

## Day 1: God Takes Care of Elijah



Elijah was from Tishbe in the land of Gilead. He said to Ahab, “I serve the Lord. He is the God of Israel. You can be sure that he lives. And you can be just as sure that there won’t be any dew or rain on the whole land. There won’t be any during the next few years. It won’t come until I say so.”

<sup>2</sup>Then a message came to Elijah from the Lord. He said, <sup>3</sup>“Leave this place. Go east and hide in the Kerith Valley. It is east of the Jordan River. <sup>4</sup>You will drink water from the brook. I have directed some ravens to supply you with food there.”

<sup>5</sup>So Elijah did what the Lord had told him to do. He went to the Kerith Valley. It was east of the Jordan River. He stayed there. <sup>6</sup>The ravens brought him bread and meat in the morning. They also brought him bread and meat in the

evening. He drank water from the brook. – **1 Kings 17:1-6 (NIRV)**

God told Elijah to pray that it would not rain. This was to show King Ahab who trusted in a false god that he claimed would make it rain, that he served the wrong God. And it did not rain for 3 ½ years. Elijah needed help getting food to eat during that time. God gave Elijah food by sending ravens with bread and meat, day and night, to take care of him.



**Psalms 55:22 (NIRV)**

*“Turn your problems over to the Lord. He will take care of you.”*



**Main Idea:** God takes care of us.



**Action Point:** Don’t worry about things, instead talk to God about what you need. When you pray, you can say something like “God, I have a problem. My problem is \_\_\_\_\_. I turn my problem over to you. Please help me with this. Amen.”

## Day 2: God Meets a Widow's Needs



Some time later the brook dried up. It hadn't rained in the land for quite a while. <sup>8</sup> A message came to Elijah from the Lord. He said, <sup>9</sup> "Go right away to Zarephath in the region of Sidon. Stay there. I have directed a widow there to supply you with food." <sup>10</sup> So Elijah went to Zarephath. He came to the town gate. A widow was there gathering sticks. He called out to her. He asked, "Would you bring me a little water in a jar? I need a drink." <sup>11</sup> She went to get the water. Then he called out to her, "Please bring me a piece of bread too."

<sup>12</sup> "I don't have any bread," she replied. "And that's just as sure as the Lord your God is alive. All I have is a small amount of flour in a jar and a little olive oil in a jug. I'm gathering a few sticks to take home. I'll make one last meal for myself and my son. We'll eat it. After that, we'll die."

<sup>13</sup> Elijah said to her, "Don't be afraid. Go home. Do what you have said. But first make a small loaf of bread for me. Make it out of what you have. Bring it to me. Then make some for yourself and your son. <sup>14</sup> The Lord is the God of Israel. He says, 'The jar of flour will not be used up. The jug will always have oil in it. You will have flour and oil until the day the Lord sends rain on the land.'

<sup>15</sup> She went away and did what Elijah had told her to do. So Elijah had food every day. There was also food for the woman and her family. <sup>16</sup> The jar of flour wasn't used up. The jug always had oil in it. That's what the Lord had said would happen. He had spoken that message through Elijah. – **1 Kings 17:7-16 (NIRV)**

Because it had not rained in a long time, there wasn't a lot of food. Elijah asked a widow, that's someone whose husband had died, to bring him some water and bread. She said she didn't have bread ready and just enough oil and flour to make on last meal. Elijah told her to trust that God would meet her need. The flour kept filling up and so did the oil. It did not stop until the rain started back up again.



### **Philippians 4:6 (NIRV)**

"Don't worry about anything. Instead, tell God about everything. Ask and pray. Give thanks to him."



**Main Idea:** Trust God even when you don't understand.



**Action Point:** Say out loud "God, I know you will take care of me."

## Day 3: God Can Do Miracles



Some time later the son of the woman who owned the house became sick. He got worse and worse. Finally he stopped breathing. <sup>18</sup>The woman said to Elijah, “You are a man of God. What do you have against me? Did you come to bring my sin out into the open? Did you come to kill my son?”

<sup>19</sup>“Give me your son,” Elijah replied. He took him from her arms. He carried him to the upstairs room where he was staying. He put him down on his bed. <sup>20</sup>Then Elijah cried out to the Lord. He said, “Lord my God, I’m staying with this widow. Have you brought pain and sorrow even to her? Have you caused her son to die?” <sup>21</sup>Then he lay down on the boy three times. He cried out to the Lord. He said, “Lord my God, give this boy’s life back to him!”

