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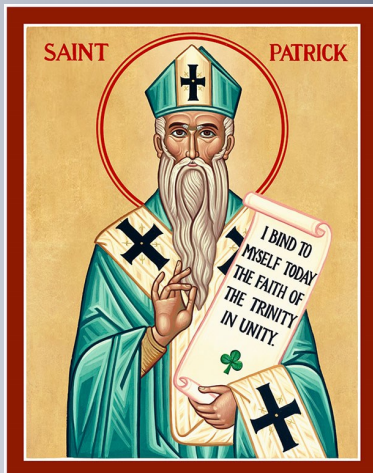

PASTOR'S NOTES -

Fr. George G. Perez CJM - Pastor
12th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus speaks words that are as comforting and relevant today as they were when He first spoke them to His disciples: "Do not be afraid" (Matthew 10:26-33). Three times in this short passage, Jesus repeats this invitation. It is not simply a call to feel less anxious; it is an invitation to place our complete trust in God, even in the midst of uncertainty, hardship, and fear.

Fear is a common part of the human experience. We worry about our health, our families, our finances, and the future. We may also fear rejection, criticism, or standing up for our faith in a world that often misunderstands Christian values. Yet Jesus reminds us that we are never alone. He assures us that our Heavenly Father knows us intimately and cares for us deeply. If God watches over the sparrows, how much more does He watch over His beloved sons and daughters? Jesus tells His disciples that even the hairs of their heads are counted. This beautiful image reminds us that God's love is personal and attentive. Nothing in our lives escapes His notice. Every joy, every struggle, every prayer, and every tear is known to Him. When we place our trust in God, we discover that fear does not have the final word. Faith allows us to move forward with confidence, knowing that God is guiding us every step of the way.

The first reading presents the prophet Jeremiah, who faced ridicule, opposition, and persecution because of his faithfulness to God's message. Despite these hardships, Jeremiah refused to give up. He placed his trust in the Lord, proclaiming that God was at his side as a mighty champion. His example reminds us that discipleship sometimes requires courage and perseverance, especially when it is difficult to live according to the Gospel.

In the second reading, Saint Paul reminds us that through Jesus Christ we have received the gift of salvation. Sin and death do not have the final victory. Christ has conquered evil and opened the gates of eternal life. This truth gives us hope and strength, even when we face challenges that seem overwhelming.

Jesus concludes by encouraging His followers to acknowledge Him before others. Our faith is not meant to remain private or hidden. We are called to witness to Christ through our words, actions, and daily lives. In a world that often struggles with fear and uncertainty, Christians are called to be signs of hope, peace, and trust in God's providence.

As we reflect on this Gospel, may we hear Jesus speaking directly to our hearts: "Do not be afraid." Let us place our confidence in the Lord, knowing that we are deeply loved, carefully watched over, and never abandoned. When we trust in God's presence and care, we can face every challenge with courage, faith, and hope.

**NOTAS DEL PÁRROCO –
P. George G. Pérez, CJM - Párroco -
XII Domingo Ordinario**

En el Evangelio de este domingo, Jesús dirige a sus discípulos unas palabras que también están dirigidas a nosotros:

«**No tengan miedo**» (Mt 10, 26-33). Tres veces en este breve pasaje, el Señor repite esta invitación. No es una simple recomendación para tranquilizarnos; es una llamada a confiar plenamente en Dios aun en medio de las dificultades, incertidumbres y desafíos de la vida.

Todos experimentamos el miedo en algún momento. Tememos por nuestra salud, nuestra familia, nuestro trabajo o el futuro. También podemos sentir miedo de expresar nuestra fe en una cultura que muchas veces rechaza los valores del Evangelio. Sin embargo, Jesús nos recuerda que Dios cuida de nosotros con un amor infinito. Si el Padre celestial conoce hasta el número de cabellos de nuestra cabeza, cuánto más conoce nuestras preocupaciones, sufrimientos y necesidades.

