When: Day 5 of VBS

What: Your child will wear a fun, creative costume representing their team.

Jaguar Journeyman

- Add jaguar spots (face paint, stickers, or drawn-on)
 - Wear animal ears if you have them
 - Create a simple jungle cat look
-

Toucan Trailblazers

- Make a colorful paper beak
 - Add bright accessories or feathers
 - Create a simple bird-inspired outfit

Anaconda Adventurers

- Wear long, simple clothing to represent a snake
 - Add drawn or paper scales
 - Use green or neutral pieces you already have

Macaw Missionaries

- Add feathers or make simple wings
 - Wear a bird mask or use face paint
 - Keep the look bright and bold

Piranha Pioneers

- Draw or attach fish scales
 - Make a simple fin or fish detail
 - Keep it quick and creative
-



Sloth Scouts

- Wear a relaxed, cozy outfit
 - Add a simple sloth face or mask
 - Keep the look easy and comfortable

Howler Heroes

- Add monkey ears or a tail
 - Use simple face paint if available
 - Focus on basic jungle animal features
-



Tapir Trackers

- Add simple animal ears or a nose
 - Use neutral clothing as a base
 - Keep it simple and creative
-

Tree Frog Troop

- Make big frog eyes with a headband or paper
 - Draw simple face details
 - Keep it bright and fun
-

Butterfly Battalion

- Make or wear wings
 - Add antennae (headband or craft)
 - Use patterns or fun designs
-

Ocelot Operators

- Add spots and cat-like features
 - Wear ears or draw whiskers
 - Keep the look simple and bold
-

Harpy Hawk Hunters

- Add wings or feather details
 - Create a simple bird mask or beak
 - Keep it clean and easy
-

Caiman Crew

- Draw or add simple scales
 - Add a tail if possible
 - Use textures or patterns if available
-

Rainforest Rangers

- Add leaves, vines, or nature elements
 - Dress like part of the jungle
 - Keep it simple and nature-inspired
-

Catzel Chasers

- Add ears, whiskers, or a tail
 - Create a simple jungle cat look
 - Keep it easy and fun
-

Volunteer Reminder

- Dress up too—**it matters more than you think**
- Encourage every child (even something small counts!)
- Celebrate effort—not appearance
- Make sure **everyone feels included**
