Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Do I need to complete the interest form even if we are *not* considering playing All-Stars?

A: Yes. We ask that all players in every division complete the interest form regardless of whether they are considering All-Star participation or not. This ensures that our selection process includes all eligible players, and it helps us confirm participation intentions.

Q: When will the season start and end?

A: Start: May 4, 2026

End: 6u: June 14, 2026

8u/10u/12u: Through June; Depending on how well the team does they could play through July 19, 2026

Q: Will there be any mandatory meetings once teams are formed?

A: Yes.

Date: May 4, 2026

Location: Los Cerritos gymnasium

Time:

Uniform fitting for 6u and 10u: 4pm

Uniform fitting for 8u and 12u: 5pm

Q: What is the time commitment? When are practices and games?

A: Typically, practices are held on weeknights. Practices may be held on weekends during weekends when a tournament is not scheduled. Practice schedule is determined by the manager for each respective team. On average, there are approximately 3-4 practices a week. The 6u team will practice 2 times a week.

Tournament games are on Friday and/or Saturday (depending on tournament schedule), and Sundays. The TOGSA Memorial Day Tournament is one of the exceptions and is played Thursday through Monday during Memorial Weekend.

Players are expected to make every reasonable attempt to participate in all team practices and games throughout the All-Star season. Participation in other activities (i.e.: other sports, family vacations, etc.) that will directly conflict with an All-Star player's ability to give a 100% commitment to their All-Star team must be disclosed on the All-Star interest form.

If a player knows in advance that she will miss one or more tournaments, that information must be disclosed on the All-Star Interest form. Failure to disclose any known conflicts relating to practices, games, or tournaments may result in a minimum one (1) game suspension for the player.

*This is a travel tournament. Travel expenses are the responsibility of individual families. Team managers will discuss further details with their team.

**Teams qualified will pay additional fees TBD and will be communicated by team manager

NOTE: Silver teams will have the choice to plan in a final Tournament in Simi Valley or C Districts

Q: Are uniforms provided?

A: Yes, uniforms (2 jerseys, 2 pairs of socks, and 2 pairs of pants) are covered by part of the registration fees. Uniforms will be ordered as soon as teams are formed.

The 6U team will receive 1 uniform (1 jersey, 1 pair of socks, and 1 pair of pants).

Q: How much are the registration fees?

A: 6u = \$270
8u-12u = \$450

Q: Will there be any additional fees?

A: Each family will pay additional fees for field maintenance (\$100) and snack shack operation (\$100). These fees are paid during the mandatory parent meeting on May 4th and will be returned after volunteer commitment has been served. See next question for details. Players will need an All-Star helmet if they do not already have one from a previous season (\$75).

Each team will require a Team Sponsor (\$300). This will be collected by the team managers. For travel tournaments, including state and national championships (if qualify), additional costs are the team's financial responsibility and can be offset by raising sponsorship funds.

Q: Do we have to work any volunteer hours?

A: Yes, there will be a mandatory field cleanup day on May 9, 2026 where a representative from each player's family must work a minimum of 2 hours. These 2 hours can alternatively be worked on May 22nd (set up) or May 25th (tear down).

In addition, for those interested in having snack shack and/or maintenance fees returned, there is a requirement to work 5 hours (for each \$100 fee) in the snack shack or assist with field maintenance during the TOGSA Memorial Day Tournament.

Q: How are girls selected for a team?

A: Following the rec season, TOGSA will conduct an All-Star selection led by the Player Agent (or designated rep), in collaboration with rec managers, division directors, and the All-Star team manager, without the need for evaluations or tryouts. Number of teams will be assembled based on available players and managerial resources. Please refer to TOGSAs Operational Procedures on our website for further details. Selection for the 6u All-Star team is based on experience and age. For more information, visit our website.

Q: Who is eligible to be selected for a team?

A: To be eligible for All-Stars, a player must have participated in 75% of the regular season games, including playoffs (certain exceptions can be made, such as injury). Players who play on a travel ball team or a team outside TOGSA after March 31st are not eligible for All-Stars.

Q: What if my daughter has a conflict during the All-Star season?

A: Any known conflicts must be disclosed on the All-Star Interest form. Conflicts do not prohibit a player from being selected for a team, but rather informs the manager to assist them so they are best able to consider all options for team selection. Failure to disclose any known conflicts relating to practices, games, or tournaments may result in a minimum of 1 game suspension for the player.

Q: How will I be notified if my daughter makes the team?

A: The team manager will reach out to all selected players on May 3, 2026.

Q: Will I be notified if my daughter does not make a team?

A: If your daughter is not selected for an All-Star team you will receive an email from the Player Agent no later than May 3, 2026.

Q: Can a prospective All-Star player specify what All-Star level (Gold, Silver, or Bronze) they wish to play on?

A: Players do not have a choice on which All-Star team they play on.

Q: Does every player get to play in every game?

A: Unlike the rec ball regular season, playing time is a function of ability and practice time commitment. It is up to the All-Star manager and coaching team to determine each player's playing time. Unlike the regular rec season, the emphasis in All-Stars is winning games.

Q: What happens if a selected All-Star player decides to leave the team?

A: A player shall remain committed to their All-Star team for the duration of the All-Star season. If a player departs their All-Star team without cause, as determined by the Board, the parent(s) and player are subject to disciplinary action by the TOGSA Board.

Q: Can a player who “played up” during the rec ball season play up during all-stars?

A: All players who “play up” during the regular rec ball season are eligible for the All-Star team in their age-eligible division. Any exceptions to this shall be decided by the TOGSA Board.

Q: Can a player who “played down” during the rec ball season play down during All-Stars?

A: All players who “played down” during the regular rec ball season are eligible for the All-Star team in their age-eligible division only. Under no circumstance will a player be allowed to play down for All-Stars.