<sup>22</sup>The Lord answered Elijah’s prayer. He gave the boy’s life back to him. So the boy lived. <sup>23</sup>Elijah picked up the boy. He carried him down from the upstairs room into the house. He gave him to his mother. He said, “Look! Your son is alive!”

<sup>24</sup>Then the woman said to Elijah, “Now I know that you are a man of God. I know that the message you have brought from the Lord is true.” – **1 Kings 17:17-24 (NIRV)**

God performed a miracle for the widow. A miracle is something that can’t happen without God doing it. God answered Elijah’s prayer and brought the boy back to life. This shows us that nothing is too difficult for God.



**1 John 5:14-15 (NIRV)**

"Here's what gives us confidence as we come to God. If we ask anything that agrees with what he wants, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us, we know that we have what we asked him for."



**Main Idea:** No problem is too big for God.



**Action Point:** What is a problem that you have right now? Tell God that you know He can do anything and ask Him to help you with your problem.

## Day 4: Elijah and the Prophets of Baal – Part 1



So Ahab sent that message all through Israel. He gathered the prophets together on Mount Carmel. <sup>21</sup> Elijah went there and stood in front of the people. He said, “How long will it take you to make up your minds? If the Lord is the one and only God, worship him. But if Baal is the one and only God, worship him.” The people didn’t say anything.

<sup>22</sup> Then Elijah said to them, “I’m the only one of the Lord’s prophets left. But Baal has 450 prophets. <sup>23</sup> Get two bulls for us. Let Baal’s prophets choose one for themselves. Let them cut it into pieces. Then let them put it on the wood. But don’t let them set fire to it. I’ll prepare the other bull. I’ll put it on the wood. But I won’t set fire to it. <sup>24</sup> Then you pray to your god. And I’ll pray to the Lord. The god who answers by sending fire down is the one and only God.” Then all the people said, “What you are saying is good.”

<sup>25</sup> Elijah said to the prophets of Baal, “Choose one of the bulls. There are many of you. So prepare your bull first. Pray to your god. But don’t light the fire.” <sup>26</sup> So they prepared the bull they had been given. They prayed to Baal from morning until noon. “Baal! Answer us!” they shouted. But there wasn’t any reply. No one answered. Then they danced around the altar they had made.

<sup>27</sup> At noon Elijah began to tease them. “Shout louder!” he said. “I’m sure Baal is a god! Perhaps he has too much to think about. Or maybe he has gone to the toilet. Or perhaps he’s away on a trip. Maybe he’s sleeping. You might have to wake him up.” <sup>28</sup> So they shouted louder. They cut themselves with swords and spears until their blood flowed. That’s what they usually did when things really looked hopeless. The prophets were frustrated because nothing was happening. But nothing could happen because their god wasn’t real. There is only one God. If we put our trust in things other than God, we will be frustrated. When we trust God he works things out for us. – **1 Kings 17:20-28 (NIRV)**



### Proverbs 3:5 (NIRV)

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart. Do not depend on your own understanding."



**Main Idea:** God helps those who trust Him.



**Action Point:** Decide to always follow God. Know that He keeps all His promises.

## Day 5: Elijah and the Prophets of Baal – Part 2



Then Elijah said to all the people, “Come here to me.” So they went to him. He rebuilt the altar of the Lord. It had been torn down. <sup>31</sup> Elijah got 12 stones. There was one for each tribe in the family line of Jacob. The Lord’s message had come to Jacob. It had said, “Your name will be Israel.” <sup>32</sup> Elijah used the stones to build an altar to honor the Lord. He dug a ditch around it. The ditch was large enough to hold 24 pounds of seeds. <sup>33</sup> He arranged the wood for the fire. He cut the bull into pieces. He placed the pieces on the wood. Then he said to some of the people, “Fill four large jars with water. Pour it on the offering and the wood.” So they did.

<sup>34</sup> “Do it again,” he said. So they did it again.

“Do it a third time,” he ordered. And they did it the third time. <sup>35</sup> The water ran down around the altar. It even filled the ditch.

<sup>36</sup> When it was time to offer the evening sacrifice, the prophet Elijah stepped forward. He prayed, “Lord, you are the God of Abraham, Isaac and Israel. Today let everyone know that you are God in Israel. Let them know I’m your servant. Let them know I’ve done all these things because you commanded me to. <sup>37</sup> Answer me. Lord, answer me. Then these people will know that you are the one and only God. They’ll know that you are turning their hearts back to you again.”

