THE SECOND READING Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16

Reader A reading from Hebrews.

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old-- and Sarah herself was barren-- because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."

All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.




A Little about Victor: Victor came to Orlando in 1967 to serve at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church as Director of Christian Education & Youth. "Two months later I was asked to also be the organist and choir director.

I served there for 21 years and later was asked to serve at Emmanuel Episcopal Church, also in Orlando, where I served for 23 years. As a new member of St. Richard's, I have volunteered to form and direct a handbell choir. I am happy to say that anyone can be a member of a handbell choir because no musical experience is necessary. There are only three requirements to play in a handbell choir: (1) to know your left hand from your right, (2) to count to four and (3) to smile."



NEW! Volunteer Opportunity at St. Richard's

Treasurer--a critical role for a layperson to play in the life of the church Pam Eastburn has been our treasurer for 3 years and is ready to retire from this volunteer position.

Please consider taking on this role. Pam hopes to "train" the new volunteer this fall through budget planning and pass the baton at the Annual Meeting in January 2026.

Here is a position description:

The Treasurer is an officer of the Church, elected annually by the Vestry, and is ultimately responsible to the Vestry and Rector for the output, operations and staff of the Church Finance Office, especially the Parish Administrator who manages the financial database for the church.

The Treasurer is personally tasked with providing monthly reports to the Vestry, reporting to the Congregation at the Annual Meeting, providing reports to the Almanack and E-news publications, creating the annual budget, and maintaining the Finance Office Manual. Although the Treasurer does not have authority to make financial decisions, he/she is required to advise the Rector and Vestry in making such decisions. The Treasurer along with the Rector, Senior Warden, Junior Warden, plus other(s) approved by the Rector have check signing authority. Operational responsibilities include oversight of the Bookkeeper and Counters and chairing of the Finance Commission.

The workload of the Treasurer is somewhat seasonal. Budget preparation plus end-of-year reporting and filings require an average of two to three days per week of effort in the September through February period. During the remainder of the year the effort averages one to two days per week. Some of the work can be performed at home, but much must be done in the office. Although the Treasurer and Bookkeeper must be a close-working pair, the Bookkeeper should be self-sufficient most of the time.
