FULLY DIGITISED CARE: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

ALL PROVIDERS MUST COMPLETE THE DSPT NOW AS A LEGAL REQUIREMENT AND ARE EXPECTED TO IMPLEMENT AN NHS-ASSURED DSCR BY THE END OF THIS PARLIAMENT.



The Department of Health and Social Care expects all CQC-registered care providers to become fully digitised by the end of this Parliament.

This means:

- Using an NHS England-assured Digital Social Care Record (DSCR)
- Achieving 'Standards Met' on the Data Security and Protection Toolkit (DSPT)

DSPT IS MANDATORY

Completion of the DSPT is a **legal requirement** for all CQC-regulated adult social care providers in England under the Health and Social Care Act 2012 (as amended in 2022).

The DSPT covers how you protect information about people who use your services, staff, partners and visitors — across both digital and paper records.

Achieving 'Standards Met' also enables access to NHSmail, GP Connect and Shared Care Records.

ASSURED DSCRs ARE THE EXPECTATION

Providers are expected to use a DSCR from the NHS England Assured Solutions List.

Assured systems meet national standards for safety, security and interoperability and support access to GP information.

Unassured systems may not be able to connect to future national systems, including the developing Single Patient Record.

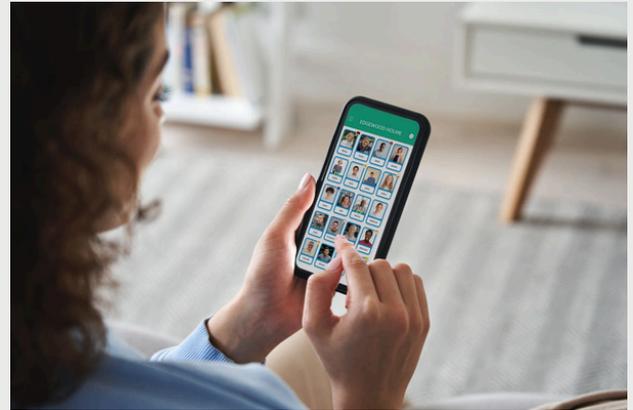

FREE DIGITAL HEALTHCARE CHECK



A free check-up for your data and cyber security

Keeping people's information safe is part of everyday care. But with so many other pressures, it can be hard to know whether your data protection and cyber security arrangements are really where they should be.

That is why we are offering a free Data Protection and Cyber Security Healthcheck for social care providers.

This is a friendly, supportive visit, not an inspection. We come to your service to talk through how you use data and technology in practice, what is working well and where there may be opportunities to strengthen things further. There is no judgement, it is simply a conversation about how things work in your service.

During the visit, we will look at four main areas. These include,

- How staff understand their data protection responsibilities,
- How information flows through your service,
- What policies and procedures you have in place and
- What cyber security and business continuity measures you use day to day.

We can also run a simple technical check on Windows computers if you are happy for us to do so.

After the visit, you will receive a short and confidential report with clear feedback and signposting to support if needed. The health check can also be used as evidence for CQC to show proactive work around data security and partnership working, which may help during inspection.

The health check is part of the government funded Better Security Better Care programme, so you can be confident that the advice and guidance is up to date and relevant to social care.

If you would like a bit of reassurance, practical advice or simply a chance to talk things through with someone who understands the sector, this is a great opportunity.

Learning Hour with Birdie Digital Social Care Record

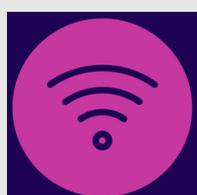

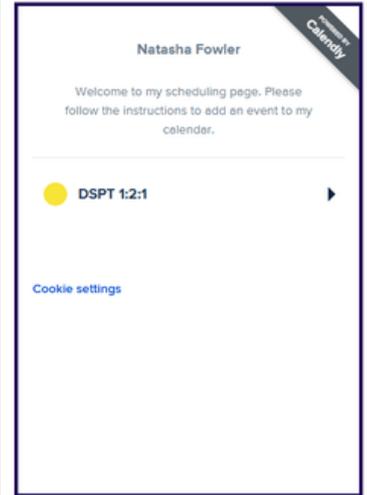

The Data Security and Protection Toolkit (DSPT) is an online self-assessment tool to help adult social care providers in England to store and share information safely.

