Message from your Executive Director



Do Prayers Help?

When any tragic event hits our nation, social media lights up with words like, "our thoughts and prayers are with you who are affected by this event." As we approach the Thanksgiving, I want you, the reader, to consider the question above. Do prayers help? From the responses I have read by many politicians, to the phrase "our prayers are with you", it appears that they either do not believe in prayer or consider it ineffective to help. One political figure posted an angry response that said, "we don't need or want your prayers, we want action." To view prayer as inaction and ineffective, is to totally misunderstand the nature of God and His involvement in this world, and especially His love for all people. That's right, God loves people!