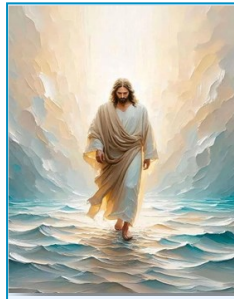
Las palabras de Jesús nos revelan una verdad fundamental: nuestra vida está en las manos de Dios. Esto no significa que estaremos libres de pruebas o dificultades. Los primeros discípulos enfrentaron persecuciones, rechazo e incluso el martirio. Sin embargo, encontraron la fortaleza para perseverar porque sabían que Cristo caminaba con ellos. La confianza cristiana no consiste en creer que nunca tendremos problemas, sino en saber que Dios nunca nos abandona en medio de ellos.

La primera lectura nos presenta al profeta Jeremías, quien experimentó el rechazo, la burla y la persecución por anunciar la Palabra de Dios. A pesar de su sufrimiento, Jeremías no perdió la confianza en el Señor. En lugar de dejarse vencer por el miedo, proclamó que Dios estaba a su lado como un poderoso defensor. Su ejemplo nos recuerda que la fidelidad a Dios puede exigir valentía, pero también nos asegura que el Señor sostiene a quienes confían en Él.

San Pablo, en la segunda lectura, nos recuerda que la salvación es un regalo inmenso que hemos recibido por medio de Jesucristo. El pecado y la muerte no tienen la última palabra. Cristo ha vencido el poder del mal y nos ha abierto el camino hacia la vida eterna. Esta certeza nos permite vivir con esperanza, incluso cuando enfrentamos dificultades.

Jesús concluye el Evangelio invitándonos a reconocerlo delante de los demás. La fe no puede permanecer encerrada únicamente en nuestro corazón. Estamos llamados a dar testimonio de Cristo con nuestras palabras, nuestras acciones y nuestra forma de vivir. En un mundo necesitado de esperanza, cada cristiano está llamado a ser reflejo del amor de Dios.

Que esta semana escuchemos nuevamente la voz de Jesús diciéndonos: «**No tengan miedo.**» Confiemos en la providencia del Padre, permanezcamos firmes en la fe y recordemos que somos infinitamente amados por Dios. Quien pone su confianza en el Señor descubre que ninguna dificultad es más grande que Su amor.

OCIA
Order of Christian Initiation of Adults

Are you or someone you know interested in becoming Catholic?

Whether you have been baptized in another Christian church or never been baptized, OCIA is the process we use to welcome new members into the Church.

It is also for adults who have never finished receiving the sacraments of initiation (for example, they did not receive the Sacrament of Confirmation when they were younger). It is a process of discernment and formation, in the context of the Christian community, which leads to the decision to be fully initiated as a Catholic Christian. This happens when adults receive Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist at the Easter Vigil (next March 27).

A new group will be formed over the summer. Then beginning in early September, candidates attend our formation sessions every Sunday morning immediately after the 9:00 am Mass. They attend the Mass and then meet in the parish hall until 11:00 am. **Attendance is important** and those who miss too many sessions will not be included in the celebration at the Easter Vigil. 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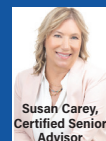
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First Reading

Jeremiah 20:10-13

Jeremiah expresses confidence that the Lord will protect him.

Gospel Reading

Matthew 10:26-33

Jesus assures the Twelve that God cares about them.



Background on the Gospel Reading

We read today's Gospel in the context of last week's Gospel in which Jesus sent the twelve disciples to proclaim the kingdom of heaven. In between last week's reading and today's reading, Jesus has predicted that the disciples will face difficulties in their mission. Many people will not receive them well, even within the land of Israel. Even family members will turn away from the disciples because of the disciples' commitment to Jesus and the kingdom. Today's Gospel offers the disciples consolation against this difficult truth.

This section of Matthew's Gospel should be read in the context of Matthew's intended audience, a Jewish-Christian community. The Gospel alludes to the dangers and persecutions that this community has most likely already faced and will continue to face. To reassure this community, Matthew recalls for them the encouraging words of Jesus that we read today.

In this Gospel passage, Jesus might be understood as putting suffering in perspective. The disciples of Jesus are called upon to keep their focus on God. Those who can harm the body do not have ultimate power; God does. Still persecution and suffering can not be avoided or prevented. But Jesus reassures his disciples that God knows and cares about what happens to his children.

We might not face the same type of persecution, but we do experience difficulties as we endeavor to live a Christian life. Sometimes we let the opinions of others prevent us from doing what we know to be right. We need the reminder that what God thinks about us is more important. We are reassured by the promise that God cares for us and protects us.
