COVID-19 Hasn't Stopped CareerSource Pasco Hernando from Helping Return nearly \$32 Million Back into the Local Community through Workforce Programs.

Pasco and Hernando County (Region 16), Florida- Florida's economic outlook is bright, even with the looming effects from COVID-19. The region's unemployment rate was 10.6 percent in June 2020 due to COVID-19, since then unemployment has decreased to 5.7 percent in June 2021. CareerSource Pasco Hernando's team has worked diligently alongside local partners to encourage re-employment and assistance to individuals who have been affected by COVID-19 to ensure every business and jobseeker will regain economic prosperity.

During the 2020/2021 program year, CareerSource Pasco Hernando had expended over \$4.9 million on 4 programs in order to assist the local labor market. The investment returned nearly \$32 million to the two county's region, measured by payroll gains. Each fiscal year CareerSource Pasco Hernando encourages local economic growth by expending several million dollars of federal revenue, as it provides labor exchange and training programs to the region. CareerSource Pasco Hernando conducted a data analysis and summary to gauge the labor exchange return on investment (ROI). In determining the ROI for the 2020/2021 fiscal year, a direct approach with two guidelines measured only wage gains and benefits saved, while keeping all assumptions in the conservative realm. The method led to a \$6.43 return back into the local economy for each dollar expended.

The programs have impacted the local community by creating greater local economic growth, and have provided economic stability to local residents of Pasco and Hernando counties.

CareerSource Pasco Hernando provided programs which allowed participants to gain confidence in the workforce, which ultimately leads to a successful financial future. The skills participants have gained will remain intangible, and the benefits which will affect future generations and future local economic growth will be immeasurable. Returning investment will continue to grow through the leadership and team effort of CareerSource Pasco Hernando and its customers.

Intangible Effects of the Programs

- 1. The referrals to other community services.
- 2. The value of work place skills instruction passed to peers and family.
- 3. An employed worker finding his/her next job without ever becoming unemployed.
- 4. CareerSource Pasco Hernando leadership in economic development and workforce improvement.

The programs have provided the unemployed labor force the necessary training, temporary assistance and employment services needed to gain successful employment and economic stability. Each program has established a rate of return for every program \$1.00 spent, and has impacted the community through local economic growth. Florida Prepares for Health Care Industry's Talent Needs

HERE ARE THE SKILLS AND PROFESSIONS MOST IN DEMAND

The health care and life sciences industry represents a major opportunity for Florida employers and career seekers at every level.

Florida is expected to gain 6 million residents by 2030, which means the state must add 2 million jobs to remain at 5 percent unemployment. State leaders have identified health care and life sciences as a target industry with potential for highwage jobs and overall economic impact, but the industry is evolving.

Technological advances, patient expectations and medical research have increased demand for specialized workers. Career seekers must also demonstrate proficiency in communication, customer service, organization and critical thinking.

CareerSource Pasco Hernando is leading the way in this landscape by anticipating the needs of both employers and employees.

As a starter for our discussion, here is a snapshot of the health care and life sciences industry and its talent demands based on the Florida Jobs 2030 report by the Florida Chamber of Commerce.

The basics

The health care and life sciences industry represents 8.4 percent of Florida's gross state product and about 810,000 jobs. The number of jobs is expected to grow by 9 percent through 2021.

Health care anchors this industry with the state's 700+ hospitals and other health care facilities. The sector also includes medical device manufacturing, pharmaceutical manufacturing and biotechnology.

Educational demands

Of the state's target industries, health care and life sciences has the highest number of occupations that require a postsecondary degree or credential (66 percent). Biotechnology, for example, is projected to grow by 25 percent in Florida with most of the increase in occupations that require a bachelor's degree. Nurses with bachelor's degrees also will be needed to serve the state's large and aging population.

Entry-level and medium-level employees will be in demand in supporting roles as:

- Medical assistants,
- Medical secretaries,
- Billing and posting clerks and
- Medical records and health information technicians.

Within pharmaceutical and medical device manufacturing, there are expected opportunities for:

- Machinists,
- Industrial Machinery Mechanics,
- Dental laboratory assistants and

Identified gaps

The occupations with the highest projected gaps between supply and demand in the next eight years include:

- Physical therapists,
- Medical and clinical laboratory technologists,
- Billing and posting clerks,
- Health technologists and technicians and
- Dental hygienists

Note that the majority of the occupations are not in direct patient care roles.

Talent pipeline

One of the challenges in developing talent for the future will be encouraging more students to consider occupations in demand through career counseling and awareness. But companies also have opportunities to help current employees advance through employer-led training and credentialing.

Internships, which benefit both the employer and career seeker, have long been a source of talent within the health care and life sciences industry.

Geography

Miami and Tampa have the largest number of jobs in health care and life sciences,

but the areas with the greatest projected job growth over the next five years are: The Villages (24 percent), Ocala (15 percent) and Okeechobee (15 percent), with the retirement-age population driving much of the increase. The Gainesville area, meanwhile, is an identified growth locale for medical device companies.
