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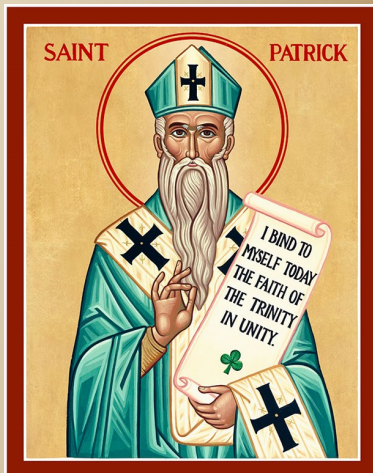

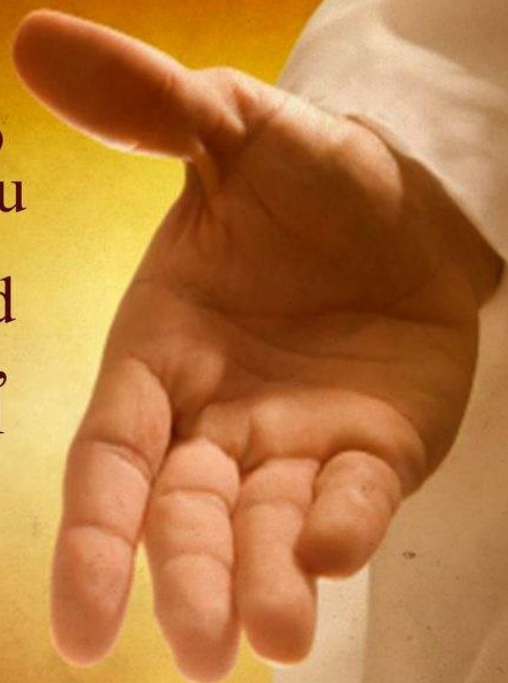

PASTOR'S NOTES -

Fr. George G. Perez CJM - Pastor
14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The readings for this Sunday offer a message of hope and consolation for anyone who feels weary, burdened, or discouraged. In the Gospel, Jesus speaks some of the most comforting words found in all of Sacred Scripture: "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).

All of us experience times of exhaustion. There are physical, emotional, and spiritual burdens that can weigh heavily upon our hearts. Family concerns, financial pressures, illness, personal struggles, and uncertainty about the future can leave us feeling overwhelmed. Jesus understands these challenges. He does not promise a life free from difficulties, but He does promise something greater: His presence, His peace, and His strength.

The Lord continues, "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart." In the time of Jesus, a yoke was used to join two animals together so they could share the work. By inviting us to take His yoke upon ourselves, Jesus reminds us that we do not walk alone. He carries our burdens with us and accompanies us every step of the way. When we try to carry our struggles by ourselves, we become exhausted; when we allow Christ to walk beside us, we discover true rest for our souls. In the first reading, the prophet Zechariah presents the Messiah as a humble king riding on a donkey. He does not come with military power or worldly prestige. Instead, He comes bringing justice, peace, and salvation. In a world that often values success, influence, and status, Jesus teaches us that true greatness is found in humility and service.

Saint Paul, in the second reading, reminds us that we are called to live according to the Spirit rather than according to the flesh. This means allowing God to transform our hearts, our priorities, and our actions. The Holy Spirit gives us the strength to overcome fear, selfishness, and sin, leading us into the freedom and joy that come from living as disciples of Christ.

Today's readings invite us to reflect on several important questions: What burdens am I carrying that I need to place in the hands of the Lord? Am I allowing Christ to walk with me, or am I trying to face everything on my own? Do I strive to imitate the humility and gentleness that characterize the Heart of Jesus?

As we celebrate this Sunday, let us renew our trust in the Lord. Let us bring to Him our worries, our wounds, and our weariness. His Heart remains open to all who seek Him. In Christ, we will always find the rest, peace, and strength we need to continue our journey of faith.

The Word of the Week...

This week's word: **Kerygmatic**

Kerygmatic (adjective) relates to the initial, foundational proclamation of the Gospel message in Christianity, derived from the Greek word kerygma, meaning "proclamation" or "preaching". It centers on the core message of salvation through Jesus Christ: his life, death, resurrection, and the call to repentance and new life.

