Overview for Pasco and Hernando Counties (January 2023)

Our Mission: Pasco-Hernando Workforce Board enhances economic development efforts of our region by providing a well-trained, high-quality workforce which supports the success of local business and improves the quality of life.

Employer Services

- **Pasco Hernando** employers directly listed **2,500 new jobs**, which is a 27% decrease over last year.
- The **CareerSource Pasco Hernando** One Stops hosted **5** employer recruitments with **32** applicants in attendance.
- A total of **\$40,649.32** was spent on **28** customers being trained (10% decrease) through the **Customized Training (CT)** and **On the Job Training (OJT)** programs.

Job Seekers

- **1,097 people** (a **12%** increase) were assisted in finding employment.
- **9,536** people visited a **One-Stop** career center in Pasco and Hernando Counties. This is a **25%** increase from last year.
- **110** Pasco Hernando **Veterans** found **employment**. This is a **7%** decrease over last year.
- The Mobile One Stop brought services to **0** job seekers in remote locations throughout **Pasco and Hernando**. **The MOS went on a special deployment and was able to offer services to 85 individuals** that were affected by the Hurricanes.
- **255** members attended (2% increase) a monthly **Professional Placement Network (PPN)** meeting in **Pasco and Hernando** counties.

Workforce Training

- PHWB provided **Individual Training Accounts** for **85** low-income adults and dislocated workers (**70% increase**) in **Pasco and Hernando** counties.
- Through **January 31, 2023**, PHWB, 67 assisted **customers (37% decrease)** referred from Department of Children and Family Services for the **Welfare Transition Program** find employment.

Youth

- **45 Youth (25% decrease)** participating in the Youth program in **Pasco and Hernando** counties found employment or enrolled in post-secondary education.
- Since July 1, 2022, **Pasco Hernando** has had **77** youth earn a credential (7% decrease). **41** youth (52% increase) have completed their internship opportunities.

Sector Strategy

- Since **July 1, 2022**, PHWB enrolled 154 candidates in one of the seven-sector strategy fields' Healthcare, Manufacturing, Construction, Retail, Transportation/Warehouse, Finance, and Info Technology. A **161%** increase over last year
- Through **January 31, 2023**, a total of **84** (47% increase) candidates have gained employment in one of the seven sector fields.