It shows you what you need to do to keep people's information safe, and to protect your business from the risk of a data breach or a cyber attack. It covers both paper and digital records.

It will cover how to:

- Register for the DSPT - including how to register if you have multiple services and sites
- Complete to Approaching Standards and Standards Met
- Publish your DSPT
- Access free, official support from the Better Security, Better Care programme.

PRACTICAL USE OF MICROSOFT 365 COPILOT IN SOCIAL CARE

MICROSOFT 365 COPILOT IS BEING IMPLEMENTED IN SOCIAL CARE TO REDUCE THE HEAVY ADMINISTRATIVE BURDEN ON PROFESSIONALS, ALLOWING THEM TO FOCUS MORE ON DIRECT CLIENT INTERACTION. IT IS USED TO AUTOMATE ROUTINE DOCUMENTATION, SUMMARISE LONG, COMPLEX CASE FILES, AND STREAMLINE COMMUNICATION, WITH TRIALS INDICATING SIGNIFICANT TIME SAVINGS—SOMETIMES UP TO SEVERAL HOURS A WEEK PER STAFF MEMBER.

Learn how the paid version of Microsoft 365 Copilot can be used safely and realistically in day to day work within existing Microsoft 365

Microsoft 365 Copilot is increasingly being introduced across social care organisations, but many teams are unsure how it can be used in day-to-day work and how to do so safely.

This 45-minute remote session is aimed at social care providers who wish to explore the features of the paid version of Microsoft 365 Copilot. It will focus on practical, realistic demonstrations rather than theory or technical setup.

Microsoft 365 Copilot works within your organisation's existing Microsoft 365 environment and uses the same access permissions as the rest of Microsoft 365. It only has access to data that each individual user is already permitted to see, and content used in Copilot prompts and outputs is not used to train the underlying foundation models or any public AI services.

All data processed by Copilot remains subject to your existing Microsoft 365 security, retention, and compliance controls. This makes it fundamentally different from public or consumer AI tools, such as ChatGPT, which are not governed by your organisation's Microsoft 365 security and compliance boundary

TRUSTING THE TECH: USING PASSWORD MANAGERS AND PASSKEYS TO HELP YOU STAY SECURE ONLINE

In today's digital age, trust is the new currency. We entrust our devices with everything – our communications, our identities, our finances, and even our memories. But when it comes to online security, many of us hesitate, and ask:

- Should I really save my password in my browser?
- Is a password manager actually safe?
- What is a passkey?

These are all valid questions. And the short answer is:

Yes, you can trust the tech – but it's important to understand what choices you're making

TAKE YOUR EMAIL SECURITY TO ANOTHER LEVEL

Your email is where you keep your most personal and financial information.

If a cyber criminal accesses your email, they could:

- access your other online accounts using the 'forgot password' feature (which often sends you an email)
- access personal or business information and use this to scam you or people you know

Action 1 - Turn on 2-Step Verification (2SV) for your email

2-Step Verification (2SV) gives you twice the protection so even if cyber criminals have your password, they can't access your email.

2SV works by asking for more information to prove your identity. For example, getting a code sent to your phone when you sign in using a new device or change settings such as your password.

You won't be asked for this every time you check your email.

Action 2 - Use a strong and different password for your email using 3 random words

Your email password should be strong and different from all your other passwords.

Combining 3 random words that each mean something to you is a great way to create a password that is easy to remember but hard to crack.

Do not use words that can be guessed (like your pet's name). You can include numbers and symbols if needed. For example, "Hippo!PizzaRocket1"

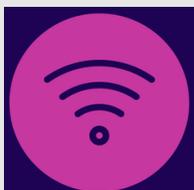
