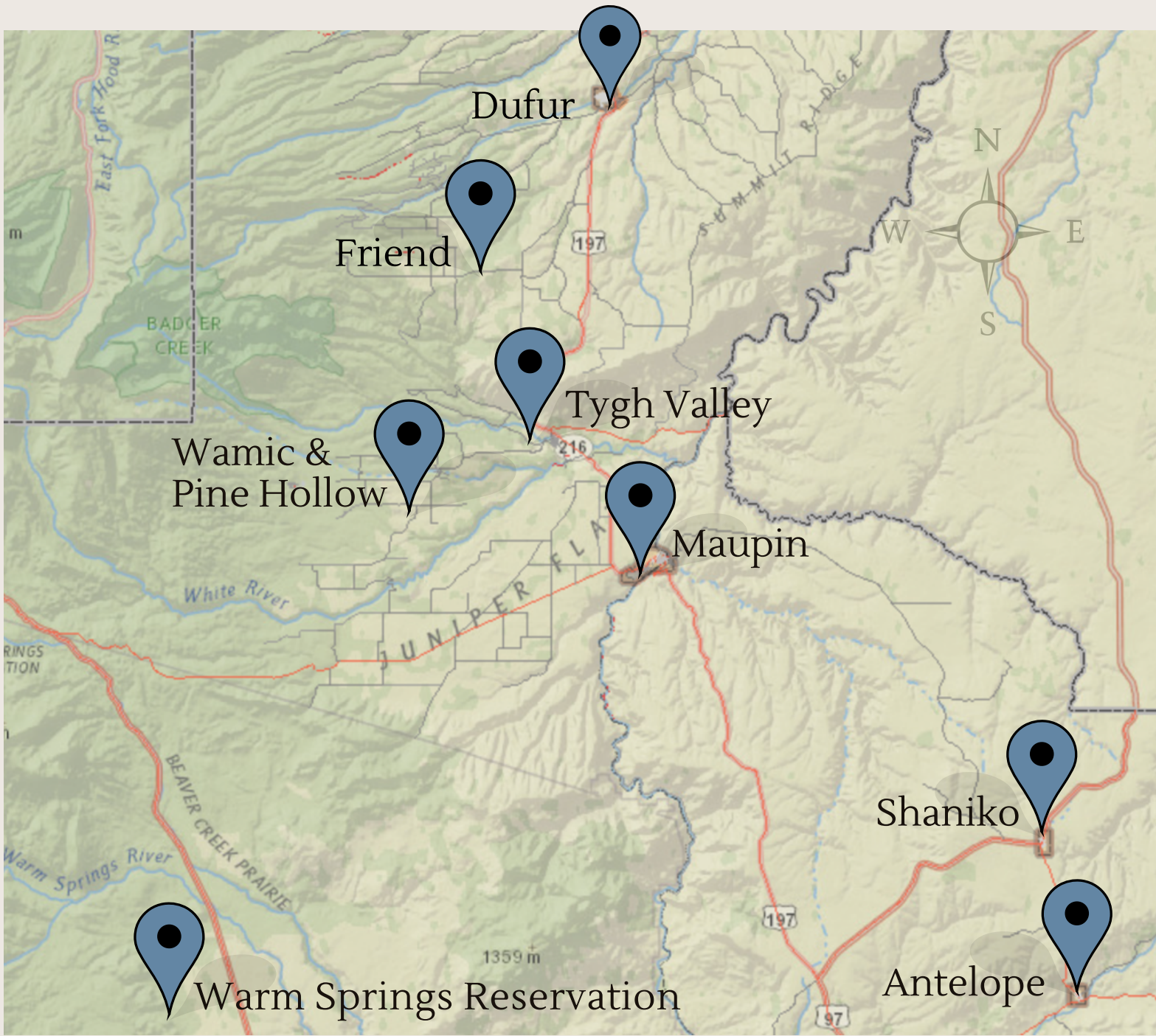

# Indigenous Land Acknowledgment

As we welcome you to the communities and places of South Wasco County, we acknowledge and honor that this region is the ancestral territory of the Tenino tribes. The Tenino people, commonly known today as the Warm Springs Bands, were among many tribes who inhabited territory along the Columbia River and its tributaries and spoke dialects of the Sahaptin (Ichishkiin) language. The Tygh (Taih, Tyigh) subtribe of the Tenino resided in South Wasco County at Tygh Valley (Tayxłáma) and Sherar's Bridge (Tíłxniłáma) as well as along the Warm Springs River on present day Confederated Tribes of Warm Springs Reservation land (Mliłáma). Three other subtribes of the Tenino were the Wyam, also known as "Celilo Indians" (Wayámłáma, Wayámpam) the Dalles Tenino or "Tinainu" (Tinaynułáma) and the Dock-Spus (Tukspush) (Takspastáma) or "John Day."