<sup>38</sup> The fire of the Lord came down. It burned up the sacrifice. It burned up the wood and the stones and the soil. It even dried up the water in the ditch. <sup>39</sup> All the people saw it. Then they fell down flat with their faces toward the ground. They cried out, “The Lord is the one and only God! The Lord is the one and only God!” – **1 Kings 18:30-39 (NIRV)**



### **Psalms 77:14 (NIRV)**

"You are the God who does miracles. You show your power among the nations."



**Main Idea:** I can trust God because He is real and powerful.



**Action Point:** Thank God for times that He has answered your prayers.

## Day 6: Elijah Is Scared – Part 1



So Jezebel sent a message to Elijah. She said, “You can be sure that I will kill you, just as I killed the other prophets. I’ll do it by this time tomorrow. If I don’t, may the gods punish me greatly.”

<sup>3</sup>Elijah was afraid. So he ran for his life. He came to Beersheba in Judah. He left his servant there. <sup>4</sup>Then he traveled for one day into the desert. He came to a small bush. He sat down under it. He prayed that he would die. “Lord, I’ve had enough,” he said. “Take my life. I’m no better than my people of long ago.” <sup>5</sup>Then he lay down under the bush. And he fell asleep.

Suddenly an angel touched him. The angel said, “Get up and eat.” <sup>6</sup>Elijah looked around. Near his head he saw some

bread. It had been baked over hot coals. A jar of water was also there. So Elijah ate and drank. Then he lay down again.

<sup>7</sup>The angel of the Lord came to him a second time. He touched him and said, “Get up and eat. Your journey will be long and hard.” <sup>8</sup>So he got up. He ate and drank. The food gave him new strength. He traveled for 40 days and 40 nights. He kept going until he arrived at Horeb. It was the mountain of God. <sup>9</sup>There he went into a cave and spent the night. – **1 Kings 19:2-9 (NIRV)**

Right after Elijah’s big win over the prophets of Baal, Queen Jezebel threatened to kill him. He got really scared and ran away. He felt like giving up, but God sent an angel to encourage him. When things scare or frustrate us, we shouldn’t run away but turn to God and let Him help us.



### **Psalms 34-7-8 (NIRV)**

“Godly people cry out, and the Lord hears them. He saves them from all their troubles. The Lord is close to those whose hearts have been broken. He saves those whose spirits have been crushed.”



**Main Idea:** When you are scared remember God is with you.



**Action Point:** Instead of running away or giving up when things aren’t going well, stop and turn to God and ask for His help.

## Day 7: Elijah Is Scared – Part 2



A message came to Elijah from the Lord. He said, “Elijah, what are you doing here?”

<sup>10</sup>He replied, “Lord God who rules over all, I’ve been very committed to you. The Israelites have turned their backs on your covenant. They have torn down your altars. They’ve put your prophets to death with their swords. I’m the only one left. And they are trying to kill me.”

<sup>11</sup>The Lord said, “Go out. Stand on the mountain in front of me. I am going to pass by.”

As the Lord approached, a very powerful wind tore the mountains apart. It broke up the rocks. But the Lord wasn’t in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake. But the Lord wasn’t in the earthquake. <sup>12</sup>After the earthquake a fire came. But the Lord wasn’t in the fire. And after the fire

there was only a gentle whisper. <sup>13</sup>When Elijah heard it, he pulled his coat over his face. He went out and stood at the entrance to the cave.

Then a voice said to him, “Elijah, what are you doing here?”

He replied, “Lord God who rules over all, I’ve been very committed to you. The Israelites have turned their backs on your covenant. They have torn down your altars. They’ve put your prophets to death with their swords. I’m the only one left. And they are trying to kill me.”

<sup>15</sup>The Lord said to him, “Go back the way you came. – **1 Kings 19:9-15 (NIRV)**

Elijah had run from Jezebel and was hiding in a cave. God showed Him that he didn’t need earthquakes, or powerful winds, or fire to win. What Elijah needed was to hear God speaking to him and to trust God to take care of him.



**1 Peter 5:7 (NIRV)**

"Turn all your worries over to him. He cares about you."



**Main Idea:** Remember God is bigger than your problems.



**Action Point:** Tell God all about your problems. Tell Him out loud that “I know you are bigger than my problems. I will trust you to help me.”

