from the Pastor...



As we come around to the beginning of November we come upon a church holiday that is fairly significant. It is All Saints Day. You may think that this is for people who've lived exemplary lives, but that isn't necessarily it. A lot

of meaning is packed into All Saints Day. We remember, of course, those everyday saints from our congregation who have 'fallen asleep' in the Lord during the past year. I say 'fallen asleep' because that is how Jesus often characterized death—as falling asleep. So, we remember those we have lost among us from the 'Church Militant', who have now been transferred, by God, to the 'Church Triumphant' in heaven. Their names will be spoken and a chime rung, and for each family there will be a rose on the altar that is given in remembrance of their loved one to the family at the end of the service.

It is also a day where we remember the new brothers and sisters among us who we were blessed to baptize and who have joined the family of God through the Sacrament of Baptism. There are little tea lights representing each one of these new Christians on the baptismal font. Of course, there is no way that on this day we each do not remember our own loved ones, friends or family whom we miss. We remember their lives, their influence on our faith lives, and how much we learned from and loved them. We give thanks for all the 'saints' whose lives have intersected ours and had an impact on our faith; whether grandparents, parents, siblings, friends, teachers, pastors—whomever God has used to influence us and teach us faith.

Luther would remind us that we are all, simultaneously both saint and sinner. There's no saint who's not a sinner, no sinner who is not also a saint. On All Saints Day we give thanks to all those who have kept the faith, who have enlarged it, and exemplified faith in their lives. And we realize that we too are part of the body of Christ and will one day be reunited with our loved ones who have gone before us and make up the 'great crowd of witnesses' before whom we live out our lives of faith.

May each of us consider, in this month of Thanksgiving, who all the 'saints' are that have taught us, gathered us, encouraged us and somehow touched us with the love of Christ. I believe if you actually sit down with a pen and paper, you might be surprised at all the ways that the Lord has found to touch you and draw you to himself through others.

May our hearts be thankful for the wonderful saints in our lives, and may we be truly thankful for all our many blessings. All glory to God.



Many Americans mistakenly believe that Veterans Day is the day America sets aside to honor American military personel who died in battle or as a resul of would sustained from combat. That's not quite true. Memorial Day is the day set aside to honor American's war dead.

Veterans Day, on the other hand, honors ALL American veterans, both living and dead. In fact, Veterans Day is largely intended to thank LIVING veterans for dedicated and loyal service to their country.

November 11 of each year is the day that we ensure vetereans know that we deeply appreciate the sacrifices they have made in their lives to keep our country free.

Veterans Day is a U.S. legal holiday dedicated to American veterans of all wars. In 1918, on the 11<sup>th</sup> hour of the 11<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month, an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, was declared between the Allied natioins and Germany in World War I, then known as the "the Great War." Commemorated in many countries as Armistice Day the following year, November 11<sup>th</sup> became a federal holiday in the Uniteds States in 1938. In the aftermath of World War II and the Korean War, Armistice Day became legally known as Veterans Day.