NOTAS DEL PÁRROCO – P. George G. Pérez, CJM- Párroco - XIV Domingo Ordinario

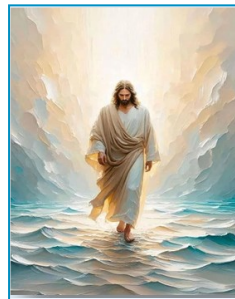
Las lecturas de este domingo nos presentan un mensaje lleno de esperanza para quienes se sienten cansados, agobiados o desanimados. En el Evangelio, Jesús pronuncia una de las invitaciones más hermosas y consoladoras de toda la Sagrada Escritura: “Vengan a mí todos los que están fatigados y agobiados por la carga, y yo les daré alivio” (Mateo 11, 28). Todos experimentamos momentos de cansancio. Hay cargas físicas, emocionales y espirituales que pueden parecer demasiado pesadas. Las preocupaciones familiares, las dificultades económicas, las enfermedades, los conflictos personales y las incertidumbres del futuro pueden desgastar nuestro corazón. Jesús conoce nuestras luchas y no nos promete una vida sin dificultades, pero sí nos ofrece algo mucho más profundo: su presencia, su paz y su fortaleza. El Señor continúa diciendo: “Tomen mi yugo sobre ustedes y aprendan de mí, porque soy manso y humilde de corazón.” En tiempos de Jesús, el yugo era un instrumento utilizado para unir dos animales que trabajaban juntos. Al invitarnos a tomar su yugo, Jesús nos recuerda que no caminamos solos. Él comparte nuestras cargas y nos acompaña en cada paso del camino. Cuando intentamos cargar solos con nuestros problemas, terminamos agotados; cuando permitimos que Cristo camine a nuestro lado, encontramos descanso para nuestra alma.

La primera lectura del profeta Zacarías nos presenta al Mesías como un rey humilde que llega montado en un asno. No viene con poder militar ni con grandes demostraciones de fuerza. Su autoridad nace de la humildad, la justicia y la paz. En un mundo que con frecuencia valora el éxito, el prestigio y el poder, Jesús nos enseña que la verdadera grandeza se encuentra en la sencillez y en el servicio a los demás.

San Pablo, en la segunda lectura, nos recuerda que estamos llamados a vivir según el Espíritu y no según la carne. Esto significa permitir que Dios transforme nuestra manera de pensar, de actuar y de relacionarnos con los demás. El Espíritu Santo nos da la fuerza para vencer el egoísmo, el miedo y el pecado, y nos guía hacia una vida más plena en Cristo.

Las lecturas de hoy nos invitan a preguntarnos: ¿Qué cargas necesito entregar al Señor? ¿Estoy permitiendo que Cristo camine conmigo o intento resolverlo todo por mis propias fuerzas? ¿Busco la humildad y la mansedumbre que caracterizan el corazón de Jesús?

Que este domingo renovemos nuestra confianza en el Señor. Acerquémonos a Él con nuestras preocupaciones, heridas y cansancios. Su corazón permanece abierto para recibirnos y ofrecernos el descanso que tanto necesitamos. En Cristo siempre encontraremos paz, esperanza y fortaleza para continuar nuestro camino de fe

Registration for the school year 2026-2027

We offer faith formation for students in Preschool through Jr. High school.

Preparation for the sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, and First Holy Communion for children from first grade through middle school is a two-year program. We offer classes on Sunday mornings and Monday and Tuesday afternoon. Families choose the weekly class time that best fits their schedule.

- ◆ In Year One Pre-Communion classes children memorize prayers, create faith journals, learn about the communion of saints and participate in devotions and service opportunities.
- ◆ The Year Two Communion Classes prepare the children to understand and celebrate the sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion. Parents are accompanied in their own faith learning to celebrate those milestones with their children.

Confirmation Registrations Now Open

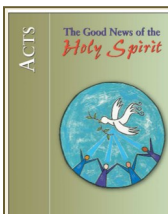
Our Confirmation program is a two-year journey! To get started for the 2026–2027 school year, teens must be entering high school (9th grade or higher).

Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time – Year A

First Reading

Zechariah 9:9-10

The Lord shall come to reign in Zion.

Responsorial Psalm

Background on the Gospel Reading

Today's reading from Matthew's Gospel comes after a discourse in which Jesus reproaches people who have witnessed his mighty deeds yet still lack belief. In this context, today's Gospel explains the reason for this unbelief and reveals what is necessary for faith. Today's Gospel also continues to enhance our understanding of discipleship as last week's Gospel did.

Jesus first prays in thanksgiving to God who has made himself known to Jesus' disciples. He praises God who has made himself known to the "little ones" and not to the wise and learned. As in other recent readings from Matthew's Gospel, a contrast is made here between the unbelieving Pharisees, who are wise and learned, and the faithful disciples, tax collectors, and sinners with whom Jesus keeps company.

The second part of this reading calls to our attention the unity between the Father and the Son. God has made himself known through Jesus, and in knowing Jesus, we come to know the Father. In Jesus' life and in his person, God reveals himself to us.

In the concluding sentences of today's Gospel, Jesus' teaching is again contrasted to the teaching of the Pharisees. This common theme of Matthew's Gospel probably reflects tension that existed between Jesus and the Pharisees and between the Pharisees and the community of Christians for whom Matthew wrote. Pharisaic Judaism became the predominant form of Judaism after the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem about 70 A.D. Here that tension is expressed as alternative paths of holiness. The careful observance of the Mosaic law taught by the Pharisees could be experienced by some as difficult and burdensome. In contrast, Jesus' way of holiness is presented as uncomplicated and even restful.
