ROOM 8 CHEMICAL SCIENCE

This term in our chemical science unit, students explored the cause-and-effect relationship of different solids, liquids and gases and their changing form. Students engaged in activities around how changes in state from solid to liquid and liquid to solid can be caused by adding or removing heat. They observed the interaction of bi-carb soda with vinegar to create a gas that inflates balloons and observed solids change into liquids in experiments, such as chocolate being melted with heat from a hair dryer. Students also chose from a variety of liquids such as water, oil, honey, tomato sauce, and milk and experimented what would be frozen after one hour, 2 hours and 24 hours. We had so much fun with these experiments this term!





PRESCHOOL CHEMICAL SCIENCE

Preschool has been investigating chemical reactions through science experiments. We have made coloured volcanoes, clouds with blue rain, inflated balloons with bi-carb soda and vinegar, and explored melting ice. We have also been learning the terms solid, liquid and gas through play learning opportunities.



SUSTAINABILITY



Calvary, Darcy and Samuel from Room 7 are learning about the water cycle and how water gets heated up and becomes gas, traveling to the sky and falls down again as rain or snow. They made a water cycle in a zip lock bag to observe how rain is made.



VEGETARIAN FILO PARCELS

Method

- 1. Defrost Filo naturally (ie. leave on the bench wrapped until defrosted)
- 2. Pre-heat oven to 180 degrees
- 3. Blitz the garlic, onion, celery, sweet potato and zucchini in a food processor until diced really small
- 4. Warm a good glug of olive oil over medium heat in a frying pan
- 5. Sautee blitzed vegetables
- 6. Blitz the mushrooms and add them to the sautéed vegetables, cook and stir over medium heat for 1-2 minutes
- 7. Add in the silverbeet and cook until it wilts. You may need to add a little extra olive oil or you could even add a good splash of bone broth instead
- 8. When the silverbeet is wilted, push the mixture right over to the side of the pan, then add the pine nuts. Sitr them over the heat until they start to brown
- 9. Remove the pan from heat and mix the pine nuts through the vegetable mixture
- 10. Crumble Feta over the vegetable mix and then squeeze the lemon juice all over
- 11. Mix well but not so much that the Feta disintegrates. You still want little chunks of Feta
- 12. Melt about a tbspn of butter over medium heat, then remove
- 13. Gently lay out 1 sheet of filo and brush it with melted butter
- 14. Lay another gently over the top
- 15. Slice the filo into 3 strips
- 16. Place a heaped tbspn of the mixture on the top of one of the filo strips, then fold it over into a triangle, then fold it again the other way until the whole strip is used
- 17. Place on a lined baking tray
- 18. Repeat for the remaining mixture
- 19. Brush each one with melted butter and sprinkle with sesame seeds if using
- 20. Bake in the oven for 18-20 minutes or until golden
- 21. Allow to cool slightly on tray



Ingredients

- · 1 garlic clove
- ½ brown onion
- 1 stick celery
- 1/2 small sweet potato
- 1 small zucchini
- · 3-4 good sized mushrooms
- Bunch of silverbeet (even if it's half dead), shredded messily
- 2 tbspns pine nuts
- 100g Feta crumbled (or use a good sprinkle of Nutritional Yeast flakes if you prefer)
- Juice from half a lemon
- 8 sheets of filo pastry
- Melted Butter and olive oil (if you wish to use dairy free, replace butter with olive oil)
- Sesame seeds (optional but they look fancy)

Home Made Magnyms

Ice Cream Ideas

- · leftover smoothie bowls
- · banana nice cream (frozen bananas)
- <u>easy vanilla ice cream</u> (note it uses condensed milk so it's quite sweet)
- use this <u>homemade vanilla ice</u> cream cake recipe

Chocolate Ingredients

- · 100g coconut oil
- 50g cacao powder*
- · 3 tblspns rice malt syrup*
- 1/4 tspn vanilla powder
- · pinch of salt (this enhances the chocolate flavour)

Chocolate Method

- 1. Melt the coconut oil over low heat you do not want this to be really hot
- 2. Take the oil off the heat
- 3. Add the other ingredients and stir in until smooth
- 4. Place back over low heat, and continually stir for about 8 minutes
- 5. Pour into a sterilised jar, then store in your pantry until ready

Do you want to know how to make homemade magnums?
I decided to try my hand at these one day when Indrani had made Berry Smoothie Bowls for breakfast and there was leftovers.

I put the leftovers into these mini ice cream moulds I got from The Wholefood Collective. Once they were frozen, I made some homemade chocolate and dipped the ice creams into it. And my homemade magnums were born.

I recorded a video of me making the chocolate for the members of our Kids Health Quest Members, so have included it in here for you too.












