

ear Parishioners and Friends,

Wealth in the ancient Mediterranean world was centered around trade and therefore those cities with harbors or located on trade routes acquired massive riches. Jerusalem, some forty miles east of the nearest seaport of Joppa and about an equal distance from major caravan routes, had little hope of accruing bounty from trade. But the poem from Second Isaiah depicts a marvelously altered reality. After suffering her long exile, Jerusalem will rise up in splendor, her light reflecting God's presence with her. To her will the nations stream. Her children will return. And the riches of the sea from the West, and the caravans from the East will bring their wealth to her in praise of God (Isaiah 60:5,6).

The short reading from Ephesians captures the theme of the letter: the Gentiles are coheirs and copartners in the promise of Christ Jesus. Paul has suffered and been imprisoned because of his testimony to the Gentiles, but he is compelled. He has been commissioned by God's grace and given a revelation. Though the Letter to the Ephesians comes two decades after Paul's martyrdom, it continues to depict the Gentile mission as part of the mystery hidden for ages in God.

Today's Gospel reading from Matthew presents us with the quintessential Gentiles seeking the Jewish king. The word magos originally referred to a member of the Persian priestly class. It later took on the connotation of those who engage in Eastern philosophy and science – magicians and astrologers. Matthew's magi report that they have seen a star rising. In popular understanding, such a phenomenon signaled birth. But this star is unusual. It directs the magi to Bethlehem, where they pay homage to baby Jesus and present Him with gifts befitting a kinggold, frankincense, and myrrh. They are warned in a dream not to return to Herod, so they go home by a different route. The introduction of the "wise" men from the East bearing riches foreshadows the inclusion of the Gentiles into the developing Christian faith.

Ze starotestamentalnego wizerunku Mesjasza zechciejmy sobie zapamietac stanowczosc zatroskania Slugi Bozego o cały rodzaj ludzki, ale nade wszystko lagodnosc, dobroc Slugi Bozego: nie zlamie trzciny, nie zgasi knotka, otworzy oczy niewidomym, uwolni uwiezionych.

Szczegolnie wezmy sobie jednak do serca ten juz nowotestamentalny, najkrotszy jaki dotad napisano, zywot Jezusa Chrystusa: Przeszedl przez zycie wszystkim dobrze czyniac. I nasze zycie bedzie pozbawione wszelkiego sensu, jesli nigdy nie zadbamy o to, zeby cos dobrego drugim uczynic. Taka filozofia zycia Jezusa Chrystusa powinna nas prawdziwie zobowiazywac, jesli chcemy sie uwazac za chrzescijan czyli wyznawcow Jezusa Chrystusa.

Opis chrztu Jezusa nasuwa spostrzezenie nasepujace: Swoja misje dobroczyncy calej ludzkosci, wypelnial Jezus przez to, ze byl ciagle tak blisko Ojca Niebieskiego – to On przeciez nazwal Jezusa swoim Synem umilowanym – a rownoczesnie stal sie do nas podobny – przyjal chrzest jak wszyscy ludzie – we wszystkim oprocz grzechu.

Sacrament of Marriage: Engaged couples should call the Parish Office so that the proper preparation may be made at least one year in advance of the planned wedding date.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: One-half hour before daily Mass in the Chapel, Monday—Thursday and on Saturday from 3:00–3:45 p.m. in Church; or by appointment.

Anointing of the Sick and the Eucharist: Please call the parish office to arrange for Communion, Confession, and/or Anointing of the Sick. Parishioners who are planning surgery should contact the priest to receive the Anointing of the Sick before the surgery.

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults): All adults who are discerning readiness to join the Catholic Church and are interested in becoming Catholic or completing their sacraments should call the Parish Office. All are welcome.

Religious Education Classes (CCD): Children not attending Catholic School are educated in the faith through our Religious Education Program. Please contact the Office of Religious Education and leave a message at 594-1400 Ext. 4.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE AN "ACTIVE CATHOLIC?"

Frequently, those seeking to celebrate Marriage, have children baptized or serve as sponsors for Confirmation or Baptism request a letter stating that they are parishioners. To receive such a letter, one must be registered and in our parish records, attend Mass regularly, & be committed to a stewardship of time/talent/treasure. If you would like to become a registered parishioner, please consider filling out a registration/census form located on the table in the back of the Church.

Parish Membership: We welcome new parishioners and all who wish to join our Parish Family. To register, call or visit the Parish Office. Registration forms are available on the table in the back of the Church. Please drop the form in the collection basket or mail it to the Parish Office.
