

The First and Second book of Kings chronicle the rise and fall of kingship in Israel and Judah. In today's reading, Solomon is presented as the model of a good king. When invited by God to make a request, Solomon outlines the blessings he has already received. God granted Solomon the throne of his father, David, though he was neither the oldest son nor the most experienced. The kingdom is composed of a people too vast to be numbered. In light of these gifts, Solomon asks for the one thing that will enable him to hold onto both the kingdom and the people-an understanding heart so as to distinguish right from wrong.

The second reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans continues this theme of God's sovereignty and benevolence. In the ancient world, kings were thought to represent divine qualities. Paul engages the Old Testament idea that participating in the divine image is not solely the prerogative of the king, but is shared among God's chosen people. Believers share in the image of God's son and so become the first of many brothers and sisters. God's foreknowledge and the predestination of believers affirm for the struggling Christians in Rome that they too are part of God's larger plan.

The Gospel recounts several parables that describe the kingdom of God. These are unique to Matthew, indicating that he had a separate source of information about Jesus unknown to Mark or Luke. The parable of the dragnet shares similar themes with the parable of the weeds in the wheat (Matthew 13:24-30). The decision about what is good or bad is left up to the angels at the endtime. Only then will there be divine punishment. The closing comment about a scribe trained for the kingdom is thought to be a biographical indication of the identity of Matthew. Some scholars posit that a Jewish Christian scribe "who can bring from his store both the new and the old" would explain Matthew's use of Old Testament scriptures and his interest in bridging Christianity's Jewish roots with its Gentile future.

K ochani Parafianie,



Sprawy podobnej dotyczy pierwsze czytanie z niedzieli dzisiejszej. Salomon jest w sytuacji o tyle lepszej, ze ma moznosc wybrania sobie tego, co zechce wyprosic u Boga. Ale wiadomo, ze dokonanie takiego wyboru - to tez sprawa nie latwa. Kady czlowiek ma przeciez mnostwo najrozmaitszych potrzeb. Gdy wedlug starozytnej legendy poganscy bogowie dali szanse takiego wyboru pewnemu zebrakowi, to on zazyczyl sobie, zeby zlotem stawalo sie wszystko, czegokolwiek dotknie. Bogowie uczynili zadosc jego prosbie:wszystko wokol niego bylo blyszczacym zlotem. Wszystko woda, chleb, rosliny, drzewa. I umarl z glodu zebrak uszczesliwiony w ten sposob na wlasne zadanie.

Nie tak zachowal sie Salomon. Poprosil o dar madrosci. I tez nie po to, by mogl sie nia wynosic ponad innych ludzi. Madrosc byla mu potrzebna wlasnie dla dobra innych, zeby mogl skutecznie i zawsze odrozniac dobro od zla, zeby mogl rzadzic sprawiedliwie.

Drodzy moi! My tez przygotowujemy sie w ojczyznie naszej do wyborow nowej władzy. Bez Bozej pomocy ani wybierajacy ani wybierani nie stana na wysokosci zadania. Jedni i drudzy do wyborow winni sie przygotowywac takze przede wszystkim przez modlitwe. Niech tej modlitwie patronuje wlasnie Salomon, proszac Boga o laske "rozrozniania dobra i zla."




