Somerset Hills YMCA Highlights - October 2022

AQUATICS:

- Aquatics welcomed a new Lifeguard and Swim Instructor, Gabriel, who recently moved here from Brazil. As a lifelong YMCA Member turned Staff, Gabriel sought out the Y when he immigrated to America. He landed with us at Somerset Hills YMCA and works in three different departments!
- Registrations for the "Fall 2" program session are booming! Aquatics currently has 208 swimmers registered for classes this session. Our competitive training program FAST has 30 total participants.

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT:

- The students in our early education program participated in our Hispanic Heritage Month art show through their own unique drawings and paintings that were put on display at the branch. A parent of one of our students came to the center to share her Hispanic heritage and traditional dance with us.
- We hosted our first paint-and-sip event in October and welcomed about 10 participants who painted Hispanic Heritage Month themed pictures on mini canvases.
- Our School Age Child Care (before/after school care) is currently maxed out at both schools we serve, Bedminster Elementary and Bedwell Elementary. A total of 85 children are enrolled in our program.

WELLNESS:

- To enhance our unique and innovative offerings, Wellness launched a variety of new programs this fall including the mini trampoline class, recreational walks and fitness hikes, La Blast Line Dancing, ultra-FX circuit training, and more. Classes fill daily and member feedback has been very positive.
- In anticipation of an exciting January launch, seven Group Exercise Instructors received their certification for Les Mills Body Pump in October. The addition of these new classes in 2023 will add significant value and build trust with new members who have taken these popular classes before.
- The Memory Café had participation from four individuals and their caretakers in the month of October.

MEMBERSHIP:

- In October, 155 new memberships were sold at Somerset Hills YMCA. Of the 155 new memberships, our service representatives were able to call ALL of them to welcome them to the Y and build connection. Kudos!
- The membership team has begun making connection calls to our "missing in action" members to encourage their participation with the Y after time away.
- October Family Fun Night was a lot of fun. We welcomed about 30 families to the Rock Wall, Gymnastics Room, and Family Swim available from 6-8PM. Building family connection has been a bright spot for us.

VOLUNTEERS / COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIPS / CONNECTIONS:

- SHY Early Education is working with *Community Options Inc.* to provide job skills training to students with special needs. Two students intern with us weekly assisting with lesson prep, lunch, and nap/bathroom transitions, among other vital prep work for the center.
- The Facilities Team continues to partner with Ridge High School to provide students with special needs an opportunity to gain job skills at the Y. A total of 13 students provided 231 hours of support to the facilities department in October.
- SHY hosted two more Saturdays in Motion events in October with continued leadership from Art Raynes. Volunteers from various Rutgers University Sports Teams continue to make each event extra special for our families and participants.
- We were thrilled to, once again, partner with Regeneron on their 2022 Day for Doing Good. On October 27, we hosted a lovely breakfast to honor our local veterans in advance of Veterans Day. The children in our pre-school graced the event by singing patriotic songs for the veterans and sharing heartfelt, handmade cards with them. 125 Veterans were served through the donation of winter warmth kits (hats, gloves, socks) and 35 Veterans were served breakfast at the event.
