

It's my Information – Keep it Safe

Most people are unaware of how their information is used: care sector can do more!

Michelle Corrigan, Programme Director of Better Security, Better Care explores why care providers need to do more to share with service users how their information is used.

We're all more aware of how our information is used.

We've seen how our online searches and purchases, or what we share about ourselves on social media can be used to target us with information (and misinformation).

But what about the often very personal details that we share about our health and care needs? Do we really consider how that information is managed?

According to a project – It's my information: Keep it safe – which the Better Security, Better Care programme commissioned from the Liverpool Social Care Partnership, most people don't.

But once they are made aware of the issue, they recognise it as really important, and it could impact on their choice of care services.



For example, one person involved in the project told us, 'I never thought about information safety influencing my choice of care providers before now, but it is concerning because of cybercrimes, cloning of IDs, wars and so on. It is something that I would now 100% take into account.'

Share it with people seeking care.

Use it as evidence where relevant for the Care Quality Commission, commissioners, NHS partners, bids, data suppliers etc.
