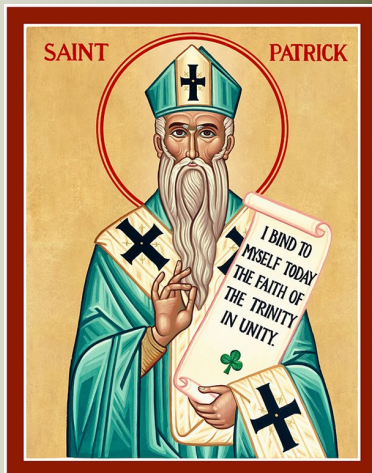

PASTOR'S NOTES -
Fr. George G. Perez C.J.M. - Pastor
The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, the Church invites us into the heart of the mystery of God Himself. The Trinity is not simply a doctrine to be explained, but a relationship of love to be encountered. We profess that there is one God in three Persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Though this mystery surpasses human understanding, it reveals something beautiful and essential about who God is and how God relates to us. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells His disciples: "Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that he will take from what is mine and declare it to you." In these words, we glimpse the communion that exists within the Trinity—a perfect unity of love, trust, and self-giving. The Father sends the Son into the world for our salvation, and the Holy Spirit continues to guide and strengthen the Church. The Trinity is not distant from our daily lives; rather, we live each day immersed in the life of the Trinity. Every time we make the Sign of the Cross, we proclaim this central mystery of our faith: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." These are not simply words we repeat out of habit. They are a reminder that we belong to God and are called into communion with Him. We were baptized in the name of the Trinity, and through that baptism we became part of God's family. The mystery of the Trinity also teaches us how to live. Because God exists as a communion of Persons, we too are created for relationship—with God and with one another. In a world often marked by division, isolation, and conflict, the Trinity reminds us that love, unity, and selflessness are at the center of Christian life. Families, parishes, and communities are strongest when they reflect the love and unity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. As Catholics, we are also reminded that one of the most powerful moments of grace at Mass comes at the very end: the final blessing and dismissal. Too often people leave early, missing this sacred moment when the priest blesses the faithful in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. The Mass is not truly concluded until we are sent forth with God's blessing to live the Gospel in our daily lives. I encourage everyone to remain until the very end of Mass and receive this beautiful and powerful blessing. Saint Augustine once wrote that if we think we fully understand the Trinity, then what we understand is not God. The mystery humbles us, but it also draws us closer to wonder and worship. Rather than trying to solve the mystery, we are invited to enter into it through prayer, trust, and love. As we celebrate this great solemnity, may we open our hearts more fully to the presence of the Triune God. May the Father guide us, the Son walk beside us, and the Holy Spirit fill us with wisdom, courage, and peace. And may our lives reflect the love of the Holy Trinity in all we do.

This week's word: Doxology

A doxology is a short hymn, verse, or prayer used in Christian worship that is specifically dedicated to praising and glorifying God. The word comes from the Greek *doxa* (meaning "glory" or "splendor"). Examples include the prayer "Glory be to the Father..." and the doxology that ends the Eucharistic Prayer ("Through him, and with him, and in him...").

NOTAS DEL PÁRROCO –

Solemnidad De la Santísima Trinidad

Mientras celebramos la Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, la Iglesia nos invita a entrar en el corazón mismo del misterio de Dios. La Trinidad no es simplemente una doctrina para explicar, sino una relación de amor para encontrar y vivir. Profesamos que hay un solo Dios en tres Personas: el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo. Aunque este misterio supera nuestro entendimiento humano, nos revela algo hermoso y esencial sobre quién es Dios y cómo se relaciona con nosotros.

En el Evangelio de hoy, Jesús dice a sus discípulos: “Todo lo que tiene el Padre es mío; por eso les he dicho que tomará de lo mío y se lo comunicará a ustedes.” En estas palabras contemplamos la perfecta comunión que existe dentro de la Trinidad: una unidad perfecta de amor, confianza y entrega. El Padre envía al Hijo al mundo para nuestra salvación, y el Espíritu Santo continúa guiando y fortaleciendo a la Iglesia. La Trinidad no está lejos de nuestra vida diaria; al contrario, vivimos cada día inmersos en la vida misma de Dios.

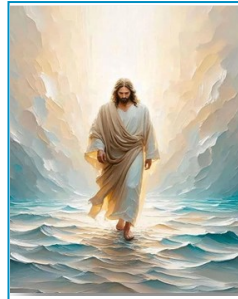
Cada vez que hacemos la Señal de la Cruz proclamamos este misterio central de nuestra fe: “En el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo.” No son palabras que repetimos por costumbre. Son un recordatorio de que pertenecemos a Dios y estamos llamados a vivir en comunión con Él. Fuimos bautizados en el nombre de la Trinidad y, por medio del Bautismo, llegamos a formar parte de la familia de Dios.

El misterio de la Trinidad también nos enseña cómo debemos vivir. Porque Dios existe como comunión de Personas, nosotros también fuimos creados para la relación: con Dios y con los demás. En un mundo marcado tantas veces por la división, el aislamiento y el conflicto, la Trinidad nos recuerda que el amor, la unidad y la entrega son el centro de la vida cristiana. Nuestras familias, parroquias y comunidades son más fuertes cuando reflejan el amor y la unidad del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo.

