

Community/Feral Cat Program

Community/Feral outdoor cats are cats you cannot touch. In order to capture these cats, you would need to use a humane trap.

The APF Community/Feral cat package is available to help community members with population control amongst feral/community cats. This is not intended for cats that reside in your household.

Spay/Neuter Surgery Package\$75

Includes surgical anesthesia and pain medication, 1-year Rabies Vaccine, FVRCP, Revolution, Ear Tip

How to schedule an appointment:

- When booking online through the APF appointment portal, please select "Cat Female" and enter any weight. This will bring you to any available appointments we have for community/feral cats.
- Select a date and complete all required information.
- Complete your deposit. (If you are unable to trap the cat(s), please notify the clinic as soon as possible and the clinic will credit your deposit to another appointment or issue a refund at your request).
- Once your appointment request has been approved by the clinic you will receive an email confirmation with further instructions.
- The Spay/Neuter Surgery Package pricing (\$75) will be applied on the day of your appointment at check-in. You will not be charged the standard spay/neuter amount.

Appointment Drop-Off Instructions:

- Trapping should coincide with your scheduled appointment with the APF Clinic. It is
 recommended trapping the night before your scheduled appointment and keeping the cat
 in a safe, temperature-controlled location. It is possible for a cat to die from hypothermia or
 heat stroke when confined in a trap outside.
- When dropping the community cat off to the clinic, they must be in a Hav-a-Hart trap. If the community cat is not in a Hav-a-Hart trap, then we cannot accept them for surgery that day and we will have to reschedule.

- Please do not place towels/bedding, etc. in the trap when attempting to trap the feral cat as it can be a potential health hazard to the cat if they get stuck in it.
- Cover the entire trap with a large towel or sheet. Covering the trap will help to keep the cat calm.
- Feral cats must be trapped and confined with no food after midnight the night before surgery.
- Please relay any information about the cat's health to the APF Clinic staff when dropping off at check-in.

You will be provided with discharge/release instructions, vaccine certificate and medical health summary when picking up your community/feral cat.
