

Dear Parishioners, and Friends,

Our first reading is taken from the book of Genesis, chapter 12. While the previous eleven chapters depicted a mythic past belonging to all humanity, chapter 12 describes the call and response of a particular people, represented by their patriarch Abram. We are not told why Abram is singled out, but God invites him to leave kith and kin and travel to a land yet to be revealed. As surety, God makes Abram a three-fold promise of land (Genesis 12:1), nationhood (Genesis 12:2), and blessing (Genesis 12:2). The promise will include numerous descendants. Despite his advancing age, Abram trusts God, who credits his faith as righteousness (Genesis 15:6).

The second reading is taken from Second Timothy, which is doubly pseudonymous, purporting to have been written by Paul to his protégé Timothy, but long after their deaths. The early second-century writer hopes to encourage his community to bear their "share of hardship for the gospel" (2Timothy 1:8), indicating either a literal or spiritual struggle among the believers. They are to be encouraged because through no effort on their part, the grace has been bestowed on them in Christ Jesus even before time began (2 Timothy 1:9). This grace has been manifested in Christ's resurrection and appearance so that immorality awaits the faithful (2Timothy).

The Gospel recounts the transfiguration of Jesus and serves three functions in the Gospel of Matthew. First, it confirms Jesus' identity (Matthew 1:23) as God's Son by means of the heavenly apparition of Moses (Israel's greatest prophet) and Elijah (the prophet whose return would signal the end-times), and by the direct statement by the voice from the cloud (Matthew 17:5). Second, it foreshadows Jesus' resurrection: "Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead" (Matthew 17:9). And finally, it reminds Matthew's community (and today's readers) not to dwell on the mountain of Transfiguration (Matthew 17:4) so as to avoid the Passion, but to "Rise, and... not be afraid" (Matthew 17:7) of what awaits true disciples.

# † Słowo Księdza Wikariusza

Drodzy Parafianie,

Rozpoczynamy dzis drugi tydzien wielkopostnego skupienia i zadumy nad sensem naszego zycia. Myslom naszym patronuje Abraham zwany ojcem naszej wiary. Skad to okreslenie? Ano stad, ze Abraham bez wahania wypelnial Boze polecenia, ze zawierzyl Bogu calkowicie.

Drodzy moi! Podczas wielkopostnych rekolekcji bedziecie nie raz słyszeli rozne pouczenia, wezwania do poprawy i nawrocenia. Odpowiadajmy na nie tak, jak Abraham odpowiedzial na Boze powolanie.

Boze wezwanie skierowane kiedys do Abrahama powtorzyl na swoj sposob Pawel w liscie do umilowanego ucznia Tymoteusza. Jest to pouczenie juz o wiele bardziej szczegolowe niz to, co słyszał Abraham. Pawel przypomina Tymoteuszowi, ze jako biskup powinien nauczac. Otoz trescia owego nauczania winno byc zbawcze dzielo Jezusa Chrystusa. Pawel jest w ogole ogromnie i przez cale swoje apostolskie zycie zatroskany o to, zeby nie zmarnowało sie nic, zadna kropła krwi, zbawczego dziela Jezusa Chrystusa.

W opisie Przemienienia Panskiego wazne jest to, ze Jezus ukazuje sie razem z Mojzeszem i Eliaszem. Ma to oznaczac ciaglosc zbawczych planow Boga, jednosc obydwu Testamentow. #### WELCOME TO THE CHURCH OF ST. HEDWIG