Como católicos, también recordamos que uno de los momentos más poderosos de gracia en la Santa Misa llega al final: la bendición final y el envío. Muchas veces algunas personas salen antes de terminar la Misa y se pierden ese momento sagrado en el que el sacerdote bendice al pueblo en el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo. La Misa no termina verdaderamente hasta que somos enviados al mundo con la bendición de Dios para vivir el Evangelio en nuestra vida diaria. Los invito a permanecer hasta el final de la Misa para recibir esta hermosa y poderosa bendición.

San Agustín escribió una vez que, si pensamos que comprendemos plenamente la Trinidad, entonces lo que comprendemos no es Dios. Este misterio nos llena de humildad, pero también nos acerca al asombro y a la adoración. Más que tratar de resolver el misterio, estamos invitados a entrar en él mediante la oración, la confianza y el amor.

Que al celebrar esta gran solemnidad abramos más plenamente nuestro corazón a la presencia del Dios Trino. Que el Padre nos guíe, el Hijo camine a nuestro lado y el Espíritu Santo nos llene de sabiduría, valentía y paz. Y que nuestras vidas reflejen siempre el amor de la Santísima Trinidad.

La Santísima Trinidad

Terminada la celebración del tiempo pascual con la Solemnidad de Pentecostés, la Iglesia nos invita a celebrar en este domingo, ya de nuevo dentro del tiempo ordinario, la Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad.

El misterio pascual de Cristo, a la luz de Pentecostés, nos ha permitido “conocer” la entraña del Dios en quien creemos, en quien “vivimos, nos movemos y existimos”. En este acontecimiento de salvación hemos conocido cómo es el único Dios verdadero lleno de misericordia y bondad entrañables. Nos ha sido revelado, dentro de lo que nosotros podemos comprender, el misterio de su unidad sustancial y de su trinidad admirable. Vatican II and Its Implementation

Fr. Ron Bagley will be teaching a course on the Second Vatican Council. It will take place at **St. Patrick Parish Center, on June 2, 9, 16, 23; & 30, from 6:00 – 9:00 pm**

Objectives of the Course:

- * place the Second Vatican Council in historical context within the Church and the world by indicating those events and trends that led up to Vatican II
- * provide an overview of the main topics and themes treated by the council
- * identify major results of the implementation of the Council since its closure
- * identify the ways that Pope Leo XIV has already indicated that he will continue to implement the teachings of Vatican II

Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic?

Whether you have been baptized in another Christian church or never been baptized, OCIA is the process we use to welcome new members into the Church.

It is also for adults who have never finished receiving the sacraments of initiation (for example, they did not receive the Sacrament of Confirmation when they were younger). It is a process of discernment and formation, in the context of the Christian community, which leads to the decision to be fully initiated as a Catholic Christian. This happens when adults receive Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist at the Easter Vigil (next March 27).

A new group will be formed over the summer. Then beginning in early September, candidates attend our formation sessions every Sunday morning immediately after the 9:00 am Mass. They attend the Mass and then meet in the parish hall until 11:00 am. **Attendance is important** and those who miss too many sessions will not be included in the celebration at the Easter Vigil. Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity – Year A

First Reading

Exodus 34:4b-6,8-9

Moses pleads for God's mercy on Mt. Sinai.

Responsorial Psalm

Daniel 3:52-56

We praise God who is exalted above all forever.

Second Reading

2 Corinthians 13:11-13

God sent his Son into the world to save the world.



Background on the Gospel Reading

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next, however, are designated as solemnities—special days that call our attention to central mysteries of our faith. Today on Trinity Sunday we celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity, one God in three persons.

Today's Gospel is from the beginning of John's Gospel. The passage we read follows Jesus' conversation with a Pharisee, Nicodemus, about what it means to be born of both water and the spirit. Nicodemus approaches Jesus at night and acknowledges Jesus as a teacher from God. Jesus tells him that only those who are born from above will see the Kingdom of God. Nicodemus misunderstands and questions how a person can be born more than once. Jesus tells Nicodemus that no one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. Jesus is essentially explaining Baptism, which we celebrate as a sacrament today. Yet Nicodemus, we are told, still does not understand what Jesus is saying. Jesus continues by testifying to the need to be born from above so that one might have eternal life.

After the dialogue with Nicodemus, the author of the Gospel offers his own explanation of Jesus' words. This is what we read in today's Gospel, John 3:16-18.

In the context of today's focus on the mystery of the Holy Trinity, the reading calls our attention to the action of God, who reveals himself in three persons: God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit. God the Father, out of love for the world, sent his Son into the world in order to save it. Through the death and resurrection of the Son, we have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit. As three persons, God acts always as a God of love; he does not condemn the world but acts to save it. The Gospel also calls attention to the response that is required of us. God's love for us calls us to respond in faith by professing our belief in God's son, Jesus, and the salvation that he has won for us. This profession of faith is a sign of the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives.
