

We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.



Join the Union of Black Episcopalians, Chapter of Central Florida, for the Annual Absalom Jones Celebration on Saturday, February 28, 2026, at St. Richard's Episcopal Church in Winter Park. This year's theme, "Rise in the Power of the Spirit, Walk in Grace: A Call for Justice, Healing, and Hope," invites us into worship, reflection, and

conversation.

The day begins with Holy Eucharist at 10:30 a.m., followed by lunch and discussion at noon. Our guest preacher will be The Rev. Dr. Mauricio J. Wilson, National President of the Union of Black Episcopalians.