## Day 8 – Elijah Goes to Heaven



Then Elijah said to him, “Stay here. The Lord has sent me to the Jordan River.” Elisha replied, “I won’t leave you. And that’s just as sure as the Lord and you are alive.” So the two of them walked on. <sup>7</sup> Fifty men from the group of prophets followed them. The men stopped and stood not far away from them. They faced the place where Elijah and Elisha had stopped at the Jordan River. <sup>8</sup> Elijah rolled up his coat. Then he struck the water with it. The water parted to the right and to the left. The two of them went across the river on dry ground. <sup>9</sup> After they had gone across, Elijah said to Elisha, “Tell me. What can I do for you before I’m taken away from you?” “Please give me a double share of your spirit,” Elisha replied.

<sup>10</sup> “You have asked me for something that’s very hard to do,” Elijah said. “But suppose you see me when I’m taken away

from you. Then you will receive what you have asked for. If you don’t see me, you won’t receive it.” <sup>11</sup> They kept walking along and talking together. Suddenly there appeared a chariot and horses made of fire. The chariot and horses came between the two men. Then Elijah went up to heaven in a strong wind. <sup>12</sup> Elisha saw it and cried out to Elijah, “My father! You are like a father to me! You, Elijah, are the true chariots and horsemen of Israel!” Elisha didn’t see Elijah anymore. Then Elisha took hold of his own garment and tore it in two.

<sup>13</sup> He picked up the coat that had fallen from Elijah. He went back and stood on the bank of the Jordan River. <sup>14</sup> Then he struck the water with Elijah’s coat. “Where is the power of the Lord?” he asked. “Where is the power of the God of Elijah?” When Elisha struck the water, it parted to the right and to the left. He went across the river. <sup>15</sup> The group of prophets from Jericho were watching. They said, “The spirit of Elijah has been given to Elisha.” They went over to Elisha.

**Main Idea:** God rewards those who trust Him



**Action Point:** Just as God rewarded Elijah and Elisha for staying faithful, know that He will reward you. Keep following God no matter what.

## Day 9 – Elisha Provides Oil for a Widow



The wife of a man from the group of the prophets cried out to Elisha. She said, “My husband is dead. You know how much respect he had for the Lord. But he owed money to someone. And now that person is coming to take my two boys away. They will become his slaves.”

<sup>2</sup> Elisha replied to her, “How can I help you? Tell me. What do you have in your house?”

“I don’t have anything there at all,” she said. “All I have is a small jar of olive oil.”

<sup>3</sup> Elisha said, “Go around to all your neighbors. Ask them for empty jars. Get as many as you can. <sup>4</sup> Then go inside your house. Shut the door behind you and your sons. Pour oil into all the jars. As each jar is filled, put it over to one side.”

<sup>5</sup> The woman left him. Then she shut the door behind her and her sons. They brought the jars to her. And she kept pouring. <sup>6</sup> When all the jars were full, she spoke to one of her sons. She said, “Bring me another jar.” But he replied, “There aren’t any more left.” Then the oil stopped flowing.

<sup>7</sup> She went and told the man of God about it. He said, “Go and sell the oil. Pay what you owe. You and your sons can live on what is left.” – **2 Kings 4:1-7 (NIRV)**

A poor widow, whose husband had died needed money or they were going to take her sons away. She begged the prophet Elisha for help. All she had was just a small amount of oil.



### **Philippians 4:19 (NIRV)**

“My God will meet all your needs. He will meet them in keeping with his wonderful riches. These riches come to you because you belong to Christ Jesus.”



**Main Idea:** God meets our needs



**Action Point:** Let God know what you need by talking to Him in prayer. Trust that God will meet your need.

## Day 10 – Elisha Prays for a Woman



One day Elisha went to the town of Shunem. A rich woman lived there. She begged him to stay and have a meal. So every time he came by, he stopped there to eat. <sup>9</sup>The woman said to her husband, “That man often comes by here. I know that he is a holy man of God. <sup>10</sup>Let’s make a small room for him on the roof. We’ll put a bed and a table in it. We’ll also put a chair and a lamp in it. Then he can stay there when he comes to visit us.”