In 1855, Joel Palmer, the Bureau of Indian Affairs Superintendent for the Oregon Territory, negotiated a series of treaties with indigenous tribes of the Pacific Northwest to obtain much of their land. Under the provisions of the 1855 Middle Oregon Treaty, the Wasco and Warm Springs tribes ceded 10 million acres to the United States, with just over half a million acres reserved in a remote corner of their territory for what became the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Springs Reservation, part of which lies within Wasco County. The reserved treaty rights of tribes to harvest fish, game and other foods in their usual and accustomed places off reservation lands was protected in the treaty. Tribes were relocated to the reservation after the treaty was ratified in 1859.

We offer this acknowledgment in gratitude to this place and to honor the lives, legacies and descendants of its indigenous people. We recognize the history of colonialism that exists here and make this acknowledgement as a first step in raising awareness about local indigenous culture and the continued disenfranchisement of Indigenous populations today. The Teninos and other American Indians are living people with a present and a future as well as a past. Today the Warm Springs Reservation is home to over 3,300 residents from the Wasco, Paiute and Warm Springs bands and total tribal enrollment exceeds 5,000. We encourage you to visit and support indigenous owned businesses and tribal institutions as you explore north Central Oregon.

### Antelope, Oregon (population 37)

Beginning in 1863, Antelope was a stagecoach and freight town; a pit-stop along the road between The Dalles and Canyon City. Antelope also became a well-established ranching and sheep herding community, with sheep shipped in from countries like Scotland, Australia and Spain. By 1911, the town's boom began to decline with the coming of railroads and the decline of sheep raising. During the 1980's, the town of Antelope—the town council, store, school, everything but the post office—became owned by the Rajneesh movement. With the disruptions of the Rajneesh years fading in the town's collective memory, Antelope carries on in the present day with a whole lot of history!

### Barlow Road

The Barlow Road was a part of the Oregon Trail and was authorized by the Oregon Legislature in 1845 as an alternative to the dangerous and expensive route that used rafts to transport wagons down the Columbia River. From The Dalles, Sam Barlow, Joel Palmer, William Rector and 30 wagons headed south to Tygh Valley to find a route around Mount Hood on their way to the Willamette Valley, and thus the "Barlow Road" was born. After Tygh Valley (which some folks consider the start of the Barlow Road), they turned west and generally followed the White River before heading north through Barlow Pass and Government Camp, on to the community of Sandy, eventually arriving at Oregon City.

### Dufur Living History Museum

In 1976 the Dufur Historical Society restored the historic Schreiber log cabin, built in 1901, to become Dufur's Living History Museum. The museum features pioneer-era historical exhibits, textiles & weavings, photographs, farm implements and more. Admission by donation. ### Friend - An Oregon Ghost Town

The town of Friend once served local farmers, sheepherders and loggers as the end of the line for the Great Southern Railroad, a 41-mile line that connected The Dalles to Dufur. The railroad started in 1904 and completely ceased operation in 1936. There is very little left of the physical tracks today—or the town that once stood as its end. The old general store and 1909 one-room schoolhouse remain, as well as the Friend Cemetery where the town's own founder, homesteader George Friend is laid to rest.

### Imperial Stock Ranch

It's not common to find a privately held ranch whose headquarters is a National Historic District. Imperial Stock Ranch has a history of more than 145 years, and is deeply rooted in visionary thinking and the implementation of sustainable practices. From the headquarters complex- comprised of 18 buildings dating back to the historic period of the ranch (1871 to 1945), to the homestead cabins, Native American sites, cattle operations, and sheep production, our tours offer a rich, immersive experience. ### Maupin Section Foreman House Historic Site

The historic Maupin Section Foreman's House, known as the Depot House was constructed in 1910 by the Des Chutes Railroad Company, a subsidiary of the Union Pacific Railroad. The property went into private ownership when the Des Chutes Railroad was abandoned in the 1930's. In 1968, The BLM acquired the property and in 2006 it was listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Depot House is unstaffed but visitors are welcome to visit. • Directions: from State HWY 197, drive 0.25 miles south on the Deschutes River Access Road. The site is on the left.

### Shaniko, Oregon (population 37)

Shaniko began as a wool processing and export platform for the railroad, earning the title as the "Wool Capitol of the World" in 1900. At the time of incorporation in 1901, it had a bank, a newspaper, a two-story wooden city hall/fire station/jail, several hotels & saloons, a post office and a school. Shaniko's fate was dramatically changed in 1911, when the Oregon-Washington Railroad and Navigation Company opened a route between Portland and Bend through the Deschutes River Canyon. Today Shaniko is a bonafide Ghost Town. Plan your visit between April & September during the tourist season and be sure to visit the Shaniko Hotel & the Shaniko Sage Museum.

## Sherar's Falls

This region of Oregon, what is now called south Wasco County, was originally inhabited by the Tyx' band of the Warm Springs Tribe. In the mid 1800's, pioneers began traveling through the area, seeking a safer route to the coast than through the Columbia River basin. The Tyx' accompanied pioneers down the hill from present day Grass Valley, through Buck Hollow, safely across the Deschutes River, and eventually to the route of the new Barlow Trail near present day Tygh Valley. At Sherar's Falls, weary and hungry pioneers rested and gained strength for the rest of their journey, feasting with the Tyx people on roots, berries, eels (lamprey) and deer meat. The chinook salmon run peaks at Sherar's Falls from May - June, but continues until October, and remains a significant fishing & cultural site of the Warm Springs tribes.

