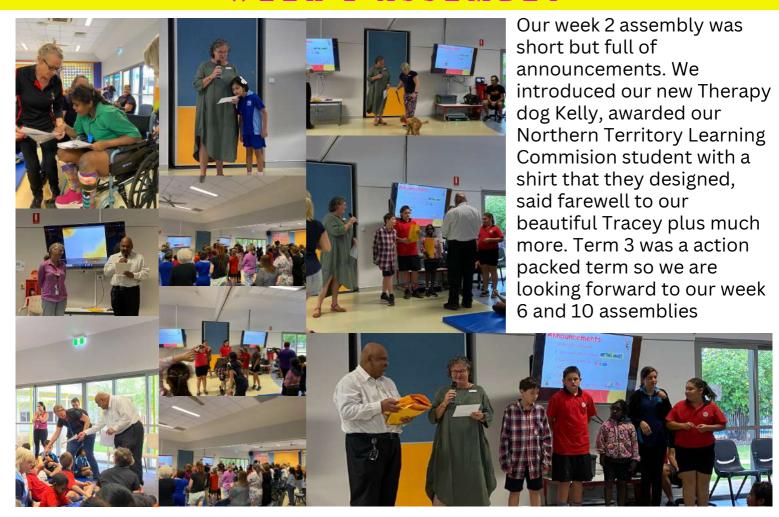


### NTLC

## HOME-MADE CHEESE SPREAD RECIPE

### **Method**

- 1. Combine both ingredients in a small saucepan
- 2. Stir over low-medium heat until the cheese melts and mixes thoroughly with the cheese
- 3. Pour into serving sized pots
- 4. Store in fridge or freezer. Please note, this does not have preservatives in them so will not last weeks on end. Best to use in 1-2 weeks.
- 5. Use this as a dipper, as a spread on sandwiches or you could even melt a little and pour over your veggies.



### Ingredients

- 100g full fat tasty cheese (buy it in the block and grate it yourself to avoid anticaking agents etc)
- 120g full fat sour cream

## MY NAUGHTY ROCKY ROAD RECIPE



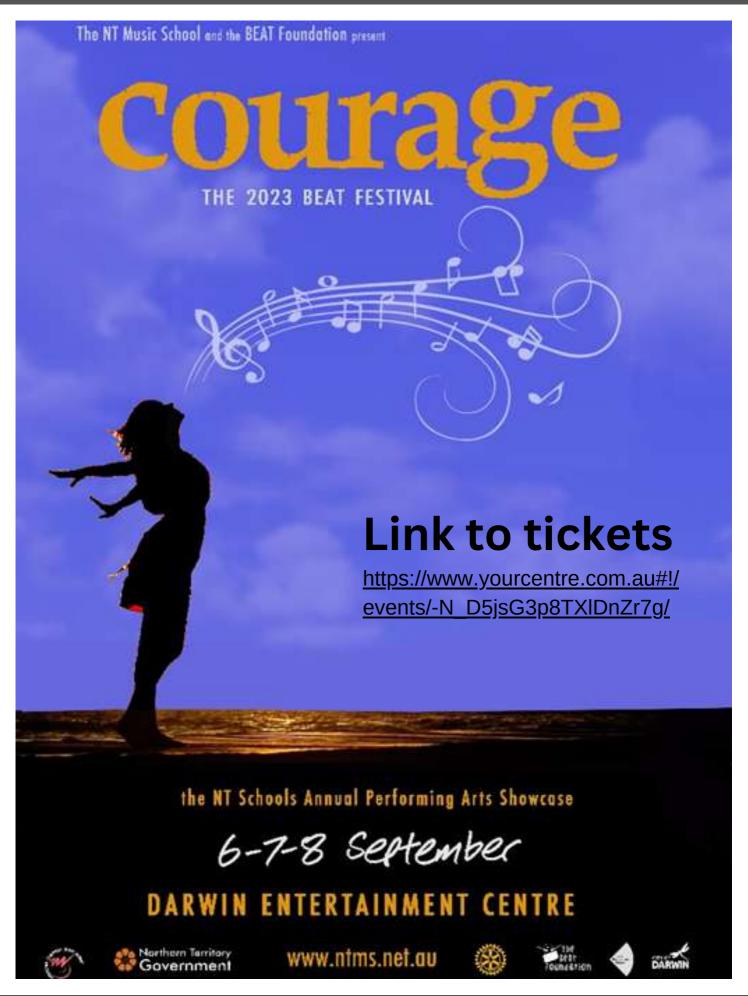
### **IIngredients**

- 400g milk chocolate, chopped (I buy the 300g cadbury milk choc blocks)
- 300g pink & white marshmallows, chopped (use kitchen scissors & cut each one into 3 or 4 pieces – keep wetting the scissors to make them less sticky)
- 400g good quality turkish delight, chopped (same technique as the marshmallows)
- 1 cup rice bubbles
- 1 cup natural macadamias, chop coarsely

- 1. Line a lightly greased 20 x
  30cm lamington tin with 2
  strips of baking paper. Cross
  them over so they extend over
  the sides of tha pan (makes it
  easier to remove it from the
  pan to cut it)
- 2. Melt chocolate (seriously I do this in a saucepan over low heat. Have never had a problem doing this Cadbury Milk Chocolate). Cool slightly.
- 3. Combine marshmallows, turkish delight, rice bubbles and macadamias in a big bowl
- 4. Work quickly, stir in the chocolate until it's all moist and coated in chocolate
- 5. Spread into the prepared tin and refrigerate
- 6. Cut into squares.

### Timely Tips on Head Lice/Nits.

Although they are not known to transmit any infectious diseases head lice can cause itch and irritation, lead to sleep disturbance and behavioral problems and sometimes skin infection. Nits are the eggs of lice attached to hair shaft near scalp-they hatch in 7-day cycles. Lice are spread by close contact.

- Schools should notify families when head lice is suspected.
- Families should check their child's hair regularly and treat any headlice effectively before sending child back to school. Please let the school know you have done the treatment.

No products available actually prevent head lice but the following routine can help reduce the risk of spread.

- Treat any visible lice/nits with occlusive product- Hedrin is recommended as safe and effective by NT Department of Health.
   Be sure to follow instructions on packaging and repeat treatment one week later.
- Treat all family members who have live head lice at the same time.
- Weekly hair and scalp checks
- Wet combing frequently with nit combs
- Avoid sharing brushes, combs, hats, pillows.
- Washing brushes and combs frequently in hot soapy water
- Keeping long hair braided or tied back.

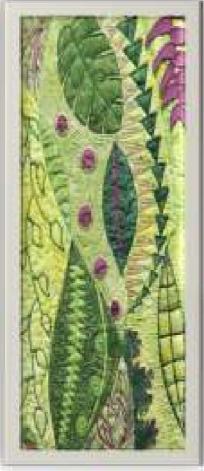
