

ear Parishioners and Friends,

God makes threefold promise to Abram. He will possess a land, he will become a great nation, and he will be a blessing to the people of the earth (12:1—3). The promise will be repeated multiple times in the book of Genesis (for a son: Genesis12:21; 15:5; 17:4; 17:16; 18:10; 18:18; 21:12; 22:17; 26:4 and for land: 12:1; 12:7; 13:14; 15:18; 17:8; 24:7; and 26:4). In today's first reading, Abram bemoans the fact that he is without an heir. To this lament, God promises that as numerous as are the stars in the sky, so will Abram's descendants be. On God's word, Abram has faith. This remarkable trust is credited to Abram as an act of righteousness, and will be echoed by St. Paul as a demonstration that justification is not based on acts but on faith (Romans 4:1—12).

The faith of Abraham is also the subject of today's second reading. Written toward the end of the first century, Hebrews attempts to exhort and guide believers who are at risk of apostasy (5:11-6:20). The author uses the literary technique of prophecyfulfillment to demonstrate that God planned something new that would be in continuity with the old but far superior (Hebrews 11:19). Abraham's faithful trust in God's promise becomes the example believers should follow.

In the Gospel reading, we encounter another faithful elder. Like Abram, Simeon is declared righteous (Luke 2:25), a term only used by Luke for those who exemplify Old Testament piety (Luke 1:6; 23:46, 50). He is awaiting the consolation of Israel and the Holy Spirit is upon him. He encounters the child Jesus in the temple, and taking the baby in his arms, he blesses God, who has fulfilled the long-awaited promise. "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace...my eyes have seen your salvation" (Luke 2:29—30). Luke often pairs two similar stories—one about a male character and the other a female (see Luke 7:1-17; 15:8-32). So after the encounter with the elderly Simeon, the Holy Family meets Anna, an 84-year old widow, who worships in the temple night and day with fasting and prayer. Though she isn't called "righteous" her actions demonstrate her faithfulness. She goes forth speaking about the child to all who are awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

K ochani Parafianie,

W pierwszym czytaniu dzisiejszej liturgii Slowa mamy do czynienia ze starotestamentalna teologia rodziny. Wszystko, co tam zostalo powiedziane, zwłaszcza na temat powinności dzieci wzgledem rodzicow, jest aktualne i godne polecenia po dzien dzisiejszy. Potrzeba okazywania szacunku i milości rodzicom jest umotywowana bardzo szczegolowo. Nie tylko wypada, ale nawet po ludzku sadzac bardzo sie opłaca darzyc szacunkiem rodzicow: bo za to dostapi sie odpuszczenia grzechow; bo przez to mozna sobie zasłuzyc na długie zycie; bo to gwarantuje udział w milosierdziu Bozym; bo w ten sposob gromadzi sie skarby nadprzyrodzone; bo tak sie zarabia na podobny szacunek ze strony własnych dzieci. Czy to nie wystarczy?

Szacunek wzgledem wlasnych rodzicow to tylko jeden z elementow prawego zycia. W drugim czytaniu z dzisiejszej liturgii Slowa sw. Pawel podsuwa nam tych elementow znacznie wiecej. Oto one: serdeczne milosierdzie, wybaczanie sobie wszelkich urazow. Sa to tzw. cnoty spoleczne. Bez ich przynajmniej elementarnej praktyki trudno sobie nawet wyobrazic poprawne układy spoleczne. I jeszcze jedno. Ludzie juz tak zyjacy musza sie nieustannie modlic, najlepiej modlitwa dziekczynienia, zawsze w imie Pana Jezusa.

Rodzinom zas calym udziela Pawel nastepujacych pouczen: zony winny byc poddane mezom, mezowie maja milowac zony, oboje rodzice nie powinni rozdrazniac swych dzieci, ktore, w zamian za to, maja byc we wszystkim posluszne rodzicom.

Szczegolowosc tych pouczen swiadczy o rozmiarach troski, jaka Pawel otaczal zarowno poszczegolnych chrzescijan, jak i cale ich rodziny.




We invite you for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in Saint John Paul II Chapel, Monday-Friday evenings from 5:30-6:30 p.m.