<sup>11</sup>One day Elisha came. He went up to his room and lay down there. <sup>12</sup>He said to his servant Gehazi, “Go and get the woman from Shunem.” So he did. She stood in front of Elisha. <sup>13</sup>He said to Gehazi, “Tell her, ‘You have gone to a lot of trouble for us. Now what can we do for you? Can we speak to the king for you? Or can we speak to the commander of the army for you?’ ”

She replied, “I live among my own people. I have everything I need here.” <sup>14</sup>After she left, Elisha asked Gehazi, “What can we do for her?” Gehazi said, “She doesn’t have a son. And her husband is old.”

<sup>15</sup>Then Elisha said, “Bring her here again.” So, he did. She stood in the doorway. <sup>16</sup>“You will hold a son in your arms,” Elisha said. “It will be about this time next year.” “No, my master!” she objected. “You are a man of God. So please don’t lie to me!”

<sup>17</sup>But the woman became pregnant. She had a baby boy. It happened the next year about that same time. That’s exactly what Elisha had told her would happen. – **2 Kings 4:8-16 (NIRV)**

A family that couldn’t have a baby showed Elisha kindness. In return he was kind to them. Elisha was a prophet and he knew God would hear and answer his prayer. He prayed for the family and they had a baby.



### **Ephesians 4:32 (NIRV)**

“Be kind and tender to one another.”



**Main Idea:** Be kind to others.



**Action Point:** Make a list of ways how you can be kind to someone you know. Then pick a way to show kindness and do it.

## Day 11 – Elisha Prays for a Dead Boy



The child grew. One day he went out to get his father. His father was with the people who were gathering the crops. <sup>19</sup>The boy said to his father, “My head hurts! It really hurts!” His father told a servant, “Carry him to his mother.” <sup>20</sup>The servant lifted up the boy. He carried him to his mother. The boy sat on her lap until noon. Then he died. <sup>21</sup>She went up to the room on the roof. There she laid him on the bed of the man of God. Then she shut the door and went out...

She came to the man of God at the mountain. Then she took hold of his feet. Gehazi came over to push her away. But the man of God said, “Leave her alone! She is suffering terribly. But the Lord hasn’t told me the reason for it. He has hidden it from me.”

<sup>28</sup>“My master, did I ask you for a son?” she said. “Didn’t I tell you, ‘Don’t make me hope for something that won’t happen?’”...

Elisha arrived at the house. The boy was dead. He was lying on Elisha’s bed. <sup>33</sup>Elisha went into the room. He shut the door. He was alone with the boy. He prayed to the Lord. <sup>34</sup>Then Elisha got on the bed. He lay down on the boy. His mouth touched the boy’s mouth. His eyes touched the boy’s eyes. And his hands touched the boy’s hands. As Elisha lay on the boy, the boy’s body grew warm. <sup>35</sup>Elisha turned away. He walked back and forth in the room. Then he got on the bed again. He lay down on the boy once more. The boy sneezed seven times. After that, he opened his eyes.

<sup>36</sup>Elisha sent for Gehazi. He said to him, “Go and get the woman from Shunem.” So he did. When she came, Elisha said, “Take your son.” <sup>37</sup>She came in and fell at Elisha’s feet. She bowed down with her face toward the ground. Then she took her son and went out. - **2 Kings 4:18-27 (NIRV)**



**Luke 1:37 (NIRV)**

“Nothing is impossible with God.”



**Main Idea:** Nothing is impossible with God



**Action Point:** Say to God “Help me to always remember that nothing is impossible with you.”

## Day 12 – Naaman is Healed



Naaman was army commander of the king of Aram... But he had a skin disease...

<sup>3</sup>The young girl spoke to the woman she was serving. She said, “I wish my master would go and see the prophet who is in Samaria. He would heal my master of his skin disease.”...

So Naaman went to see Elisha. He took his horses and chariots with him. He stopped at the door of Elisha’s house. <sup>10</sup>Elisha sent a messenger out to him. The messenger said, “Go! Wash yourself in the Jordan River seven times. Then your skin will be healed. You will be pure and ‘clean’ again.”

<sup>11</sup>But Naaman went away angry. He said, “I was sure Elisha would come out to me. I thought he would stand there and

pray to the Lord his God. I thought he would wave his hand over my skin. Then I would be healed. <sup>12</sup>And what about the Abana and Pharpar rivers of Damascus? Aren’t they better than all the rivers of Israel? Couldn’t I wash in the rivers of Damascus and be made pure and ‘clean’?” So he turned and went away. He was very angry.