## Smock Prairie Schoolhouse / Wamic Historical Museum

The Barlow road opened in 1846, allowing a land route that avoided the treacherous Columbia River rapids. Where the Oregon Trail ended at the Dalles, emigrants could travel south on old Native American trails to Tygh valley. The road then entered the forest east of Wamic just north of Smock Prairie, the original location of Historical Schoolhouse #44, which opened in 1906. The school was in operation until 1956, serving grades 1-8. A true relic of a by-gone era, the schoolhouse is complete with desks, a stove, and other items and equipment of the day. Located in downtown Wamic.

## The Museum at Warm Springs

Visitors to The Museum At Warm Springs will experience firsthand the sounds of ancient songs and languages, the mastery of traditional craftsmen and the sights of rich and colorful cultures that make up the Confederated Tribes of The Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon. During the summer weekends, you can witness live demonstrations by Tribal Members of the arts, history and culture. ### Barlow Ranger District - Mt. Hood National Forest

The Barlow Ranger District is a US Forest Service District located on the the East side of Mt. Hood. There are extensive trail systems within the district. Look for hikes in the Badger Creek Wilderness & Lower White River Wilderness for the closest proximity to Maupin.

### Criterion Ranch Hike

A little-known great hike begins south of Maupin on Hwy 197 at about milepost 57. On the west side of the highway is a parking spot next to radio towers. That's about as much of a guidepost as you get. This is the old Criterion Ranch Trail. Mostly it follows power lines along an old ranch trail that turned into a firebreak during a wildfire in 2011. The trail ends at a remarkable overlook of the Deschutes River—the reward for your four-hour, eleven-mile hike.

### Deschutes River Athletic Complex

The brand-new Maupin DRAC is a state-of-the-art track and field facility with sweeping views of the Deschutes River. Equipped with 8 lanes and an inside rail, the facility is suitable for international events and also open to the public. When complete, the DRAC will include a plaza with hookups for food trucks, a grassy area for camping, and an event stage for concerts.

### Dufur City Park

Dufur City Park runs along the scenic 15-mile creek and is a great place for a picnic lunch, ball game, birthday party or weekend campout. ### Lower Deschutes River Back Country Byway

The north end of the byway is comprised of 10 paved miles along the Lower Deschutes Access Road, which runs along the eastern bank of the river, and 24 gravel miles ending at Mack's Canyon Campground. The south end is paved for three miles, and then will turn to rough gravel for one mile. The byway has a variety of wildlife such as big horn sheep, otter, and osprey, so keep your eyes open and bring your binoculars! This route is great for walking, biking or driving.

### Maupin City Park

Situated on the beautiful Deschutes River we have 25 full RV sites, 23 tent sites, 3 group sites, public showers, EV charging station, picnic area, and free Wifi! We also have a community building available as a separate rental for all your family or group gatherings. ### Maupin Donkey Trail

A special relic of Maupin's history! This gravel trail starts at the west side of the Deschutes Motel and ends at 6th St. The trail features river views and is the only way to walk from upper Maupin to central Maupin and avoid Highway 197.

### Mt. Fir Park & Maupin Skate Park

Mt Fir park is a community park located near the old Mt Fir lumber company site. Playgrounds, ball fields, seating areas, pavilions and an old BNSF caboose with views of Maupin from above! ## Rock Creek Reservoir

Rock Creek Reservoir is on the eastern side of the Mt. Hood National Forest. It is a popular site with families who enjoy the lake for boating and fishing. Wonderful views of Mt. Hood can be found at the day-use area. Nearby forest roads are good for mountain biking.

## Sherars Falls Scenic Bikeway - 33 mile loop

Sherar's Falls Scenic Bikeway forms a topographically diverse loop that encircles the high-desert canyon of the Deschutes, along with some expansive open prairie to the river's west. The 33 mile loop sends you North out of Maupin, down to Tygh Valley, past White River State Park, on to Sherar's Bridge and back to Maupin through the Deschutes River Canyon. This Bikeway is designated for cyclists comfortable with riding in traffic.

## Tygh My Shoes Bike Route - 30 mile loop

This route loops you up and through the White River Wildlife area, into the ghost town of Friend, around the east side of the Badger Creek Wilderness area via a one-lane paved Forest Service road and back down to Tygh Valley on a gravel road with expansive views near the end. For those of you with an adventurous spirit, you will love this ride. You also pass by a local swimming hole, and a waterfall so hidden there's a great chance you will miss it. ## White River Falls State Park

White River Falls plunges 90' over a basalt shelf, testament to the violent geological forces that carved this region millions of years ago. An overlook is a short walk from the parking area. For the more adventurous, take the steep trail deep into the canyon to the historic hydroelectric power plant at the base of the falls, then on to Lower White River Falls. The park is open year-round, though the main parking lot and flush restroom close during winter. The waterfall hits it's peak flow in the spring.
