights of Tom's findings were suggesting that the vestry review and approve any automatic payments (auto draft, electronic accounts payable), annual approval or rector and associate rector housing allowance, and oversight/financial reporting for AEDS (formerly AEK). These audit findings were presented to the vestry at the October meeting upon receipt of the audit report. The audit committee was also presented with these findings and acknowledged with signature.

In June, Len Skelton and Martin Hoerner were presented with information that the church's outstanding letter of credit rate would expire on June 30th. The church had previously entered into a letter of credit agreement with Iberia bank that had a fixed rate of 3.5%. First Horizon (which acquired Iberia) indicated that the rate would move to prime plus 5% which meant a total rate of 13.5% on our current balance (roughly 130k in June). We were granted an extension until September 30th under the old rate while we attempted to secure something more competitive.

Conversations with other lenders did not result in any competitive offers; even prime plus zero would have resulted in a 8.5% rate. This rate increase significantly added to the church's monthly debt payment which comes out of the general fund, and it would increase interest on future draws against the LOC, which is primarily done in low revenue months.

It was decided that the church would leverage its own assets in the form of the Terrill Fund to pay off the LOC and set up a line of credit to support cash flow when needed. In this model, the Terrill Fund acts as the lender and the church as the borrower, this allows us to use a competitive interest rate for both the retirement of the LOC and establishment of the cash flow LOC. It also allows the Terrill Fund to be paid back with interest (at a better rate than previous investments were earning), and potentially grow those payment into a nest egg the church will have down the road. The vestry committed to paying back the loan over a 15 year period which will result in approximately \$40,000 in interest income and additional investment income upon selection of a fund for payments to be made into in the form or share purchases. The LOC to support cash flow will also function in the same manner, with a portion of the Terrill Fund set aside in a money market account to draw against in low income months. The monthly payment will be made using the average daily balance method for draws and payments during the calendar month.

This leads to our third big item of the year, the formation of a finance committee. This committee consists of clergy, vestry and lay persons with experience in finance, banking and investments. The members are Jack Alvey, Len Skelton, Martin Hoerner, Tom Ogiba, Christopher Lambert, Meredith Lees, Colleen Baird and Vaughn Sparks. The first quarterly committee meeting was held on November 29th.

- Rector's Bible Study About 8 members study the upcoming gospel lesson on weekly basis.

Youth Formation (Callahan Thompson, Director)

In May, we thanked AG Passey and Erin McAdams for serving as our youth ministers for the previous 18 months. They were an integral part of the Renovation Team led by Ministry Architects. In August, we hired a new youth minister Callahan Thompson, who is working from the plan developed by the Renovation Team.

"We have had a fantastic start to the year with EYC! Starting off the year we had a kick off cookout with over a dozen youth in attendance. Moving into the year we have had on average 2-8 youth attending Sunday school on Sunday mornings. In October, we met for our service project where we packed bags for our backpack ministry. In November, we wrote cards for parishioners who aren't able to make it into in person church and had great attendance for acolyte training. We will meet in December for a festive Christmas party! We have steadily grown into and small but mighty group. As we move into this upcoming year, we hope to continue to bring in more youth!" - Callahan Thompson

Outreach & Evangelism Team Report

Highlights

- Continued support for the Weekend Backpack Program that serves students at Vestavia Hills East, Dolly Ridge, and Cahaba Heights elementary schools each week. At present, 30 students are recipients of these food packs. Alex Roberts will lead this program going forward into 2024.
- The annual Food Truck Festival for 2023 was another great success. While proceeds from this event support the Outreach Committee's feeding ministries, we have plans to make it even better in 2024.
- Church of the Ascension hosted the February edition of the Episcopal Place Birthday Party this year in honor of residents celebrating birthdays that month. Our group hosted around 40 residents and celebrated 14 resident birthdays. Kelly Burke will be the coordinator for the 2024 birthday party.
- The Abbey food distribution ministry supporting the hungry and unhoused community in the Avondale neighborhood of Birmingham continues to move forward. Many thanks to the late John Wilson for being so dedicated to this ministry. His presence has and will continue to be sorely missed. Ross Parker will lead this ministry program moving into 2024.
- Every month, members of the congregation prepare and serve a hot meal to the women and children at First Light Shelter. Thanks to Caralyn McDaniel, who continues to lead this ministry.
- Thanks to the congregation for their continued support of our monthly Giving Hope ministry collection program. Information on monthly proceeds and bins for this ministry can be found in Terrill Foyer. Thanks to Deborah Hooper for leading this ministry.
- Our Newcomer ministries, including our Sunday morning Greeters, a quarterly Newcomer Coffee, and an annual Newcomer dinner, continue to create community for visitors and new individuals and families thinking of joining our parish family. Thanks to Kelly Burke, Katy Mac Dillon and, Jean Marie Banks for leading these ministries.
- In honor and memory of Outreach Committee titan John Wilson, the Ascension vestry approved the creation of a memorial fund, The John Wilson Memorial Fund, that will be used exclusively for feeding ministries. Proceeds from the annual bake sale will go towards this new fund.

Outreach and Evangelism continues to be a primary mission at Church of the Ascension as we seek to make Christ known by our love for all. With continued support for these vital ministries from our dedicated congregation and Outreach Committee members, we have plans to make 2024 an even more successful year for community outreach. We look to expand the weekend backpack program to possibly cover another local school, and have been in conversation with other area churches about possibly expanding this to cover all Vestavia middle schools and high school, as well. We look forward to continuing and growing these ministries and opportunities as we move into 2024 together as a parish family.

Parish Life Team Report

Highlights:

The Parish Life team is proud to report that this has been a successful year at Ascension. We kicked off 2023 with the Parish Retreat last January with 94 in attendance. We hosted 6 Ascension Sunday Lunches where our church family gathers to enjoy food & fellowship following church. Formerly called the 2nd Sunday Covered-Dish, this time-honored tradition is made possible by assorted groups within our church family who graciously host a meal. (Thank you to all who made this possible!)

Ongoing Parish Life activities have included Men's Fireside Chats, Sunday Socials, Sunday Breakfasts (a popular treat!), a summer outing to the Birmingham Baron's Game, Rally Day, the annual Parish Picnic sponsored by the Stewardship Committee, and much more! We also continued Foyer Groups this year because of last year's success with 4 groups of 8–10 meeting. Foyer Groups are small groups of parishioners from all generations who meet regularly for a meal between September and May.

We also added a couple new ways for the parish to gather in fellowship. Our Supper Clubs were revamped and are now called Peer Groups. These Peer Groups are seperated by "piers" according to age: Pier 23 (20s/30s), Pier 34 (30s/40s), Pier 45 (40s/50s), Pier 60 (60+). In addition, two Holy Hikes were hosted at Red Mountain Park where parishioners gathered for a leisurely hike. We plan to continue these hikes in the spring when the weather improves. 12 men in the congregation gathered in November at Camp McDowell for their first retreat. The plan is to have another in 2024.

Finally, plans are underway to create a way for women to come together for fellowship and/or study. Please contact The Rev. Emily Collette if you'd like to be a part of this planning process.
