





A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

This weekend we celebrate **Friendship Weekend**. That's what we call it in Buffalo anyway. Whenever **Canada Day** (July 1) and **U.S. Independence Day** (July 4) fall on the same weekend, we use the occasion to celebrate our friendship with our northern neighbors.

Having grown up in a border town, I have many Canadian friends. I also studied theology for two years in Ottawa, Ontario where I also worked in the Archdiocesan Youth Office. When I was ordained in 1977, a large contingent of my friends from Ottawa came to Buffalo for my ordination. They presented me with a very large coffee table book entitled *Between Friends/Entre Amis*. This book was published as Canada's gift to the U.S on the occasion of the U.S Bicentennial celebration. It contains beautiful pictures of the entire US-Canadian border.

The United States and Canada have been friends, partners, and allies for more than 150 years, and our bilateral relationship is one of the closest and most comprehensive in the world. The United States and Canada collaborate on a daily basis to secure and share the world's longest land border – 5,525 miles – and its 120 land ports-of-entry. **This is the longest peaceful border in the world.** The \$1.9 billion worth of goods and services that cross our border every day are a testament to the depth and breadth of our economic relationship. The United States and Canada are stalwart allies, and U.S. defense arrangements with Canada are more extensive than with any other country in the world.

On this weekend, we thank God for this wonderful relationship. In a world where there are so many conflicts and territorial disputes, we are blessed to have such a strong relationship with our northern neighbors.

As we thank the Lord for this wonderful relationship, let us offer a **prayer of thanks for the freedom we enjoy as a nation, a freedom that our neighbor also shares.** And let us also pray for all those areas of our world that do not enjoy peace and freedom, but suffer daily the agonies of war, terrorism and oppression. May the Lord stand by them and watch over them. May the Spirit of Peace guide them and protect them.



Bishop McElroy Issues Statement about Abortion Ruling by the U.S. Supreme Court

On the day of the Supreme Court ruling on abortion (June 24, 2022), Bishop Robert McElroy issued a statement. Only portions of his statement have been reported in the media. Here is the entire statement of Bishop McElroy.

Today is a day to give thanks and celebrate. Catholic social teaching holds that life begins at conception, which is a belief shared by millions of Americans regardless of religious faith. The ruling by the Supreme Court in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* affirms that belief and recognizes the ability of states to regulate abortion to protect the rights of the unborn.

While we celebrate this decision — the culmination of prayer and decades of legislative advocacy, life-affirming events, committing time and resources to pregnancy centers, and walking with families facing an unplanned pregnancy— in many ways, our work has just begun.

We must work to ensure that California law protects the rights of the unborn. And we must emphasize that being pro-life demands more than opposition to abortion.

It demands we do everything we can to support families, to provide access to quality healthcare, affordable housing, good jobs and decent housing. It means making sure parents and families have access to affordable childcare, so that being a parent doesn't force women and families to drop out of school or leave the job market. It also means reinvigorating our adoption system, to make sure there are options for women and families who are unable or unwilling, for whatever reason, to take on the responsibilities of parenthood.

Liturgy of the Word for children during the 9am mass

Children ages 4-9 that attend mass with their family can hear the Word of God in language they can understand and reflect on in their own words. Following the Opening Prayer, the presider calls forth the children, and we send them along with the adult catechist to the church basement classroom. The catechist will proclaim the readings from the Lectionary for Masses with Children and provide simple age-appropriate activities based on the weekend Scriptures. The children then return to their family at the time of the Offertory to continue the celebration of the Eucharist with the entire assembly.

Reflection: 14th Sunday of Ordinary Time

Jesus sends his disciples in pairs ahead of him to every town and place he intends to visit. What matters most to him is to make people understand that the reign of God is at hand. Time is short; the harvest (people who have not heard the good news of the gospel) is ready now.


Jesus instructs the disciples to go quickly and travel light. They are to spread his peace, cure the sick, and proclaim the reign of God. On their mission the disciples depend on the hospitality that is offered to them. When they encounter peaceful people, the peace they carry will be extended.

Children: How can you be a peacemaker this week?

Prayer: Jesus, help us to spread your peace.

Fourteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time – Year C

First Reading

Isaiah 66:10-14c

I will spread prosperity over Jerusalem like a river.

Responsorial Psalm

Psalm 123:1-4

Our eyes are fixed on the Lord.

Second Reading

Galatians 6:14-18

May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel Reading

Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus sends out 72 people to announce the coming kingdom.



Background on the Gospel Reading

Today's Gospel begins immediately after the final verse in last Sunday's Gospel. After strong language about the difficulties of discipleship, Jesus immediately appoints 72 people to go ahead of him to every town and place he plans to visit, proclaiming that the Kingdom of God is at hand. He sends them in pairs. In the Law of Moses two witnesses were needed for a testimony to be credible. It was probably also a safer way to travel.

Jesus admits it will be difficult, that he is sending them out like lambs among wolves. Yet they are to bring nothing with them, not even a money bag or sandals. They are to greet no one on the way so as not to be distracted from their mission. When they enter a house, their message is simply "peace." The response they will receive may be positive or negative. Either way, they are to know that the Kingdom of God is at hand. They are not to demand special treatment but eat and drink whatever is given them. They are to stay in one house and are not to look around for one that provides better accommodations. They are to heal the sick as a sign that the Kingdom of God is at hand for them. Like Jesus' miracles, healing is a sign of the coming of the kingdom. If the town will not receive them, they are to shake the dust from their feet and move on. Even in the case of such rejection they should know that the Kingdom of God is at hand.

When they return from their journeys, they are rejoicing because their mission has been successful. Demons were under their power because of Jesus' name. Jesus may have sent them out as lambs among wolves, but at the conclusion of this passage he assures them that they have been given power over the enemy and nothing will harm them, not even serpents and scorpions.

A key theme of today's Gospel and last Sunday's Gospel is discipleship—its challenges, its difficulties, and its rewards. Sharing in the mission of Jesus is difficult, but everyone is called to do it, not just some professionals trained for ministry. Even for us today, the harvest is plentiful. We should pray to the master of the harvest to send out workers for his harvest.