<sup>13</sup>Naaman’s servants went over to him. They said, “You are like a father to us. What if Elisha the prophet had told you to do some great thing? Wouldn’t you have done it? But he only said, ‘Wash yourself. Then you will be pure and ‘clean.’” You should be even more willing to do that!” <sup>14</sup>So Naaman went down to the Jordan River. He dipped himself in it seven times. He did exactly what the man of God had told him to do. Then his skin was made pure again. It became “clean” like the skin of a young boy. – **2 Kings 5:1-14 (NIRV)**

If Naaman had given up on the 6<sup>th</sup> time of dipping in the Jordan river, he wouldn’t have been healed. When we fully obey God we see God move.



### **James 1:22 (NIRV)**

"Don't just listen to the word. You fool yourselves if you do that. You must do what it says."



**Main Idea:** Obey God fully.



**Action Point:** Don’t give up too soon. Obey God fully.

## Day 13 – Elisha Makes an Axe Head Float



The group of the prophets said to Elisha, “Look. The place where we meet with you is too small for us. <sup>2</sup>We would like to go to the Jordan River. Each of us can get some wood there. We want to build a place there for us to meet.”

Elisha said, “Go.”

<sup>3</sup>Then one of them said, “Won’t you please come with us?”

“I will,” Elisha replied. <sup>4</sup>And he went with them.

They went to the Jordan River. There they began to cut down trees. <sup>5</sup>One of them was cutting down a tree. The iron blade of his ax fell into the water. “Oh no, master!” he cried out. “This ax was borrowed!”

<sup>6</sup>The man of God asked, “Where did the blade fall?” He showed Elisha the place. Then Elisha cut a stick and threw

it there. That made the iron blade float. <sup>7</sup>“Take it out of the water,” he said. So the man reached out and took it. – **2**

**Kings 6:1-7 (NIRV)**

We have seen Elijah and Elisha do some really big miracles. Making a guy’s axe head float doesn’t seem like such a big deal. But it probably meant a lot to that guy. Have you ever wondered if God cared about you and the things you go through? Know that God does care about you and is there for you. Not just to help with the big problems but help with the small ones too.



**Philippians 4:6 (NIRV)**

“Don't worry about anything. Instead, tell God about everything. Ask and pray. Give thanks to him.”



**Main Idea:** Trust God to help with the little problems too.



**Action Point:** Talk to God, not just about the big stuff, but talk to him about you small problems also

## Day 14 – An Invisible Army Made Visible



The servant of the man of God got up the next morning. He went out early. He saw that an army with horses and chariots had surrounded the city. “Oh no, my master!” the servant said. “What can we do?”

<sup>16</sup> “Don’t be afraid,” the prophet answered. “Those who are with us are more than those who are with them.”

<sup>17</sup> Elisha prayed, “Lord, open my servant’s eyes so that he can see.” Then the Lord opened his eyes. Elisha’s servant looked up and saw the hills. He saw that Elisha was surrounded by horses and chariots made of fire.

<sup>18</sup> Aram’s army came down toward Elisha. Then he prayed to the Lord, “Make these soldiers blind.” So the Lord made them blind, just as Elisha had prayed.

<sup>19</sup> Elisha told them, “This isn’t the right road. This isn’t the right city. Follow me. I’ll lead you to the man you are looking for.” He led them to Samaria.

<sup>20</sup> They entered the city. Then Elisha said, “Lord, open the eyes of these men. Help them see again.” Then the Lord opened their eyes. They looked around. And there they were, inside Samaria!

<sup>21</sup> The king of Israel saw them. So he asked Elisha, “Should I kill them? I need your advice. You are like a father to me. Should I kill them?”

<sup>22</sup> “Don’t kill them,” he answered. “Would you kill people you have captured with your own sword or bow? Put some food and water in front of them. Then they can eat and drink. They can go back to their master.” **2 Kings 6:15-22**

Just because we don’t see God, doesn’t mean He isn’t looking out for us.



### **2 Kings 6:17 (NIRV)**

"Elisha prayed, 'Lord, open my servant's eyes so he can see.' The Lord opened the servant's eyes and let him see. He looked up and saw the hills. He saw that Elisha was surrounded by horses and chariots made of fire."



**Main Idea:** God is with us even when we don’t feel Him.



**Action Point:** Ask God to help you to trust Him more when you have a problem and to remember that He is bigger than all your problems.
