Attachment: Letter from Preschool 2 Teacher Early Education Center, Somerset Hills YMCA

I have been teaching pre-k at our Early Education Center for 9 years! What I love most about my job is building long lasting relationships with my students and their families. When my students walk through my door each September, they not only become my students for 11 months, but part of our family here at the YMCA. I love connecting the families with one another, and seeing them utilize all of the wonderful programs that the Y has to offer the community. I enjoy seeing my students "grow" at the Y, as they move on from our EEC to eventually attend summer camp each year and all of the other programs that we offer. The children who come through our programs know that the Y is a safe place for them to ALWAYS come back to.

We currently have a total of 7 financial assistance students enrolled in our EEC, and two of those students are in my class. The families that are on financial assistance heavily rely on the YMCA to provide a safe, educational, and caring environment for their children to learn and thrive. During the pandemic, many of these families relied on our food security program to put food on their tables. I honestly don't know where some of our financial assistance students would be if it weren't for the Y. It's a truly incredible experience getting to see the impact first hand each and every day when I come to work.

One of our current students on financial assistance started with us in September. He is 3 years old and had never been in a school setting before. In September, he was developmentally behind in many areas. His verbal communication skills were non-existent (he couldn't form any words), he was unsure how to act around other children, and had a difficult time following the classroom routine. It was very clear that this child was socially, emotionally, and cognitively behind. Here we are in April, 8 months later, and this child is THRIVING in all areas. He is one of the happiest children I have ever seen. He is starting to form not only words but sentences, he has friends, and he follows the class routine. He is learning alongside his peers and he's on the right track for success. If this child didn't have the opportunity to come to the YMCA's EEC, he would have struggled when entering kindergarten. This child has one more school year with us, and I can confidently say that he will be prepared for kindergarten this time next year.

In addition to building relationships with my students and their families, I genuinely love being part of an inclusive organization that welcomes all types of families regardless of their financial status. The price of childcare is costly, and our student population would be a lot different if we didn't offer financial assistance. The children on financial assistance would most likely be with a nanny or family member because the cost of childcare is out of reach for them. I recently had a parent tell me that the #1 reason she chose our EEC for her child was because of the diversity here.







All children are deserving of a safe, loving, and educational experience. I am so happy that the students in my care get to come to the Y each day to have the amazing experiences that they do here. They are learning how to be caring, honest, responsible, and respectful humans, and I think that's incredibly important.
