The Enneagram & Spiritual Formation

The Enneagram is an ancient personality typing system that beautifully blends spirituality and psychology, and as such is a highly effective tool for the inner, transformative work of healing, change and growth. It is predicated on the belief that there are core motivations inherent in each personality type that drive behavior and shape the unique lens through which we see and relate to the world and others around us. The Enneagram from a Christian perspective, specifically, espouses that there are 9 distinct personality types in the world and that each personality type is a reflection of an aspect of the Divine nature of God deposited into each of us.

In this 10-week series will explore the origin and historic development of the Enneagram, and develop a good overview of the 9 personality types with the goal of deepening our self-awareness, enhancing our relationships and motivating greater spiritual transformation in our lives.
