Attendance and Late Students:

Our overall attendance this semester is 83% for the school. The school attendance team continue to monitor students with 0-60% attendance. The Department's expectation is that every student attends every day. This semester we have also been tracking lateness as this has an impact on the students' learning routines, missing critical literacy and numeracy learning as well as impacting other students who are already engaged in learning.

Looking ahead to Term 3:

In Term 3, we have census and the annual perception surveys. Our census data is important as it impacts our funding and resource allocation for the coming year, allowing us to better serve our student population. The perception survey gauges our community's satisfaction and areas for growth.

We also have the Crazy Scientist with the STEAM Science show and our Sports Day both early in the term.




Term 2 Commences on Tuesday the 15th of July



YEAR 6 CAMP




PRESCHOOL SCIENCE



Preschool has been conducting science experiments this term during our routine rainbow table activities. The students have been so engaged and amazed by these experiments. They are learning how different chemicals react with each other. We have been working with each other on these experiments. It was so successful, as all of the students waited patiently for their turn, which meant everyone could enjoy their moment when they created the chemical reaction. The two experiments we have included in the photos are: making 'Volcanoes' using bicarb soda, vinegar and food colouring, and 'Inflating a balloon' using a balloon, clear water bottle, bicarb soda and vinegar.




