6. Issue Position Statements

HEALTHCARE

Julie's Position

Healthcare should be affordable and available to every family, regardless of where they live. Southern Illinois has too many communities losing hospitals, doctors, maternity care, and mental health services. Congress should strengthen, not weaken, our healthcare system.

Julie Supports:

- Protecting Medicare.
- Strengthening Medicaid for seniors, children, people with disabilities, and rural families.
- Lowering prescription drug costs.
- Expanding access to mental health services.
- Protecting coverage for people with pre-existing conditions.
- Supporting rural hospitals and community health clinics.
- Continuing efforts toward affordable, universal healthcare.

Healthcare decisions should be based on patients, not politics.

Julie believes healthcare should be expanded and made more affordable. Congressman Mike Bost voted for the One Big Beautiful Bill Act, which included nearly \$1 trillion in Medicaid cuts, new work and reporting requirements, more frequent eligibility checks, and changes projected to cause millions of Americans to lose health coverage over the next decade. Julie opposes those cuts because she believes they will hit rural hospitals, working families, seniors, people with disabilities, and children across Southern Illinois the hardest.

VETERANS

Julie's Position

As an Air Force veteran, Julie believes America has an obligation to its veterans: When someone serves our country, our country keeps its promise to them.

Julie Supports:

- Fully funding VA healthcare.
- Protecting veterans' earned disability benefits.
- Reducing wait times.
- Expanding mental health services.
- Addressing PTSD, toxic exposure, and military sexual trauma.
- Ending veteran homelessness.
- Making VA services easier—not harder—to access.

Julie believes supporting veterans means protecting the benefits they have already earned and listening to the organizations that represent them. As an Air Force veteran, she opposes using disability compensation to fund other veterans' programs and believes veterans service organizations should have a seat at the table when Congress considers changes to VA benefits.

VETERANS (CONT.)

Mike Bost sponsored the **Take Care of America's Veterans Act**, legislation opposed by the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) because it would finance new veterans' programs in part by changing disability compensation for some future veterans with conditions such as tinnitus and sleep apnea. After the VFW publicly campaigned against the proposal, Bost joined a request for the Department of Veterans Affairs to investigate the organization over its advocacy.

Bost also voted for the House version of the **FY2027 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA)**, which authorizes approximately **\$1.15 trillion** in defense spending, expands defense cooperation with Israel, and supports continued military operations related to Iran.

Julie believes America can maintain a strong national defense and military autonomy while keeping its promises to veterans at home. She supports fully funding veterans' healthcare and earned benefits without asking one generation of veterans to bear the cost of new priorities.

AFFORDABILITY & THE ECONOMY

Julie's Position

Working families need lower costs, not more political fights. Julie believes Congress should focus on making everyday life more affordable.

Julie Supports:

- Lower grocery prices.
- Lower healthcare costs.
- Protecting Social Security and Medicare.
- Creating good-paying jobs.
- Investing in infrastructure.
- Supporting small businesses.
- Helping family farms succeed.

Trade

Julie supports fair trade that protects American workers while recognizing that broad tariffs can increase prices for consumers and businesses if not carefully targeted. Families shouldn't have to choose between paying for groceries, medicine, or utilities.

Congressman Mike Bost repeatedly supported procedural votes allowing broad tariff policies to continue while limiting congressional review and backed legislation that shifted benefits toward higher-income households while reducing assistance for lower-income families.
